	<p><u>289/29/49</u></p> <p>Almost adjoining some parts of the concentration camp is Belsen Village. This roll is devoted entirely to it. The contrast between the village and the conditions in the camp is as striking as Life is against Death.</p>	
	<p><u>289/29/50</u></p> <p>The children in the worst part of the camp have been transferred to habitable quarters. At the same time British soldiers are erecting such things as swings for the children. This roll shows the children using them with the aid of British soldiers.</p>	
	<p><u>289/29/51</u></p> <p>As above - follow on roll.</p>	
	<p><u>289/29/52</u></p> <p>The children were delighted to ride on a jeep driven by a British soldier.</p>	
	<p><u>289/29/53</u></p> <p>The problem of feeding all the people of the camp is a great one. However, the British Army elements are doing well to waht must amount to feeding an entire town. This roll shows children feeding at midday - they are from all Europe - all interiors please give full development.</p>	
	<p><u>289/29/54</u></p> <p>After the midday meal the children are issued with sweets and chocolate - English sweets and chocolate that is - probably to some of them this confection was unknown before.</p> <p>SPOOL LOOSE AT END!</p> <p>Interiors - please give full development.</p>	
	<p><u>289/29/55</u></p> <p>The children are called to their meals from play by the ringing of a bell. The ringer is a Russian Jewess and is in charge of these children.</p>
