So great is the danger of Typhus spreading that a very comlicated system of conveying the cases from the unsanitary huts to which they are at the mement. Ambulances are used for transport. Firstly, the dirty patients are brought from the camp to a delousing station, where they are sorubbed and powdered with anti-louse powder, they are then put in a clean ambulance and taken to hospital. Shots were made CU of sign on wagon carrying patient to de-lousing station, insert here was of Miss Russell Smith driver of one of the clean ambulances entering the cab of her vehicle. She is a member of the BRITISH RED CROSS & CIVILIAN RELIEF.

Something like 500 fresh patients are admitted to this place in a day and more are being evacuated over a period of 9 days
