15 00:01:05,870 --> 00:01:09,770 associated with rescue, Solomon Bloom, Samuel Dickstein,

16 00:01:09,770 --> 00:01:14,120 and Emanuel Celler, all headed by Jews, and in addition,

17 00:01:14,120 --> 00:01:18,410 having very close positions to that wonderful inner circle

18 00:01:18,410 --> 00:01:21,080 that Roosevelt kept about himself.

19 00:01:21,080 --> 00:01:24,890 How was it that, with such political weapons,

20 00:01:24,890 --> 00:01:26,930 American Jewry was not appreciably

21 00:01:26,930 --> 00:01:30,290 able to move the Roosevelt administration on the rescue

22 00:01:30,290 --> 00:01:31,460 issue?

23 00:01:31,460 --> 00:01:33,350 It's a fascinating question.

24 00:01:33,350 --> 00:01:36,030 25 00:01:36,030 --> 00:01:40,010 And the question is, whether there is not

26 00:01:40,010 --> 00:01:44,720 a kind of messianic fantasy about even mentioning the idea

27 00:01:44,720 --> 00:01:46,430 that there was such a thing as American

28 00:01:46,430 --> 00:01:50,510 Jewry as an American Jewish community in the 1930s,

29 00:01:50,510 --> 00:01:54,650 a figment of a messianic Jewish imagination.

30 00:01:54,650 --> 00:01:57,620 As a matter of fact, there were many Jewish communities

31 00:01:57,620 --> 00:01:58,980 in the United States.

32 00:01:58,980 --> 00:02:01,110 And when the crisis was upon them,

33 00:02:01,110 --> 00:02:04,310 they literally came apart the delicate bridges

34 00:02:04,310 --> 00:02:08,199 that bound them together simply did not hold.

35 00:02:08,199 --> 00:02:11,030 Today the issues which

seem to divide them

36 00:02:11,030 --> 00:02:14,930 seem unbelievably unreal.

37 00:02:14,930 --> 00:02:17,120 The first one, of course, was how

38 00:02:17,120 --> 00:02:20,270 to approach the Nazi menace, and even if there was

39 00:02:20,270 --> 00:02:22,460 such a thing as a Nazi menace.

40 00:02:22,460 --> 00:02:25,640 And those old uptown factions headed

41 00:02:25,640 --> 00:02:27,590 by the American Jewish committee who

42 00:02:27,590 --> 00:02:30,320 remember the Germany of Beethoven,

43 00:02:30,320 --> 00:02:33,720 the Germany of Schiller, thought that power--

44 00:02:33,720 --> 00:02:34,220 Excuse me.

45 00:02:34,220 --> 00:02:35,870 You mean that these people belonging

46 00:02:35,870 --> 00:02:38,570 to the American Jewish committee were original--

00:02:38,570 --> 00:02:40,370 Originally German.

48 00:02:40,370 --> 00:02:45,170 Although their power and their presence

49 00:02:45,170 --> 00:02:46,760 had been dissipated over the years,

50 00:02:46,760 --> 00:02:49,610 there were not that many German Jews involved anymore.

51 00:02:49,610 --> 00:02:52,910 Many downtown, many Eastern Jews, or the sons and daughters

52 00:02:52,910 --> 00:02:55,950 of the Eastern Jews, were now in positions of power.

53 00:02:55,950 --> 00:02:56,450 Excuse me.

54 00:02:56,450 --> 00:02:58,640 You make a difference between the uptown

55 00:02:58,640 --> 00:03:00,560 Jews and the downtown Jews.

56 00:03:00,560 --> 00:03:03,680 Well, I use that division classification.

57 00:03:03,680 --> 00:03:05,540 It's an old classification that goes back

58 00:03:05,540 --> 00:03:07,040 to the beginning of the century when

59 00:03:07,040 --> 00:03:10,190 the Jews, the original German Jewish migration,

60 00:03:10,190 --> 00:03:12,170 moved to the Westside.

61 00:03:12,170 --> 00:03:14,900 They were then called uptown Jews and they,

62 00:03:14,900 --> 00:03:18,740 it refers to Jews of the reformed persuasion

63 00:03:18,740 --> 00:03:20,720 because American Jewry was not only

64 00:03:20,720 --> 00:03:24,200 divided politically and culturally, but also

65 00:03:24,200 --> 00:03:26,450 religiously.

66 00:03:26,450 --> 00:03:29,570 Who were of German background and far better

67 00:03:29,570 --> 00:03:33,128 established economically than the more recent arrivals,

68 00:03:33,128 --> 00:03:34,670 although the difference was beginning

69 00:03:34,670 --> 00:03:37,050 to shrink by the 1930s. 70 00:03:37,050 --> 00:03:38,750 It was beginning to grow much.

71 00:03:38,750 --> 00:03:42,830 Now these Jews, of course, had traditionally

72 00:03:42,830 --> 00:03:47,120 been disturbed by loud and emotional displays.

73 00:03:47,120 --> 00:03:50,990 As early as 1905, Oscar Strauss is

74 00:03:50,990 --> 00:03:55,710 wondering whether unseemly displays of protest to pressure

75 00:03:55,710 --> 00:03:57,830 the administration really work.

76 00:03:57,830 --> 00:04:00,920 We call it Shtadlanut.

77 00:04:00,920 --> 00:04:04,400 They believed in quiet diplomacy.

78 00:04:04,400 --> 00:04:07,970 They believed that power would ultimately moderate Hitler

79 00:04:07,970 --> 00:04:10,040 and that the crisis was a temporary one.

80 00:04:10,040 --> 00:04:11,630 All one had to do was hang on.

81 00:04:11,630 --> 00:04:14,740 But this was an old traditional Jewish way of--

82

00:04:14,740 --> 00:04:15,870 Yes, the tradition.

83

 $00:04:15,870 \longrightarrow 00:04:17,990$ Pleading with the gentile.

84

00:04:17,990 --> 00:04:19,130 Right.

85 00:04:19,130 --> 00:04:23,900 Now, the issues, as I say, were first on whether there

86

00:04:23,900 --> 00:04:25,700 was a menace.

00:04:25,700 --> 00:04:28,100 And then, of course, on more concrete things

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 $00:04:28,100 \longrightarrow 00:04:33,260$ like the possibility of mounting a boycott against Hitler.

also political.

91 00:04:39,950 --> 00:04:43,850 Many of the uptown Jews were not as entranced

92

00:04:43,850 --> 00:04:48,200 by Roosevelt. As were the sons and daughters of Eastern

00:04:48,200 --> 00:04:51,230 Jews, which had a much more universalistic approach

94 00:04:51,230 --> 00:04:53,450 and had been, since the beginning of the century,

95 00:04:53,450 --> 00:04:58,100 drunk with the idea of democracy and with the welfare state.

96 00:04:58,100 --> 00:04:59,660 The idea that government had a role

97 00:04:59,660 --> 00:05:01,790 to play in helping the poor.

98 00:05:01,790 --> 00:05:04,160 It was a philosophy that their parents believed them

99 00:05:04,160 --> 00:05:06,440 and they, of course, bought it wholesale.

100 00:05:06,440 --> 00:05:08,120 You said, drunk.

101 00:05:08,120 --> 00:05:10,280 Drunk with the idea of democracy.

102 00:05:10,280 --> 00:05:14,930 I say drunk because Jews are the only ethnic community United

103 00:05:14,930 --> 00:05:20,510 States that had intragroup elections.

104 00:05:20,510 --> 00:05:25,250 Two between 1910 and 1920 and one in the 1930s

105 00:05:25,250 --> 00:05:27,860 to see who should rule the community, who should govern

106 00:05:27,860 --> 00:05:29,690 it, as if there was a possibility

107 00:05:29,690 --> 00:05:32,000 in the voluntaristic setting that we had

108 00:05:32,000 --> 00:05:33,560 of governing American juries.

109 00:05:33,560 --> 00:05:36,620 If one could order a Jew to his Jewishness, of course

110 00:05:36,620 --> 00:05:38,090 that was highly impossible.

111 00:05:38,090 --> 00:05:40,610 I say drunk because they really bought the idea

112 00:05:40,610 --> 00:05:42,330 that democracy could work.

113 00:05:42,330 --> 00:05:45,750 So much so that between 1908 in 1921,

114 00:05:45,750 --> 00:05:49,910 the Jews actually formed a kehilla,

115 00:05:49,910 --> 00:05:53,730 reminiscent of the old kehal, to govern themselves. 116 00:05:53,730 --> 00:05:56,330 This was a group that was coming to terms with America

117 00:05:56,330 --> 00:05:59,750 in far different terms than other ethnic groups.

118 00:05:59,750 --> 00:06:04,010 Now the question, of course, was on whether we can assign

119 00:06:04,010 --> 00:06:06,290 such a group responsibility.

120 00:06:06,290 --> 00:06:08,810 As Meir Kahane does, as Elie Wiesel

121 00:06:08,810 --> 00:06:11,990 often does, whether this group actually failed.

122 00:06:11,990 --> 00:06:15,110 And I would suggest to you that a very close look

123 00:06:15,110 --> 00:06:19,820 at the documents indicates that perhaps Nahum Goldman is right.

124 00:06:19,820 --> 00:06:22,850 Perhaps we were not quite ready to accept

125 00:06:22,850 --> 00:06:25,430 the mantle of leadership that had been ensconced

126 00:06:25,430 --> 00:06:26,870 for centuries in Europe. 127 00:06:26,870 --> 00:06:30,170 It came to us so precipitously so suddenly.

00:06:30,170 --> 00:06:32,840 Perhaps our leadership wasn't very intelligent.

129 00:06:32,840 --> 00:06:34,340 Perhaps it lacked stature.

130 00:06:34,340 --> 00:06:37,730 But those who took a conscious betrayal I think

131 00:06:37,730 --> 00:06:43,880 are being unjust, perhaps unintelligent, perhaps

132 00:06:43,880 --> 00:06:47,480 even lack of will, but betrayal never.

133 00:06:47,480 --> 00:06:49,160 As a matter of fact, one could safely

134 00:06:49,160 --> 00:06:56,570 say that virtually every single one of the techniques used

135 00:06:56,570 --> 00:06:59,030 later by the Civil Rights movement

136 00:06:59,030 --> 00:07:01,910 to move the American government in a certain direction

137 00:07:01,910 --> 00:07:05,420 was initially conceived by Jews during the 1930s.

00:07:05,420 --> 00:07:08,810 From theater techniques, from mass protests,

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00:07:08,810 --> 00:07:11,690 the problem was, of course, that the Roosevelt administration

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00:07:11,690 --> 00:07:18,140 was not attuned to a problem central to our own kin

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00:07:18,140 --> 00:07:20,360 and that really brings us to the second question.

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00:07:20,360 --> 00:07:26,630 And that is, are we assigning American Jewry in the 1930s

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00:07:26,630 --> 00:07:31,410 a responsibility for action which their power did not

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00:07:31,410 --> 00:07:31,910 match?

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00:07:31,910 --> 00:07:33,800 Are we tilting with windmills?

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00:07:33,800 --> 00:07:36,530 And the reason why I say that's an important question

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00:07:36,530 --> 00:07:42,080 is because the assumption behind the idea that American

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00:07:42,080 --> 00:07:44,660 Jewry did not do enough is based on one 00:07:44,660 --> 00:07:48,890 of the basic facets of Jewish political culture in Europe.

150 00:07:48,890 --> 00:07:50,930 And that culture is this, that assumption

151 00:07:50,930 --> 00:07:54,380 is this, that there exists in the world

152 00:07:54,380 --> 00:07:59,210 a spirit of civilized goodness that is ready to intercede

153 00:07:59,210 --> 00:08:02,540 for Jews if Jews mobilize it.

154 00:08:02,540 --> 00:08:05,990 And what happened is that we failed to arouse

155 00:08:05,990 --> 00:08:07,890 that spirit of civilization

156 00:08:07,890 --> 00:08:10,207 Now we looked for it in the Oval Office.

157 00:08:10,207 --> 00:08:11,540 One looks for it in the Vatican.

158 00:08:11,540 --> 00:08:13,430 One looks for it in London.

159 00:08:13,430 --> 00:08:17,900 But how Jews came to the notion that between Kishinev

160 00:08:17,900 --> 00:08:20,660 and Auschwitz there was such a spirit that 161 00:08:20,660 --> 00:08:24,940 cared in the world that could be mobilized for them

162 00:08:24,940 --> 00:08:27,530 is a strange phenomenon.

163 00:08:27,530 --> 00:08:29,690 And yet, if one reads that famous--

164 00:08:29,690 --> 00:08:31,520 Kishinev, you mean the pogrom.

165 00:08:31,520 --> 00:08:34,130 The pogram of Kishinev, yes.

166 00:08:34,130 --> 00:08:39,169 If one reads the cable by Louis Marshall

167 00:08:39,169 --> 00:08:43,340 to the pope in 1915 asking him please

168 00:08:43,340 --> 00:08:46,790 to intercede to stop the depredations against Jews

169 00:08:46,790 --> 00:08:50,210 in Poland and receiving no answer or an indifferent

170 00:08:50,210 --> 00:08:50,900 answer.

171 00:08:50,900 --> 00:08:53,990 One could understand that in 1942

172 00:08:53,990 --> 00:08:57,350 when we asked the same thing there would be no answer.

173 00:08:57,350 --> 00:08:59,570 There was no spirit of civilization.

174

00:08:59,570 --> 00:09:04,650

175 00:09:04,650 --> 00:09:06,445 (film slating)

176 00:09:06,445 --> 00:09:11,030

177 00:09:11,030 --> 00:09:12,550 Let me give you an example of what

178 00:09:12,550 --> 00:09:16,960 I mean by that illusion of a civilized spirit.

179 00:09:16,960 --> 00:09:22,600 In 1943, a message was sent to Szmul Zygielbojm in London

180 00:09:22,600 --> 00:09:25,030 that he ought to do everything, including starving himself

181 00:09:25,030 --> 00:09:26,800 to death with other Jewish leaders

182 00:09:26,800 --> 00:09:30,760 to arouse the consciousness of the world.

183 00:09:30,760 --> 00:09:32,260 What a bitter irony. 184 00:09:32,260 --> 00:09:34,780 Zygielbojm had already given up the idea

185 00:09:34,780 --> 00:09:37,330 that there existed such an animal in London,

186 00:09:37,330 --> 00:09:40,060 but the people sitting right on top of Treblinka

187 00:09:40,060 --> 00:09:43,210 are still talking about a conscious of the world.

188 00:09:43,210 --> 00:09:44,660 It was such a difficult thing.

189 00:09:44,660 --> 00:09:46,870 So all pervading to root it out and it

190 00:09:46,870 --> 00:09:49,660 has a long history in Judaism.

191 00:09:49,660 --> 00:09:51,070 From the national minority rights

192 00:09:51,070 --> 00:09:53,070 clauses at the Treaty of Versailles and the idea

193 00:09:53,070 --> 00:09:55,420 that Judaism can be protected even

194 00:09:55,420 --> 00:09:58,360 in Poland by legal clauses.

195 00:09:58,360 --> 00:10:01,450 And that was a very, very hard thing to get away with.

196 00:10:01,450 --> 00:10:03,520 And it is the assumption, on which

197 00:10:03,520 --> 00:10:05,680 the indictment against American Jewry

198 00:10:05,680 --> 00:10:08,140 rests, that there existed such a spirit

199 00:10:08,140 --> 00:10:10,480 in the oval office of Roosevelt, and that we

200 00:10:10,480 --> 00:10:12,550 failed to arouse it.

201 00:10:12,550 --> 00:10:16,480 And I really seriously wonder if we're not misreading the New

202 00:10:16,480 --> 00:10:17,680 Deal history.

203 00:10:17,680 --> 00:10:19,570 Now, let me get to another point then,

204 00:10:19,570 --> 00:10:22,420 on the illusion of centrality, another illusion

205 00:10:22,420 --> 00:10:24,130 in Jewish political culture.

206 00:10:24,130 --> 00:10:27,010 And that illusion is that the Jewish question 207 00:10:27,010 --> 00:10:30,130 and that Jews in general, are more important than they really

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00:10:30,130 --> 00:10:31,570 are.

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00:10:31,570 --> 00:10:35,020 It is an illusion shared by the antisemitic imagination, which

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00:10:35,020 --> 00:10:38,020 imagines that Jews have power behind the scenes,

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00:10:38,020 --> 00:10:40,480 and conspire to rule the world.

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00:10:40,480 --> 00:10:42,700 Now of course, one can answer very simply,

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00:10:42,700 --> 00:10:44,380 that a people who is really powerful

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00:10:44,380 --> 00:10:47,020 does not lose one out of three of its members

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00:10:47,020 --> 00:10:49,120 in a catastrophe like the Holocaust, which

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00:10:49,120 --> 00:10:52,120 is the surest evidence that it is an illusion.

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00:10:52,120 --> 00:10:55,630 But paradoxically enough, Jews, perhaps because

00:10:55,630 --> 00:10:58,570 of their own weakness, would love

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00:10:58,570 --> 00:11:01,870 to believe that because they own The New York Times

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00:11:01,870 --> 00:11:03,070 or they own CBS--

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00:11:03,070 --> 00:11:04,390 which they don't really do--

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00:11:04,390 --> 00:11:06,250 that they really have such power.

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00:11:06,250 --> 00:11:09,550 It was in fact, the reason why the whole question

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00:11:09,550 --> 00:11:12,160 of priorities was so bad.

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00:11:12,160 --> 00:11:14,620 It was a weak and vulnerable people

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00:11:14,620 --> 00:11:16,240 that was destroyed in Auschwitz, not

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00:11:16,240 --> 00:11:18,490 a people who had power anywhere in the world.

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00:11:18,490 --> 00:11:20,860 And the fact is that they were powerless.

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00:11:20,860 --> 00:11:25,270

And we define that powerlessness by saying, the surest

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00:11:25,270 --> 00:11:28,930 meaning in the international arena was a lack of options.

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00:11:28,930 --> 00:11:31,300 An inability to have alternatives

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00:11:31,300 --> 00:11:35,530 about what to do, not only in Europe but in America as well.

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00:11:35,530 --> 00:11:38,680 Yes, you mean that this weakness and this powerlessness

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00:11:38,680 --> 00:11:39,520 existed--

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00:11:39,520 --> 00:11:40,370 In America.

00:11:40,370 --> 00:11:41,537 --amongst American Jews too.

00:11:41,537 --> 00:11:42,250 Precisely.

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00:11:42,250 --> 00:11:46,510 And one could really see it from several points of view.

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00:11:46,510 --> 00:11:50,800 In 1936, when Roosevelt entered his second New Deal,

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00:11:50,800 --> 00:11:56,470 most ethnic groups lessened their loyalty to him.

00:11:56,470 --> 00:11:59,170 The second New Deal was a more radical one, and by that time,

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00:11:59,170 --> 00:12:01,330 some people had had their fill.

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00:12:01,330 --> 00:12:05,770 The Jews, on the other hand, together with Black Americans

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00:12:05,770 --> 00:12:08,740 actually increased their proportion of their vote.

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00:12:08,740 --> 00:12:11,950 By 1940, Jews were giving over 90% of their vote

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00:12:11,950 --> 00:12:13,150 to the New Deal.

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00:12:13,150 --> 00:12:13,780 A new threat--

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00:12:13,780 --> 00:12:14,738 To the second New Deal.

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00:12:14,738 --> 00:12:15,820 To the second New Deal.

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00:12:15,820 --> 00:12:18,700 A new political party had to be created, the American Labor

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00:12:18,700 --> 00:12:21,160 Party, so that Jewish socialists could

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00:12:21,160 --> 00:12:23,560 give their votes to a highborn Episcopalian

00:12:23,560 --> 00:12:26,540 without compromising their principles.

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00:12:26,540 --> 00:12:28,840 It was a fascinating display.

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00:12:28,840 --> 00:12:30,820 Now that really means the following,

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00:12:30,820 --> 00:12:35,170 that so strong was the Jewish love affair with Roosevelt--

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00:12:35,170 --> 00:12:38,380 because of his domestic policy not his foreign policy--

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00:12:38,380 --> 00:12:42,790 that Jewish leaders, like Steven Wise and others,

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00:12:42,790 --> 00:12:49,285 could not threaten Roosevelt with a loss of the Jewish vote

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00:12:49,285 --> 00:12:52,720 if he did not do their bidding on the rescue issue.

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00:12:52,720 --> 00:12:54,830 As a matter of fact, it was quite the reverse.

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00:12:54,830 --> 00:12:58,330 The archives are full of letters from Jewish leaders asking

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00:12:58,330 --> 00:13:02,260 Roosevelt's secretaries to please send a letter confirming

00:13:02,260 --> 00:13:04,420 him or supporting

him for a position

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00:13:04,420 --> 00:13:06,340 in a Jewish organization.

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00:13:06,340 --> 00:13:10,390 So strong was that bind, that tie to Roosevelt,

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00:13:10,390 --> 00:13:13,630 that it could not be removed.

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00:13:13,630 --> 00:13:15,640 And in a sense, Jewish leaders were then

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00:13:15,640 --> 00:13:19,630 dependent on the less certain rewards for loyalty.

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00:13:19,630 --> 00:13:23,482 They had, in other words, a very, very limited

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00:13:23,482 --> 00:13:24,940 political leverage in the New Deal.

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00:13:24,940 --> 00:13:28,570 Not only because the issue was a minor one for the Roosevelt

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00:13:28,570 --> 00:13:32,170 administration, one which had a very low priority,

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00:13:32,170 --> 00:13:35,440 but because the Jews

had in fact perhaps

00:13:35,440 --> 00:13:38,500 a disproportionate amount of political leverage,

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00:13:38,500 --> 00:13:41,560 but not enough to really change major policy.

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00:13:41,560 --> 00:13:46,480 Now one might argue, and I have argued this many times,

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00:13:46,480 --> 00:13:48,790 that in comparison to other American groups,

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00:13:48,790 --> 00:13:52,540 the Jews did very well in the 1930s.

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00:13:52,540 --> 00:13:55,690 For example, of the German Americans in 1916.

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00:13:55,690 --> 00:13:57,640 The German Americans in 1916 were

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00:13:57,640 --> 00:14:01,060 the largest single ethnic group in the United States.

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00:14:01,060 --> 00:14:03,310 They had none of the problems that American Jewry did.

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00:14:03,310 --> 00:14:04,480 They were not fragmented.

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00:14:04,480 --> 00:14:05,920

They were coherent.

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00:14:05,920 --> 00:14:07,270 They had a voice.

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00:14:07,270 --> 00:14:11,440 And they were instrumental in delivering the election of 1916

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00:14:11,440 --> 00:14:13,990 to Wilson who ran on the platform,

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00:14:13,990 --> 00:14:15,850 he kept us out of war.

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00:14:15,850 --> 00:14:18,820 German Americans wanted America out of the war.

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00:14:18,820 --> 00:14:20,620 They did not want America to declare war

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00:14:20,620 --> 00:14:22,360 against the fatherland.

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00:14:22,360 --> 00:14:26,740 But a month after Wilson was inaugurated in March of 1917,

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00:14:26,740 --> 00:14:29,350 he was compelled nevertheless to declare war.

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00:14:29,350 --> 00:14:31,060 What happened to German Americans?

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00:14:31,060 --> 00:14:36,060 Well, sauerkraut became liberty cabbage.

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00:14:36,060 --> 00:14:39,325 Hamburgers became Salisbury steaks.

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00:14:39,325 --> 00:14:40,950

German was dropped from the curriculum.

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00:14:40,950 --> 00:14:43,140 And for a while, it was very uncomfortable to be a German

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00:14:43,140 --> 00:14:44,390 American in the United States.

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00:14:44,390 --> 00:14:46,290

The German Americans

did not succeed

302

00:14:46,290 --> 00:14:49,080

in changing a major American policy.

303

00:14:49,080 --> 00:14:53,130 The Poles did not succeed in

preventing the crime of Crimea.

304

00:14:53,130 --> 00:14:56,730 And the Irish Americans, the

most politically astute group

And yet, they were

not able to do so,

314

but that rapprochement

did take place.

315

Compared to other ethnic

groups, in other words,

316

to other hyphenate

groups, American Jewry

317

did not do it all badly.

318

And that is a far better

comparison than the one

319

that I could think of--

00:15:34,920 --> 00:15:38,940 were they afraid in the 30s of a wave of antisemitism

321

00:15:38,940 --> 00:15:40,530 in the United States?

322

00:15:40,530 --> 00:15:41,400 Ves

323

00:15:41,400 --> 00:15:45,576 Of course, that is another factor

324

00:15:45,576 --> 00:15:49,420 in the question of Jewish political power.

325

00:15:49,420 --> 00:15:53,100 The Depression, with the economic dislocation

326

00:15:53,100 --> 00:15:58,800 that it caused, had released enormously new waves

327

00:15:58,800 --> 00:16:02,790 of antisemitism which perhaps frightened American Jewry more

328

00:16:02,790 --> 00:16:04,140 than it should have.

329

00:16:04,140 --> 00:16:05,970 Our studies of the German American Bund

330

00:16:05,970 --> 00:16:10,530 today indicate that it was not as powerful as we thought.

331

00:16:10,530 --> 00:16:13,050

The German American Bund was a German Jew--

332

00:16:13,050 --> 00:16:15,490 no, not a Jew, a German American.

333

00:16:15,490 --> 00:16:15,990 Right.

334

00:16:15,990 --> 00:16:17,370 The Fritz Kuhn.

335

00:16:17,370 --> 00:16:21,300 Now we have new work on that by Sander Diamond.

336

00:16:21,300 --> 00:16:23,730 And he indicates that the entire membership

337

00:16:23,730 --> 00:16:26,430 of the German American Bund may have been only 9,000,

338

00:16:26,430 --> 00:16:30,090 with perhaps another few thousand hangers on.

339

00:16:30,090 --> 00:16:31,470 We had overestimated it.

340

00:16:31,470 --> 00:16:34,390 Of course, there is always Father Coughlin and others.

341

00:16:34,390 --> 00:16:36,030 The point was that the antisemites

342

00:16:36,030 --> 00:16:39,720 were able to make a great deal of noise by themselves,

00:16:39,720 --> 00:16:42,060 and were able to do something else that we had not

344

00:16:42,060 --> 00:16:43,930 taken into consideration.

345

00:16:43,930 --> 00:16:45,840

They were able to link themselves

346

00:16:45,840 --> 00:16:50,160 to legitimate isolationism, and amplify their political voice

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00:16:50,160 --> 00:16:51,510 in that way.

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00:16:51,510 --> 00:16:55,650 And that link is borne out by Charles Lindbergh,

349

00:16:55,650 --> 00:16:57,900 who was an American folk hero.

350

00:16:57,900 --> 00:17:00,060 Charles Lindbergh, in September 1941,

351

00:17:00,060 --> 00:17:03,840 makes a speech in Des Moines, Iowa in which he warns America

352

00:17:03,840 --> 00:17:08,040 that Jews and anglophiles are plotting

353

00:17:08,040 --> 00:17:10,619 to get America into a war.

354

00:17:10,619 --> 00:17:14,160

It's an antisemitic message amalgamated

355

00:17:14,160 --> 00:17:17,430 with the isolationist message and therefore legitimized.

356

00:17:17,430 --> 00:17:18,750 It was that linkage--

357

00:17:18,750 --> 00:17:19,619 [INAUDIBLE]

358

00:17:19,619 --> 00:17:25,200 --that linkage that really made the antisemitic force very

359

00:17:25,200 --> 00:17:25,920 strong.

360

00:17:25,920 --> 00:17:27,990 And of course, beyond the antisemitism,

361

00:17:27,990 --> 00:17:31,770 there was an entire amalgamation of forces.

362

00:17:31,770 --> 00:17:35,160 One could say, of antisemitism, restrictionism,

363

00:17:35,160 --> 00:17:37,020 that is the refusal to take immigrants

364

00:17:37,020 --> 00:17:38,310 into the United States.

365

00:17:38,310 --> 00:17:41,880 Isolationism existed on a kind of a spectrum.

00:17:41,880 --> 00:17:45,780 While a liberal immigration policy, and early recognition

367

00:17:45,780 --> 00:17:48,900 of the Nazis' threat, and ultimately interventionism

368

00:17:48,900 --> 00:17:50,680 existed on the other side.

369

00:17:50,680 --> 00:17:53,490 And Roosevelt delicately tried to balance,

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00:17:53,490 --> 00:17:58,150 between 1938 and 1940, his steps between one and the other.

371

00:17:58,150 --> 00:18:00,090 In the case of the Jews, he happened

372

00:18:00,090 --> 00:18:07,740 to be, he needed to be much more the fox than the lion.

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00:18:07,740 --> 00:18:09,570 Perhaps the bitterest irony of all

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00:18:09,570 --> 00:18:12,660 is, that in the restrictionism of the New Deal,

375

00:18:12,660 --> 00:18:16,410 in the antirefugee policy, what we find

376

00:18:16,410 --> 00:18:20,040 is that it is a classic example of democracy at work.

 $00:18:20,040 \longrightarrow 00:18:22,170$ There seems to be

very little question

378

00:18:22,170 --> 00:18:26,790 that the consensus in

America, even as late as 1941

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00:18:26,790 --> 00:18:32,160 and perhaps as late as 1944, was that refugees whether they were

380

00:18:32,160 --> 00:18:35,910 children or adults simply had no place in America,

381

00:18:35,910 --> 00:18:38,490 while one third of the nation was ill housed,

382

00:18:38,490 --> 00:18:40,500 ill clothed, and ill fed.

383

 $00:18:40,500 \longrightarrow 00:18:42,570$ And if Roosevelt

ever forgot it, there

384

00:18:42,570 --> 00:18:46,740 was always a Senator Reynolds from North Carolina who

385

00:18:46,740 --> 00:18:50,310 could cite the president's own ringing

386

00:18:50,310 --> 00:18:53,940 phrases to remind him that there was need at home

387

00:18:53,940 --> 00:18:55,650

and who needs refuge.

388

00:18:55,650 --> 00:18:58,260 And the other paradox, of course, is that in 1938,

389

00:18:58,260 --> 00:19:01,530 from all that we know, the American Jewish community

390

00:19:01,530 --> 00:19:03,780 itself was more American than Jewish.

391

00:19:03,780 --> 00:19:07,620 It too was afraid of an influx of Jewish refugees

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00:19:07,620 --> 00:19:08,620 during the Depression.

393

00:19:08,620 --> 00:19:12,420 It shared that with its American compatriots.

394

00:19:12,420 --> 00:19:16,200 To have gone beyond that, according to Samuel Dickstein,

395

00:19:16,200 --> 00:19:20,970 to have proposed that America lift its paper wall,

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00:19:20,970 --> 00:19:25,170 as one authority called it, one historian, David Wyman,

397

00:19:25,170 --> 00:19:29,190 would have probably resulted in a boomerang with much more

398

00:19:29,190 --> 00:19:30,450 restrictive legislation.

399

00:19:30,450 --> 00:19:32,600

Paper wall, what do you mean exactly?

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00:19:32,600 --> 00:19:36,160 The series of bureaucratic and administrative measures

401

00:19:36,160 --> 00:19:39,100 that were implemented by the state department,

402

00:19:39,100 --> 00:19:42,490 especially by Breckinridge Long, usually

403

00:19:42,490 --> 00:19:46,270 through a weakness in the immigration law which

404

00:19:46,270 --> 00:19:49,030 gave the counsel at the scene the last right

405

00:19:49,030 --> 00:19:51,550 to say who would get a visa.

406

00:19:51,550 --> 00:19:54,820 The use of those devices, the use of screening devices,

407

00:19:54,820 --> 00:20:01,660 the use of a security psychosis to stop refugees

408

00:20:01,660 --> 00:20:03,010 from coming here.

409

00:20:03,010 --> 00:20:07,150 By 1940, it was more difficult to get a visa

410

00:20:07,150 --> 00:20:10,480 to enter the United States,

which was not at war then.

411

00:20:10,480 --> 00:20:13,720 Great Britain, which was at war--

412

00:20:13,720 --> 00:20:17,680

413

00:20:17,680 --> 00:20:19,520 [(film slating)

414

00:20:19,520 --> 00:20:21,310 [SLATE CLAPS]

415

00:20:21,310 --> 00:20:26,110 Let me get back to a moment of this question of the refugee

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00:20:26,110 --> 00:20:27,640 visa policy.

417

00:20:27,640 --> 00:20:31,480 I said before that it is a classical case of democracy

418

00:20:31,480 --> 00:20:32,330 at work.

419

00:20:32,330 --> 00:20:38,020 The American people simply did not want more refugees here.

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00:20:38,020 --> 00:20:41,140 And for Roosevelt to have thwarted that will,

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00:20:41,140 --> 00:20:44,290 involved a political risk which he was not willing to take.

422

00:20:44,290 --> 00:20:46,180

And therefore, we developed what I have

423

00:20:46,180 --> 00:20:48,790 called a politics of gestures.

424

00:20:48,790 --> 00:20:53,590 For example, the combination of the Austrian and German quota

425

00:20:53,590 --> 00:20:56,860 in mid1938, after the Anschluss which

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00:20:56,860 --> 00:21:00,400 involved the recognition of the Anschluss, but supposedly

427

00:21:00,400 --> 00:21:03,220 saved the Austrian quota.

428

00:21:03,220 --> 00:21:05,810 It may very well be that the Evian Conference itself--

429

00:21:05,810 --> 00:21:08,020 You will elaborate more on this because--

430

00:21:08,020 --> 00:21:09,280 Well, one of the things that--

431

00:21:09,280 --> 00:21:12,790 They should have add but they didn't do it.

432

00:21:12,790 --> 00:21:13,860 Yes.

433

00:21:13,860 --> 00:21:18,250 The recognition, I think in June of 1938,

434

00:21:18,250 --> 00:21:24,040 the combination of the Austrian and German quotas, in a sense

435

00:21:24,040 --> 00:21:28,960 unofficially extended the recognition to the Anschluss,

436

00:21:28,960 --> 00:21:31,420 to Hitler's annexation of Austria.

437

00:21:31,420 --> 00:21:35,230 But Roosevelt did it supposedly because if he had not,

438

00:21:35,230 --> 00:21:37,730 the Austrian quota would have been lost.

439

00:21:37,730 --> 00:21:41,350 And this was touted in the press as being one of the things

440

00:21:41,350 --> 00:21:44,200 that Roosevelt did to help the Jews and the refugees.

441

00:21:44,200 --> 00:21:46,960 Another thing was the extension of visitors' visas.

442

00:21:46,960 --> 00:21:49,090 Visas of people who were here for six months

443

00:21:49,090 --> 00:21:51,370 were allowed to stay in 1938.

444

00:21:51,370 --> 00:21:53,920 The most classic example of this politics of gestures 445 00:21:53,920 --> 00:21:55,900 may have been the Evian Conference itself.

446 00:21:55,900 --> 00:21:58,830

447 00:21:58,830 --> 00:22:01,170 The reason why that invitation was extended

448 00:22:01,170 --> 00:22:02,560 is still a mystery to us.

449 00:22:02,560 --> 00:22:05,620 We don't really know what got into Roosevelt's mind.

450 00:22:05,620 --> 00:22:07,900 But a careful reading of the invitation

451 00:22:07,900 --> 00:22:10,420 shows how carefully hedged it was.

452 00:22:10,420 --> 00:22:12,700 It states that the American government

453 00:22:12,700 --> 00:22:16,930 has no intention of raising its quota system,

454 00:22:16,930 --> 00:22:19,690 or allowing immigrants to enter outside of it.

455 00:22:19,690 --> 00:22:22,720 And doesn't expect anyone else to do that either.

456

00:22:22,720 --> 00:22:25,300 How such a conference then could have hoped to succeed,

457 00:22:25,300 --> 00:22:26,050 no one knows.

458 00:22:26,050 --> 00:22:29,080 Except perhaps if Roosevelt had the idea

459 00:22:29,080 --> 00:22:31,900 that Latin America would then welcome them in mind.

460 00:22:31,900 --> 00:22:34,450 Of course, Latin America had the same reservations

461 00:22:34,450 --> 00:22:36,662 that the United States did.

462 00:22:36,662 --> 00:22:37,370 On the question--

463 00:22:37,370 --> 00:22:39,970 You mean that this was a policy of make believe?

464 00:22:39,970 --> 00:22:41,260 Of make believe, right.

465 00:22:41,260 --> 00:22:45,820 A policy perhaps designed to assuage and seduce

466 00:22:45,820 --> 00:22:48,250 the Jewish voting public that Roosevelt

467 00:22:48,250 --> 00:22:52,000 was doing something, when Roosevelt in fact 468 00:22:52,000 --> 00:22:53,440 was doing very little.

469 00:22:53,440 --> 00:22:55,540 It wasn't until much later, of course,

470 00:22:55,540 --> 00:22:58,750 that the Jews discovered that he was doing very little.

471 00:22:58,750 --> 00:23:01,930 Now the way that was done, outside

472 00:23:01,930 --> 00:23:05,380 of the politics of justice, was the enormous gap

473 00:23:05,380 --> 00:23:08,020 between what Roosevelt was saying

474
00:23:08,020 --> 00:23:10,600
and what was actually happening on the administrative level.

475 00:23:10,600 --> 00:23:13,448 Where men like Breckinridge Long, and the middle echelon

476 00:23:13,448 --> 00:23:15,865 people at the State Department, who actually had control--

477 00:23:15,865 --> 00:23:19,070 Breckinridge Long had a very powerful position

478 00:23:19,070 --> 00:23:20,515 inside the state department. 479 00:23:20,515 --> 00:23:24,730 He controlled the series, the potpourri of agencies,

480 00:23:24,730 --> 00:23:28,310 that were in fact the rescue program of America.

481 00:23:28,310 --> 00:23:29,800 If we can call it that.

482 00:23:29,800 --> 00:23:32,730 Now on that level--

483 00:23:32,730 --> 00:23:35,540 And the assistant of Long was Robert Borden Reams.

484 00:23:35,540 --> 00:23:36,040 Right.

485 00:23:36,040 --> 00:23:37,210 He was one of the assistants.

486 00:23:37,210 --> 00:23:37,710 Reams.

487 00:23:37,710 --> 00:23:39,490 And of course were many, many others.

488 00:23:39,490 --> 00:23:42,610 They were a whole series of them who--

489 00:23:42,610 --> 00:23:46,323 of course every Jewish mother knew that the State Department

490 00:23:46,323 --> 00:23:48,490 was not something that-the foreign service was not 491 00:23:48,490 --> 00:23:50,680 something that you prepare a Jewish son for.

492 00:23:50,680 --> 00:23:54,010 Dentistry, yes, perhaps even a doctor or a lawyer,

493 00:23:54,010 --> 00:23:55,900 but not a career in the State Department

494 00:23:55,900 --> 00:23:59,020 because the State Department had a subtle anti-Semitism.

495 00:23:59,020 --> 00:24:02,590 William Dodd had actually pointed out that that was

496 00:24:02,590 --> 00:24:06,460 so, and Roosevelt himself did not trust the State Department

497 00:24:06,460 --> 00:24:11,110 and used it very often as a ploy so that researchers today still

498 00:24:11,110 --> 00:24:14,590 must go to the National Archives to examine what the State

499 00:24:14,590 --> 00:24:17,740 Department did, actually repeating the same trip that

500 00:24:17,740 --> 00:24:22,840 Jewish rescue advocates made during the war because we

501 00:24:22,840 --> 00:24:24,910 cannot get to Roosevelt directly.

502 00:24:24,910 --> 00:24:28,630 Now the use of the visa policy was very interesting,

503 00:24:28,630 --> 00:24:30,310 and let me read you a quote.

504 00:24:30,310 --> 00:24:32,020 A statement by Breckenridge Long,

505 00:24:32,020 --> 00:24:36,792 in a memorandum to James Dunn written on June 26 1940--

506 00:24:36,792 --> 00:24:37,750 And who was James Dunn?

507 00:24:37,750 --> 00:24:40,960 --in which-- James Dunn was a fellow official

508 00:24:40,960 --> 00:24:43,480 of the State Department, another undersecretary.

509 00:24:43,480 --> 00:24:46,300 And in which he describes exactly the policy

510 00:24:46,300 --> 00:24:47,890 he intends to follow.

511 00:24:47,890 --> 00:24:50,830 He says, we can delay and effectively

512 00:24:50,830 --> 00:24:54,100 stop for a temporary period of indefinite length 513

00:24:54,100 --> 00:24:56,620 the number of immigrants into the United States.

514

00:24:56,620 --> 00:24:59,980 We could do this by simply advising our consuls

515

00:24:59,980 --> 00:25:02,920 to put every obstacle in the way and resort

516

00:25:02,920 --> 00:25:06,490 to various administrative devices which would postpone,

517

00:25:06,490 --> 00:25:08,800 and postpone, and postpone.

518

00:25:08,800 --> 00:25:11,260 That is precisely what the State Department did,

519

00:25:11,260 --> 00:25:14,410 and it did so by the security gambit,

520

00:25:14,410 --> 00:25:19,040 by using the idea the Germans had infiltrated spies

521

00:25:19,040 --> 00:25:20,900 into the refugee stream.

522

00:25:20,900 --> 00:25:23,240 Although why they would want to be there, no one knows.

523

00:25:23,240 --> 00:25:26,150 It was a very unsafe stream.

524

00:25:26,150 --> 00:25:27,590

But nevertheless, that was done.

525 00:24

00:25:27,590 --> 00:25:30,020 A whole series of articles appeared in the press

526

00:25:30,020 --> 00:25:32,540 about German agents, and Roosevelt himself

527

00:25:32,540 --> 00:25:36,110 in a fireside chat talked about fifth columns

528

00:25:36,110 --> 00:25:40,400 and Trojan horses, giving vent to security psychosis

529

00:25:40,400 --> 00:25:46,430 so that by 1940 the security screening process in the United

530

00:25:46,430 --> 00:25:50,780 States was far more stringent than Great Britain, which

531

00:25:50,780 --> 00:25:52,070 was at war.

532

00:25:52,070 --> 00:25:53,570 That prevented refugees from coming.

533

00:25:53,570 --> 00:25:56,330 And the other thing, of course was the action of the councils.

534

00:25:56,330 --> 00:26:02,912 Now by 1938, Jews, after periods of respite

535

00:26:02,912 --> 00:26:05,120 when they did not believe

what was happening to them,

536 00:26:05,120 --> 00:26:07,940 Jews in Germany finally understood

537 00:26:07,940 --> 00:26:09,620 that they had to get out.

538 00:26:09,620 --> 00:26:11,660 And long and chaotic lines formed

539 00:26:11,660 --> 00:26:14,060 in front of the consulates, and the wonderful--

540 00:26:14,060 --> 00:26:15,290 After the Kristallnact.

541 00:26:15,290 --> 00:26:17,660 After the Kristallnacht, right.

542 00:26:17,660 --> 00:26:21,230 Wonderful stories are told about something

543 00:26:21,230 --> 00:26:24,380 we call gallows humor, humor that is more bitter than funny,

544 00:26:24,380 --> 00:26:27,710 about the Polish Jew, the aus Juda en

545 00:26:27,710 --> 00:26:29,750 Stuttgart who finally gets the message

546 00:26:29,750 --> 00:26:31,890 and wants a visa for America. 00:26:31,890 --> 00:26:34,160 And he comes into the consulate, he's 78 years old,

548 00:26:34,160 --> 00:26:37,550 bent, walking with a cane, opens the glass doors,

549 00:26:37,550 --> 00:26:39,830 makes his way painfully up to the desk

550 00:26:39,830 --> 00:26:42,060 and addresses the American Council.

551 00:26:42,060 --> 00:26:43,910 I'd like a Visa.

552 00:26:43,910 --> 00:26:46,400 And the American Council says, where are you from?

553 00:26:46,400 --> 00:26:47,840 I'm from Poland.

554 00:26:47,840 --> 00:26:52,430 Goes to his desk and looks up the list.

555 00:26:52,430 --> 00:26:53,450 Poland?

556 00:26:53,450 --> 00:26:55,670 Come back in eight years.

557 00:26:55,670 --> 00:26:58,760 Which of course, was in a sense, a death sentence for him.

558 00:26:58,760 --> 00:27:02,390 The Jew accepts the message and makes his way painfully back 559 00:27:02,390 --> 00:27:04,940 to the glass doors in front of the consulate,

560 00:27:04,940 --> 00:27:08,047 and just before he gets to them he gets an idea.

561 00:27:08,047 --> 00:27:10,130 His head straightens up, and he makes his way back

562 00:27:10,130 --> 00:27:12,380 again painfully to the councils desks

563 00:27:12,380 --> 00:27:15,110 and tells him, when I come back in eight years,

564 00:27:15,110 --> 00:27:19,100 should I come back in the morning or in the afternoon?

565 00:27:19,100 --> 00:27:23,750 That was the bitter story of how Jews

566 00:27:23,750 --> 00:27:29,970 were accepted in front of the councils in 1938 and 1939.

567 00:27:29,970 --> 00:27:32,870 Now I want to just momentarily address myself

568 00:27:32,870 --> 00:27:38,210 to the whole question of Jewish power and have things changed.

569 00:27:38,210 --> 00:27:41,120 Of course a weak people loves to believe it's powerful,

570

00:27:41,120 --> 00:27:44,720 the Jews were the ones who created an all powerful God.

571

00:27:44,720 --> 00:27:47,300 It took a weak people to conceive of such a notion.

572

00:27:47,300 --> 00:27:51,500 We would win in heaven what we could never win on Earth.

573

00:27:51,500 --> 00:27:56,790 And the question of have things changed is fascinating.

574

00:27:56,790 --> 00:27:57,290 Today.

575

00:27:57,290 --> 00:27:59,480 Today, and contemporary.

576

00:27:59,480 --> 00:28:05,090 And I think in a sense things do look better

577

00:28:05,090 --> 00:28:08,180 because one of the factors that making

578

00:28:08,180 --> 00:28:12,800 for Jewish weakness in the 1930s has in fact given way,

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00:28:12,800 --> 00:28:17,210 and that is the question of unity.

580

00:28:17,210 --> 00:28:20,670 The Holocaust itself has given Jews a bit of a lesson 581 00:28:20,670 --> 00:28:23,360 in the price of disunity, and that is something

582 00:28:23,360 --> 00:28:26,000 that we have experienced vicariously.

583 00:28:26,000 --> 00:28:29,300 Today only 15 and half percent of American Jewry

584 00:28:29,300 --> 00:28:31,760 is foreign born, we have been processed through America,

585 00:28:31,760 --> 00:28:33,830 through its schools, through its army,

586 00:28:33,830 --> 00:28:36,440 and we are more American than ever before,

587 00:28:36,440 --> 00:28:38,300 perhaps less Jewish as well.

588 00:28:38,300 --> 00:28:41,450 And the, of course, the other factor

589 00:28:41,450 --> 00:28:45,500 is that Israel and Israelism--

590 00:28:45,500 --> 00:28:47,210 and I don't say Zionism--

591 00:28:47,210 --> 00:28:50,990 has finally given Jews who are no longer able to accept fully 00:28:50,990 --> 00:28:55,010 a religious modality, a modern secular,

593 00:28:55,010 --> 00:28:58,370 perhaps a civil religion in which they can believe.

594 00:28:58,370 --> 00:29:00,660 So at least on the issue of Israel,

595 00:29:00,660 --> 00:29:03,680 which all political commentators have noticed,

596 00:29:03,680 --> 00:29:06,630 there is a modicum of unity and less division than ever before.

597 00:29:06,630 --> 00:29:09,560 Of course the price is that there's also

598 00:29:09,560 --> 00:29:12,230 the question of survival, more strongly

599 00:29:12,230 --> 00:29:13,310 today than ever before.

614 00:29:58,670 --> 00:29:59,870 called him old Isaiah. 615 00:29:59,870 --> 00:30:04,730 And of course Stephen Wise, who made a political error

617 00:30:08,990 --> 00:30:11,600 and did not get back into the Roosevelt's good

619 00:30:16,220 --> 00:30:18,230 passed from the scene.

620 00:30:18,230 --> 00:30:20,990 But he has been accused of being obsequious,
