6 00:00:27,620 --> 00:00:29,730 Philanthropy, of the idea of giving.

7 00:00:29,730 --> 00:00:31,940 Now, you know-philanthropy, the idea

8 00:00:31,940 --> 00:00:37,310 that private organizations should finance and fund

9 00:00:37,310 --> 00:00:40,820 the new havens of the refugees, comes up again and again,

10 00:00:40,820 --> 00:00:42,452 as late as the Bermuda Conference.

11 00:00:42,452 --> 00:00:44,660 We find in the instructions of Breckinridge Long that

00:00:44,660 --> 00:00:46,980 he's saying, remember that we cannot pay for this,

13 00:00:46,980 --> 00:00:49,640 it must be paid by private agencies.

14 00:00:49,640 --> 00:00:52,160 Philanthropy has a special meaning for American Jewry,

15 00:00:52,160 --> 00:00:56,090 because it is the way American Jewry very often came to terms

16 00:00:56,090 --> 00:00:57,830 with its Judaism, by giving.

17 00:00:57,830 --> 00:01:01,790 A role, by the way, assigned to them first by the Zionists.

18 00:01:01,790 --> 00:01:05,090 American Jewry was viewed as a great service station,

19 00:01:05,090 --> 00:01:07,730 in which one could fill up with money and hopefully,

20 00:01:07,730 --> 00:01:09,440 with people eventually.

21 00:01:09,440 --> 00:01:13,040 We say that the currency of American Jewish history

22 00:01:13,040 --> 00:01:14,570 is currency.

23 00:01:14,570 --> 00:01:16,620 It's money.

24

00:01:16,620 --> 00:01:20,240 And yet, during the 1930s in the heart of the Depression,

25

00:01:20,240 --> 00:01:23,330 American Jewish philanthropy was badly strapped

26

00:01:23,330 --> 00:01:26,720 and could not really handle the enormous problem

27

00:01:26,720 --> 00:01:28,250 that the refugees posed.

28

00:01:28,250 --> 00:01:31,100 Not only was it not fully organized until 1938

29

00:01:31,100 --> 00:01:34,850 when the United Palestine appeal--

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00:01:34,850 --> 00:01:38,322 New York (film slating)

31

00:01:38,322 --> 00:01:40,280 Well, eventually, what happened was, of course,

32

00:01:40,280 --> 00:01:44,750 that it was soon apparent that Jews were locked

33

00:01:44,750 --> 00:01:48,710 in to an age old tradition of solving problems

34

00:01:48,710 --> 00:01:50,390 by throwing money at it.

00:01:50,390 --> 00:01:55,040 And by 1938, it became apparent that the refugee problem

36 00:01:55,040 --> 00:01:59,330 was so enormous that private funding could not

37 00:01:59,330 --> 00:02:00,660 solve the problem.

38 00:02:00,660 --> 00:02:02,180 So it's an old way--

39 00:02:02,180 --> 00:02:03,650 The old way would not work.

40 00:02:03,650 --> 00:02:08,509 And yet, the Roosevelt administration and others,

41 00:02:08,509 --> 00:02:10,820 even the British Guiana proposal-- for example,

42 00:02:10,820 --> 00:02:16,280 in which Britain had preferred or proposed as a sop

43 00:02:16,280 --> 00:02:17,780 for the white paper--

44 00:02:17,780 --> 00:02:20,460 was to be funded by Jewish money.

45 00:02:20,460 --> 00:02:23,930 Yes, what is interesting is that all the attempts,

46 00:02:23,930 --> 00:02:26,750 all the political attempts of the States,

47 00:02:26,750 --> 00:02:28,730 whether it was American or British,

48 00:02:28,730 --> 00:02:32,480 in order to help the Jews, all of them

49 00:02:32,480 --> 00:02:34,430 said, we will not pay ourselves.

50 00:02:34,430 --> 00:02:35,460 The Jews have to pay--

51 00:02:35,460 --> 00:02:35,960 Precisely.

52 00:02:35,960 --> 00:02:36,460 Right.

53 00:02:36,460 --> 00:02:39,620 --exactly as the Jews are to pay for their own deportation.

54 00:02:39,620 --> 00:02:46,370 It's almost as if one can hear the Roosevelt administration

55 00:02:46,370 --> 00:02:49,580 and the British government resonating the same line that

56 00:02:49,580 --> 00:02:51,080 is coming from Berlin--

57 00:02:51,080 --> 00:02:53,490 the image that Jews have a great deal of money.

58 00:02:53,490 --> 00:02:56,690

And it really comes out when Roosevelt calls Morgenthau

59 00:02:56,690 --> 00:02:58,760 into his office to say, get me a list

60 00:02:58,760 --> 00:03:01,400 of the 1,000 richest Jews in the United States.

61 00:03:01,400 --> 00:03:05,120 I'm going to build a new United States of Africa.

62 00:03:05,120 --> 00:03:07,280 And the Jews will pay for it.

63 00:03:07,280 --> 00:03:10,820 Both sides fell so easily into the idea

64 00:03:10,820 --> 00:03:13,160 that there was, in fact, the great Jewish wealth

65 00:03:13,160 --> 00:03:16,250 that could bail out the Jewish problem.

66 00:03:16,250 --> 00:03:18,482 We could say that it was the same pattern.

67 00:03:18,482 --> 00:03:19,190 The same pattern.

68 00:03:19,190 --> 00:03:20,315 The same pattern that was--

69 00:03:20,315 --> 00:03:24,920 The same imagination, the same images 70 00:03:24,920 --> 00:03:29,100 of a rich, wealthy Jew that can assuage,

71 00:03:29,100 --> 00:03:30,890 that can solve the problem with its money.

72 00:03:30,890 --> 00:03:33,690 And it was the same pattern too I think in another way,

73 00:03:33,690 --> 00:03:36,110 because Hitler said, I don't want the Jews.

74 00:03:36,110 --> 00:03:38,840 But the Allies said, we don't want them, too.

75 00:03:38,840 --> 00:03:40,400 They have to be resettled.

76 00:03:40,400 --> 00:03:41,300 Yes.

77 00:03:41,300 --> 00:03:42,500 Elsewhere.

78 00:03:42,500 --> 00:03:44,120 The resettlement problem is really

79 00:03:44,120 --> 00:03:46,400 a part and parcel of that.

80 00:03:46,400 --> 00:03:48,440 But we come more closely to the idea

81 00:03:48,440 --> 00:03:52,280 of the centrality of money--

82 00:03:52,280 --> 00:03:55,520 you see, one of the fascinating things is that never far

83 00:03:55,520 --> 00:04:00,140 beneath the Nazi cosmology, that of which whose centrality

84 00:04:00,140 --> 00:04:03,530 was the Jewish question, was a well honed commercial instinct,

85 00:04:03,530 --> 00:04:04,370 as well.

86 00:04:04,370 --> 00:04:06,320 The idea of Jewish money.

87 00:04:06,320 --> 00:04:10,310 And that gives the Holocaust a kind of ghoulish symmetry.

88 00:04:10,310 --> 00:04:14,120 Because it begins with an offer to ransom the Jews of Germany

89 00:04:14,120 --> 00:04:17,120 and ends with an offer to ransom the Jews of Hungary.

90 00:04:17,120 --> 00:04:20,600 And throughout, we find private offers

91 00:04:20,600 --> 00:04:25,520 to ransom individual families.

92 00:04:25,520 --> 00:04:30,080 Now, that ransom proposal, the first one was very interesting 00:04:30,080 --> 00:04:32,270 because it posed a problem--

94 00:04:32,270 --> 00:04:36,320 an agonizing problem for the Jews of the world--

95 00:04:36,320 --> 00:04:38,930 which has to this very day not been resolved and leads

96 00:04:38,930 --> 00:04:43,640 to one of the most problematic factors in the whole discussion

97 00:04:43,640 --> 00:04:44,990 of the Holocaust.

98 00:04:44,990 --> 00:04:50,180 In the early months of 1939, much to Roosevelt's chagrin,

99 00:04:50,180 --> 00:04:54,050 George Rublee, who was his old friend from Groton,

100 00:04:54,050 --> 00:04:56,960 succeeded against all predictions

101 00:04:56,960 --> 00:04:59,810 in establishing contact with the Germans, with Schacht.

102 00:04:59,810 --> 00:05:00,620 And out of those--

103 00:05:00,620 --> 00:05:01,870 Schacht was a Finance minister

104 00:05:01,870 --> 00:05:04,040 --Hjalmar Schacht was finance

minister and president

105 00:05:04,040 --> 00:05:07,040 of the Reichsbank, and his assistant, Helmut Wohlthat

106 00:05:07,040 --> 00:05:11,110 It's true that Schacht was then allowed to go by Hitler,

107 00:05:11,110 --> 00:05:12,910 on January 1st, 1939.

108 00:05:12,910 --> 00:05:16,270 And the negotiations were taken up by Goering.

109 00:05:16,270 --> 00:05:19,300 What was the exact nature of the negotiations?

110 00:05:19,300 --> 00:05:24,440 The question of how can German Jewry be gotten out of Germany.

111 00:05:24,440 --> 00:05:27,070 The question of penniless refugees, how much

112 00:05:27,070 --> 00:05:28,780 wealth could be gotten out--

113 00:05:28,780 --> 00:05:30,700 out of those three months of negotiations,

114 00:05:30,700 --> 00:05:32,560 which took place both in Berlin and London,

115 00:05:32,560 --> 00:05:35,510 came the so-called statement of agreement. 116 00:05:35,510 --> 00:05:42,370 A peculiar thing, a non recognized agency, an agent

117 00:05:42,370 --> 00:05:46,060 negotiating with a sovereignty about a group of Germany's

118 00:05:46,060 --> 00:05:48,550 own citizens, its Jewish citizens.

119 00:05:48,550 --> 00:05:50,710 Now, the plan is very complex.

120 00:05:50,710 --> 00:05:52,810 It was based on the Haavara agreement

121 00:05:52,810 --> 00:05:56,620 that was made with the Zionist agency in 1935.

122 00:05:56,620 --> 00:05:59,410 The Jews would act as forced salesmen for German capital

123 00:05:59,410 --> 00:06:01,900 goods, and in that way, would be able to bring out

124 00:06:01,900 --> 00:06:04,780 some of their money in the form of goods.

125 00:06:04,780 --> 00:06:06,430 And of course, the German economy

126 00:06:06,430 --> 00:06:11,440 would profit by the sale of capital machinery. 127 00:06:11,440 --> 00:06:12,850 This was the Haavara.

128 00:06:12,850 --> 00:06:16,000 Yes, and that was, of course, the key to the Schacht

129 00:06:16,000 --> 00:06:17,200 proposal, too.

130 00:06:17,200 --> 00:06:19,810 When Roosevelt heard the Schacht proposal

131 00:06:19,810 --> 00:06:21,760 and heard the mention of Jews, by the way,

132 00:06:21,760 --> 00:06:24,940 he was very chagrined and rather peeved

133 00:06:24,940 --> 00:06:28,450 that his friend, Rublee, had mentioned the unmentionable.

134 00:06:28,450 --> 00:06:30,760 He had mentioned what the Germans always talk about,

135 00:06:30,760 --> 00:06:32,552 and what the Roosevelt administration never

136 00:06:32,552 --> 00:06:33,400 talked about--

137 00:06:33,400 --> 00:06:34,022 Jews.

138 00:06:34,022 --> 00:06:35,230 That he had mentioned that --

139 00:06:35,230 --> 00:06:37,210 He mentioned the word "Jews".

140 00:06:37,210 --> 00:06:40,778 The euphemism "political refugees" had been applied,

141 00:06:40,778 --> 00:06:42,070 and no one ever mentioned Jews.

142 00:06:42,070 --> 00:06:43,945 In fact, one can go through all the documents

143 00:06:43,945 --> 00:06:46,300 and very rarely see the mention of the word Jews.

144 00:06:46,300 --> 00:06:49,090 While the Germans were concealing, well, talking only

145 00:06:49,090 --> 00:06:51,730 about Jews and converting Roosevelt himself

146 00:06:51,730 --> 00:06:54,190 to the Jewish faith, the Roosevelt administration

147 00:06:54,190 --> 00:06:58,420 was reconverting Jews to a bland category called "refugees".

148 00:06:58,420 --> 00:07:01,990 And so one could say that the Jewish question was ground

149 00:07:01,990 --> 00:07:06,310 to dust between a new terminology, which hid 150 00:07:06,310 --> 00:07:09,440 the question from public view.

151 00:07:09,440 --> 00:07:10,810 Even words like extermination--

152 00:07:10,810 --> 00:07:12,820 Even when the-- and of course, that key word

153 00:07:12,820 --> 00:07:15,380 there is, again, that the word "resettlement",

154 00:07:15,380 --> 00:07:19,360 which is used in the West as a solution to the Jewish problem

155 00:07:19,360 --> 00:07:22,240 and is used in Berlin as a solution to the Jewish problem.

156 00:07:22,240 --> 00:07:24,880 In a sense, both really mean the same thing--

157 00:07:24,880 --> 00:07:27,100 tucking away some despised minority

158 00:07:27,100 --> 00:07:29,770 in an equatorial rainforest in the West

159 00:07:29,770 --> 00:07:34,660 and in Germany, of course, for the Nazis, a processed killing

160 00:07:34,660 --> 00:07:37,360 operation and specially designed death camps using 161 00:07:37,360 --> 00:07:41,380 the most interesting managerial and productive techniques

162 00:07:41,380 --> 00:07:44,680 and even merchandising.

163 00:07:44,680 --> 00:07:47,080 But the problem that finally came out,

164 00:07:47,080 --> 00:07:51,760 the release of German Jewry by outside Jews

165 00:07:51,760 --> 00:07:53,170 who would, in a sense, ransom--

166 00:07:53,170 --> 00:07:56,770 and that was a proposition used by Dorothy Parker--

167 00:07:56,770 --> 00:08:01,660 Excuse me, excuse me, we must make these things more clear.

168 00:08:01,660 --> 00:08:05,830 Schacht exactly came with what proposal?

169 00:08:05,830 --> 00:08:07,930 Well, the proposal is complex.

170 00:08:07,930 --> 00:08:09,910 The money of the German Jews would

171 00:08:09,910 --> 00:08:12,550 be put into a trust fund and their property.

172 00:08:12,550 --> 00:08:15,490 And bonds would be based on that, which would then

173

00:08:15,490 --> 00:08:18,700 be bought by outside Jews.

174

00:08:18,700 --> 00:08:22,300 Now, the point is that in the Nazi fantasy,

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00:08:22,300 --> 00:08:25,900 there was an outside Jewry that existed

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00:08:25,900 --> 00:08:28,510 and was organized and had a presence on the money

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00:08:28,510 --> 00:08:31,412 markets of the world that could, in fact, buy out--

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00:08:31,412 --> 00:08:32,370 An international Jewry.

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00:08:32,370 --> 00:08:34,412 An international Jewry, which is, of course, what

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00:08:34,412 --> 00:08:36,580 their fantasy was about Jews.

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00:08:36,580 --> 00:08:39,820 And they would buy out the German Jews

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00:08:39,820 --> 00:08:45,430 by buying these bonds and by buying the capital machinery.

183

00:08:45,430 --> 00:08:49,280 In that way, Germany would solve its exchange problem,

184 00:08:49,280 --> 00:08:50,920 which would go to finance the--

185 00:08:50,920 --> 00:08:53,500 Goering's Four Year Plan to rearm Germany.

186 00:08:53,500 --> 00:08:57,330 And the Jews would have their Jews.

187 00:08:57,330 --> 00:08:59,320 The discussion that took place in London

188 00:08:59,320 --> 00:09:01,570 was bitter and agonizing, because it really

189 00:09:01,570 --> 00:09:06,070 encompassed a question of whether the Jews

190 00:09:06,070 --> 00:09:08,770 and Jewish leadership should cooperate

191 00:09:08,770 --> 00:09:10,270 in the destruction of a particularly

192 00:09:10,270 --> 00:09:12,880 splendid community in Germany.

193 00:09:12,880 --> 00:09:16,480 Should they cooperate in their own destruction?

194 00:09:16,480 --> 00:09:19,040 They did not yet know about the final solution.

00:09:19,040 --> 00:09:22,639 It is a question that comes up more fully after the war.

196 00:09:22,639 --> 00:09:24,063 Yes, the final solution--

197 00:09:24,063 --> 00:09:25,480 In other words, the whole question

198 00:09:25,480 --> 00:09:31,480 of whether the German, whether Jewry really cooperated, really

199 00:09:31,480 --> 00:09:34,390 took place, took part in its own destruction

200 00:09:34,390 --> 00:09:36,670 was really raised as early as 1939,

201 00:09:36,670 --> 00:09:40,070 over the question of ransoming German Jewry.

202 00:09:40,070 --> 00:09:42,840 And we were nonplussed.

203 00:09:42,840 --> 00:09:44,500 Let me read you a quote from--

204 00:09:44,500 --> 00:09:46,720 Where's the Jewish leaders that says

205 00:09:46,720 --> 00:09:50,060 a Jewish American leaders were they aware

206 00:09:50,060 --> 00:09:53,830 of this terrible problem in which--

207

00:09:53,830 --> 00:10:00,310 Yes, I want to read you that quote from Tenenbaum.

208

00:10:00,310 --> 00:10:01,390 Who was he?

209

00:10:01,390 --> 00:10:06,733 Tenenbaum was head of the Boycott Committee, who was very

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00:10:06,733 --> 00:10:07,900 much opposed to the problem.

211

00:10:07,900 --> 00:10:10,720

212

00:10:10,720 --> 00:10:16,300 Just a quote from this book, "in sounding this note, Tenenbaum,

213

00:10:16,300 --> 00:10:18,250 who later became a scholar of the Holocaust,

214

00:10:18,250 --> 00:10:20,600 urged Wise not to support the ransom proposal,

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00:10:20,600 --> 00:10:25,210 lest such "procedures" make the Jewish victims

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00:10:25,210 --> 00:10:27,820 agents of the Nazi government", which was precisely,

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00:10:27,820 --> 00:10:29,560

of course, what the historiography

00:10:29,560 --> 00:10:32,380 of the postwar period is about and this whole question

219

00:10:32,380 --> 00:10:35,480 of sheep to the slaughter, did we cooperate.

220

00:10:35,480 --> 00:10:37,340 And a question comes up even before.

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00:10:37,340 --> 00:10:40,690 In a sense, Jews were almost compelled and forced

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00:10:40,690 --> 00:10:44,290 into this kind of problem, which is a part of the Holocaust

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00:10:44,290 --> 00:10:46,330 which is not fully understood.

00:10:46,330 --> 00:10:49,540 That part of the question of powerlessness

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00:10:49,540 --> 00:10:53,800 is being compelled to do these kinds of things

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00:10:53,800 --> 00:10:56,920 that everything you touch in a sense turns--

227

00:10:56,920 --> 00:11:00,430 One can find the same ransom pattern

228

00:11:00,430 --> 00:11:04,000 all along the exterior of the story was extermination.

00:11:04,000 --> 00:11:09,520 Yes, well, do you cooperate with your own tormentors?

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00:11:09,520 --> 00:11:11,900 Do you pay ransom for kidnapping?

231

00:11:11,900 --> 00:11:13,750 Should we have saved the German Jews?

232

00:11:13,750 --> 00:11:14,350 Right.

233

00:11:14,350 --> 00:11:16,078 This raid was really, really good.

234 00:11:16,078 --> 00:11:22,060

235

00:11:22,060 --> 00:11:25,394 New York. (film slating)

236

00:11:25,394 --> 00:11:26,770 Hmm.

237

00:11:26,770 --> 00:11:33,070 Now, aside from the question of a Jewish leadership being faced

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00:11:33,070 --> 00:11:35,740 with the proposition of having literally to remake

239

00:11:35,740 --> 00:11:38,650 Judaism to fit the Nazi image of it,

240

00:11:38,650 --> 00:11:41,080

in order to rescue the German Jews,

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00:11:41,080 --> 00:11:45,340 there was another question, the escalation of the problem.

242

00:11:45,340 --> 00:11:48,610 Because Jews lived in an anti-Semitic world.

243

00:11:48,610 --> 00:11:52,300 In the wings stood the government of Poland,

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00:11:52,300 --> 00:11:55,540 the government of Romania, and the government of Hungary,

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00:11:55,540 --> 00:11:58,720 carefully watching whether the Germans would get away with it,

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00:11:58,720 --> 00:12:00,580 whether Jews could, in fact, be sold

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00:12:00,580 --> 00:12:04,120 to enrich the coffers, the treasury, of these countries.

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00:12:04,120 --> 00:12:06,620 And that was an important consideration,

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00:12:06,620 --> 00:12:11,620 which made the people negotiating in London

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00:12:11,620 --> 00:12:16,690 decide to follow through with only a token agreement, much

00:12:16,690 --> 00:12:19,000 to the dismay of the German negotiators.

00:12:19,000 --> 00:12:21,370 And, of course, the entire proposition

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00:12:21,370 --> 00:12:24,460 was interrupted by the outbreak of the war.

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00:12:24,460 --> 00:12:27,160 There's one last question that we ought to then address.

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00:12:58,240 --> 00:13:00,550 But they probably judged very carefully

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00:13:00,550 --> 00:13:02,320 and were correct in not--

270

00:13:04,045 --> 00:13:08,670 --in not cooperating with the proposal.

271

00:13:08,670 --> 00:13:13,520 Of course, the question of Évian is an excruciatingly important

We don't know.

00:13:15,763 --> 00:13:18,430 We know that the conference was, in a sense, foredoomed to fail.

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00:13:18,430 --> 00:13:22,750 There was no serious proposal, although, fascinatingly enough,

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00:13:22,750 --> 00:13:25,450 a proposal comes from Trujillo to settle Jews

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00:13:25,450 --> 00:13:26,690 in the Dominican Republic.

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00:13:26,690 --> 00:13:29,710 It's one of the most comical stories of the Holocaust.

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00:13:29,710 --> 00:13:33,910 Because, while the Germans are kicking Jews

00:13:33,910 --> 00:13:37,420 out of Germany and Austria and ultimately Czechoslovakia

281

00:13:37,420 --> 00:13:39,940 because they have bad blood, Jewish blood,

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00:13:39,940 --> 00:13:43,180 a bacillus which will ruin the folk,

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00:13:43,180 --> 00:13:47,590 Trujillo welcomes Jews to the Dominican Republic,

284

00:13:47,590 --> 00:13:50,140 not because he loves
Jews, but because he

00:13:50,140 --> 00:13:52,958 thinks that white blood will improve

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00:13:52,958 --> 00:13:55,000 the racial stock of the Dominican Republic, which

287

00:13:55,000 --> 00:13:56,740 is plagued by blackness.

288

00:13:56,740 --> 00:13:58,480 Even if this white blood is Jewish?

289

00:13:58,480 --> 00:13:59,360 Even if it's Jewish.

290

00:13:59,360 --> 00:14:02,620 So you see, no matter, in a sense, Jews cannot win.

291

00:14:02,620 --> 00:14:06,370

00:14:06,370 --> 00:14:11,380 The question of blood makes the whole thing a circus.

293

00:14:11,380 --> 00:14:13,090 They have the wrong blood for Germany,

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00:14:13,090 --> 00:14:15,160 the right blood for the Dominican Republic,

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00:14:15,160 --> 00:14:17,980 and, of course, Myron Taylor may have been absolutely right.

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00:14:17,980 --> 00:14:23,230

All the Jews really wanted was to live in a world that

00:14:23,230 --> 00:14:25,720 gave them no quota.

298

00:14:25,720 --> 00:14:28,660 They lived the classic paranoiac nightmare.

299

00:14:28,660 --> 00:14:31,000 They lived in a world that wanted to murder them

300

00:14:31,000 --> 00:14:32,440 and gave them no haven.

301

00:14:32,440 --> 00:14:33,610 So that they were little--

302

00:14:33,610 --> 00:14:38,614 Do you think that if, let's say, if at the Evian conference

303

00:14:38,614 --> 00:14:43,750 real openings for rescuing as a German Jewry,

304

00:14:43,750 --> 00:14:47,350 because, at the time, the only question was a German Jewry.

305

00:14:47,350 --> 00:14:48,160 Yes.

306

00:14:48,160 --> 00:14:50,410 Do you think that history could have

307

00:14:50,410 --> 00:14:54,500 changed, that these things could have taken another turn?

00:14:54,500 --> 00:14:56,560 That's an important question.

309

00:14:56,560 --> 00:14:59,350 And of course, we have a great difference about it.

310

00:14:59,350 --> 00:15:03,700 I believe that, had Évian worked.

311

00:15:03,700 --> 00:15:09,220 had the gates been opened, there is even a possibility

312

00:15:09,220 --> 00:15:14,950 of imagining that the whole decision to mass murder

313

00:15:14,950 --> 00:15:16,510 the Jews might not have been taken.

314

00:15:16,510 --> 00:15:18,640 I'm not saying that the Germans killed the Jews

315

00:15:18,640 --> 00:15:19,990 in a fit of absentmindedness.

316

00:15:19,990 --> 00:15:22,600 It was a deliberate and fanatic decision.

317

00:15:22,600 --> 00:15:26,470 But I'm saying that the failure in the initial phase,

318

00:15:26,470 --> 00:15:30,940 in the refugee phase, of the Germans--

00:15:30,940 --> 00:15:31,900 the Germans learned.

320

00:15:31,900 --> 00:15:34,690 We have a passage from Goebbels Diaries in 1940,

321

00:15:34,690 --> 00:15:38,350 in which he actually states that he believes underneath it all

322

00:15:38,350 --> 00:15:40,840 that the Allies are glad that they are finally getting

323

00:15:40,840 --> 00:15:43,090 rid of the Jewish riff-raff.

324

00:15:43,090 --> 00:15:46,360 The signals were to Germany, the silence of the pope,

325

00:15:46,360 --> 00:15:48,520 the inability of Roosevelt to act,

326

00:15:48,520 --> 00:15:50,920 the lack of courage of the International Red Cross,

327

00:15:50,920 --> 00:15:53,920 and all of the witnessing nations and agencies,

328

00:15:53,920 --> 00:15:55,900 that no one really cared.

329

00:15:55,900 --> 00:15:58,390 That they could get away with this under the cloud,

330

00:15:58,390 --> 00:16:00,010 under the cover of war.

00:16:00,010 --> 00:16:02,290 And of course, when that war broke out--

332

00:16:02,290 --> 00:16:07,030 so that the failure in the initial phase

333

00:16:07,030 --> 00:16:09,640 created the momentum, which carried through the killing

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00:16:09,640 --> 00:16:10,870 phase.

335

00:16:10,870 --> 00:16:16,420 I think that some historians agree with me that it was

336

00:16:16,420 --> 00:16:18,760 in this phase that we failed.

337

00:16:18,760 --> 00:16:22,230 In that sense, the indictment against the witnessing nations

338

00:16:22,230 --> 00:16:25,770 is all the more terrible and horrendous.

339

00:16:25,770 --> 00:16:29,190 Because had a haven been offered,

340

00:16:29,190 --> 00:16:32,232 even a resettlement haven, this story

341

00:16:32,232 --> 00:16:33,690 might have been entirely different.

00:16:33,690 --> 00:16:35,970 Although, we don't know that for certain.

343

00:16:35,970 --> 00:16:37,800 But the Évian conference, of course,

344

00:16:37,800 --> 00:16:39,840 did open up the question of resettlement.

345

00:16:39,840 --> 00:16:43,860 And it became for Roosevelt, who was a great geographer,

346

00:16:43,860 --> 00:16:48,900 a wonderful stamp collector, and who fancied himself [INAUDIBLE]

347

00:16:48,900 --> 00:16:50,760 became the solution.

348

00:16:50,760 --> 00:16:55,500 There was something seductive about tucking away

349

00:16:55,500 --> 00:17:01,410 an unpopular pariah minority in some tropical rainforest

350

00:17:01,410 --> 00:17:02,910 where it could bother no one.

351

00:17:02,910 --> 00:17:03,840 The Jews--

352

00:17:03,840 --> 00:17:07,290 Like the migrations [INAUDIBLE] of population, too.

353

00:17:07,290 --> 00:17:09,812

And even suggested in October of 1939,

354

00:17:09,812 --> 00:17:11,520 in the meeting of the executive committee

355

00:17:11,520 --> 00:17:12,937 of the Intergovernmental Committee

356

00:17:12,937 --> 00:17:15,030 on Political Refugees, that they should

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00:17:15,030 --> 00:17:16,560 think in terms of 10 million.

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00:17:16,560 --> 00:17:19,740 This was October, a month after the war had broken out.

359

00:17:19,740 --> 00:17:21,849 And France and England were thinking

360

00:17:21,849 --> 00:17:23,099 of whether they would survive.

361

00:17:23,099 --> 00:17:24,974 He was telling them to think of the refugees.

362

00:17:24,974 --> 00:17:27,210 And of course, they were thinking of no such thing.

363

00:17:27,210 --> 00:17:29,580 Roosevelt imagined that some place

364

00:17:29,580 --> 00:17:36,140 in Africa they could be built a

United States of Africa, which

365 00:17:36,140 --> 00:17:39,930 virtually recapitulated the American experience,

366

00:17:39,930 --> 00:17:45,310 even to the extent of having it under British sovereignty.

367

00:17:45,310 --> 00:17:48,420 He thought in these large terms, visionary,

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00:17:48,420 --> 00:17:50,550 nowhere tied to the facts of the case.

369

00:17:50,550 --> 00:17:54,390 That the Jews were, in fact, an aging population with a good,

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00:17:54,390 --> 00:17:57,480 perhaps as high as 60% of the population over 40.

371

00:17:57,480 --> 00:17:59,700 Certainly not a pioneering population.

372

00:17:59,700 --> 00:18:01,530 And those who could pioneer had already

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00:18:01,530 --> 00:18:04,455 been siphoned off by the Youth Aliyah

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00:18:04,455 --> 00:18:08,790 and by the Zionist movement, so that it was very, very

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00:18:08,790 --> 00:18:12,090

difficult. And he hired and according to some,

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00:18:12,090 --> 00:18:15,690 there may have been as many as 666 different resettlement

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00:18:15,690 --> 00:18:18,240 proposals made during this conflict

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00:18:18,240 --> 00:18:22,380 with Isaiah Bowman, who was introduced to him by his one

379

00:18:22,380 --> 00:18:25,170 close Jewish friend, Henry Morgenthau, the only Jew that

380

00:18:25,170 --> 00:18:27,200 would be accepted by Roosevelt's mother.

381

00:18:27,200 --> 00:18:29,310 He was a geographer, Isaiah Bowman.

382

00:18:29,310 --> 00:18:32,550 He was a geographer from Johns Hopkins University who

383

00:18:32,550 --> 00:18:35,970 had, by the way, almost no confidence at all that

384

00:18:35,970 --> 00:18:38,550 the idea of mass resettlement could work.

385

00:18:38,550 --> 00:18:42,060 But Roosevelt scoured the earth--

386

00:18:42,060 --> 00:18:47,190 Baja California, the Orinoco plateau in Venezuela,

387 00:18:47,190 --> 00:18:50,730 every African Republic, Mindanao.

388 00:18:50,730 --> 00:18:52,800 The British thought of British Guyana.

389 00:18:52,800 --> 00:18:55,590 In a sense, the key word became resettlement,

390 00:18:55,590 --> 00:19:00,210 and that word really requires our closest scrutiny.

391 00:19:00,210 --> 00:19:03,390 Resettlement became the single code word

392 00:19:03,390 --> 00:19:06,100 of the final solution.

393 00:19:06,100 --> 00:19:08,850 Yes, it was the same word used by the [INAUDIBLE]..

394 00:19:08,850 --> 00:19:11,160 And it really meant the same thing,

395 00:19:11,160 --> 00:19:14,910 because one could not resettle a people against its will.

396 00:19:14,910 --> 00:19:18,120 Where mass resettlement did work, as in Israel, 00:19:18,120 --> 00:19:21,420 as perhaps in Birobidzhan, or perhaps in the Crimea after

398 00:19:21,420 --> 00:19:25,470 World War I, or even in the Baron Roths --,

399 00:19:25,470 --> 00:19:27,540 Baron de Hirsch settlements in Argentina.

400 00:19:27,540 --> 00:19:32,010 It had to be in tandem with an idealism, a voluntary work.

401 00:19:32,010 --> 00:19:34,410 Otherwise, it was simply a movement of people,

402 00:19:34,410 --> 00:19:35,640 like so many cattle.

403 00:19:35,640 --> 00:19:37,590 What was done to the Greeks by the Turks,

404 00:19:37,590 --> 00:19:39,720 and the Turks by the Greeks after World War I--

405 00:19:39,720 --> 00:19:43,230 it was in itself a form of cultural genocide.

406 00:19:43,230 --> 00:19:45,930 In other words, resettlement could not have worked.

407 00:19:45,930 --> 00:19:47,460 And yet, one wonders.

408 00:19:47,460 --> 00:19:49,350 And it's one of the great arguments.

409

00:19:49,350 --> 00:19:53,310 Was is it possible in 1943, for example,

410

00:19:53,310 --> 00:19:57,000 was Bergson right to get the Jews out anyway,

411

00:19:57,000 --> 00:19:58,920 it didn't matter?

412

00:19:58,920 --> 00:20:02,655 The Zionists, of course, did not really prefer the resettlement.

413

00:20:02,655 --> 00:20:05,556 (film logistics)

414

00:20:05,556 --> 00:20:09,570 New York (film slating)

415

00:20:09,570 --> 00:20:15,180 Of course, there is no question that Roosevelt's pension

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00:20:15,180 --> 00:20:17,310 and his fantasy about resettlement

417

00:20:17,310 --> 00:20:21,190 posed a special kind of problem for the Zionists.

418

00:20:21,190 --> 00:20:23,010 I think the rough estimate of how much it

419

00:20:23,010 --> 00:20:29,340 costs to resettle each Jew was about 2,400 pounds in Israel.

420 00:20:29,340 --> 00:20:33,660 These Zionists, perhaps in an ideologically heavy way,

421 00:20:33,660 --> 00:20:37,900 could not, of course, abandon Zionism and the idea of Zion.

422 00:20:37,900 --> 00:20:41,340 They could not conceive of an idea of a Zion

423 00:20:41,340 --> 00:20:44,910 without Zionism, or Zionism without Zion.

424 00:20:44,910 --> 00:20:50,220 The 1930s, because of the rescued drama of the pressure,

425 00:20:50,220 --> 00:20:54,510 really generated a whole new group of an ancient enemy

426 00:20:54,510 --> 00:20:58,200 that the Zionists thought they had gotten rid of by 1906,

427 00:20:58,200 --> 00:21:00,970 the so-called Territorialists.

428 00:21:00,970 --> 00:21:03,180 And, of course, the idea of resettlement

429 00:21:03,180 --> 00:21:05,280 was really a territorial idea.

430 00:21:05,280 --> 00:21:08,280 Just meant to resettle the people wherever it could be. 431

00:21:08,280 --> 00:21:09,780 Right, not in Palestine.

432

00:21:09,780 --> 00:21:14,340 And the Zionists were very much afraid of that idea.

433

00:21:14,340 --> 00:21:18,270 When Stephen Wise heard of the idea of making the former

434

00:21:18,270 --> 00:21:22,390 German colony of Tanganyika-today Kenya, I think--

435

00:21:22,390 --> 00:21:26,680 a haven for Jews, he said "no" in 1939.

436

00:21:26,680 --> 00:21:29,505 That he would never want the Jews under German

437

00:21:29,505 --> 00:21:30,130 tutelage again.

438

00:21:30,130 --> 00:21:32,710 Because, of course, in 1939 there was an idea

439

00:21:32,710 --> 00:21:36,190 that the British had of perhaps giving Tanganyika back

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00:21:36,190 --> 00:21:39,580 to Hitler as a sop, as part of the appeasement policy.

441

00:21:39,580 --> 00:21:42,880 By 1941, of course, he was singing a different tune.

442

00:21:42,880 --> 00:21:46,690 He would have accepted something other than Palestine.

443 00:21:46,690 --> 00:21:50,110 But for them, the idea of abandoning it

444

00:21:50,110 --> 00:21:54,790 was very, very, very strange, very difficult to accept.

445 00:21:54,790 --> 00:21:58,750 They fought it in the

only way they knew.

446 00:21:58,750 --> 00:22:02,410 They thought that if the white paper had been pressed

447 00:22:02,410 --> 00:22:05,498 upon the Jewish people by British political fiat, then

448 00:22:05,498 --> 00:22:06,040 it would be--

449 00:22:06,040 --> 00:22:09,450 So the white paper was a--

450 00:22:09,450 --> 00:22:13,270 A British policy in May, 1939, of restricting land sale

451 00:22:13,270 --> 00:22:15,970 and immigration to Palestine taken right

452 00:22:15,970 --> 00:22:17,990 in the teeth of the crisis.

453 00:22:17,990 --> 00:22:21,220 I think it was Ben-Gurion who said, in 1943-- just

454

00:22:21,220 --> 00:22:24,130 to show you the dilemma it put the Zionists in,

455

00:22:24,130 --> 00:22:28,563 that they would fight the white paper as if there was no Nazis.

456

00:22:28,563 --> 00:22:29,230 And they would--

457

00:22:29,230 --> 00:22:35,360

458

00:22:35,360 --> 00:22:40,160 New York (film slating)

459

00:22:40,160 --> 00:22:42,500 The question of resettlement, of course,

460

00:22:42,500 --> 00:22:46,340 did pose an enormous problem for the Zionists.

461

00:22:46,340 --> 00:22:49,340 It meant that resources that would ordinarily

462

00:22:49,340 --> 00:22:52,820 be focused on the issue would have to go

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00:22:52,820 --> 00:22:54,320 to the question of rescue.

464

00:22:54,320 --> 00:22:56,990 The issue means the Jewish community in Palestine.

465

00:22:56,990 --> 00:22:57,950 In Palestine.

466

00:22:57,950 --> 00:23:02,510 Now, for the Zionists, the issue was the surest way

467 00:23:02,510 --> 00:23:04,070 of rescuing Jews.

468 00:23:04,070 --> 00:23:06,780 It seemed the logical answer to the problem,

469 00:23:06,780 --> 00:23:10,790 if only England had not curtailed immigration and land

470 00:23:10,790 --> 00:23:12,410 sales.

471 00:23:12,410 --> 00:23:16,490 And they had to believe, in a sense were compelled to,

472 00:23:16,490 --> 00:23:19,520 that if the white paper was pressed on to them

473 00:23:19,520 --> 00:23:21,890 by a political act, then it had to be undone.

474 00:23:21,890 --> 00:23:24,650 And at that time in '43 we find Ben-Gurion

475 00:23:24,650 --> 00:23:28,010 saying, we will fight the white paper,

476 00:23:28,010 --> 00:23:30,290 as if there was no Nazi Germany.

477 00:23:30,290 --> 00:23:33,830 And Nazi Germany, as if there was no white paper.

478 00:23:33,830 --> 00:23:38,030 That terrible duality-- a terrible problem of what to do.

479 00:23:38,030 --> 00:23:41,840 And yet, resettlement, which gave --

480 00:23:41,840 --> 00:23:46,430 disinterred the whole Territorialist question,

481 00:23:46,430 --> 00:23:50,930 we find Wise saying in November of 23rd,

482 00:23:50,930 --> 00:23:53,450 1938 after Kristallnacht-- we find

483 00:23:53,450 --> 00:23:57,110 him saying about Tanganyika, a former German colony,

484 00:23:57,110 --> 00:24:00,080 "I would rather have my fellow Jews die in Germany

485 00:24:00,080 --> 00:24:03,320 than live somehow, anyhow, in the lands which

486 00:24:03,320 --> 00:24:05,570 bear the imprint of yesterday's occupation

487 00:24:05,570 --> 00:24:08,360 by Germany, in lands

which may tomorrow

488

00:24:08,360 --> 00:24:11,870 be yielded back to Germany."

489

00:24:11,870 --> 00:24:15,050 That was a rather grandiose, and I'm

490

00:24:15,050 --> 00:24:19,880 sure that had Wise heard it in 1943,

491

00:24:19,880 --> 00:24:24,680 he would not have made that statement.

492

00:24:24,680 --> 00:24:26,960 What to do?

493

00:24:26,960 --> 00:24:29,060 It may very well be that the charge

494

00:24:29,060 --> 00:24:30,800 or the indictment of the Zionists,

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00:24:30,800 --> 00:24:32,630 that they were ideologically heavy.

496

00:24:32,630 --> 00:24:35,000 And that in the Biltmore conference

497

00:24:35,000 --> 00:24:37,790 and subsequently in the American Jewish conference,

498

00:24:37,790 --> 00:24:39,815 which was organized in 1943--

499

00:24:39,815 --> 00:24:41,032 They had to do something--

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00:24:41,032 --> 00:24:41,990 In order to something--

501

00:24:41,990 --> 00:24:42,865 To excuse the people.

502

00:24:42,865 --> 00:24:45,530 They had, in fact, already written off the Jews

503

00:24:45,530 --> 00:24:50,600 and were thinking exclusively in terms of a national homeland

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00:24:50,600 --> 00:24:51,440 after the war.

505

00:24:51,440 --> 00:24:52,130 Of the future.

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00:24:52,130 --> 00:24:54,750 Of the future, right.

507

00:24:54,750 --> 00:24:56,900 And that may be so.

508

00:24:56,900 --> 00:25:01,850 And yet, one has to match that with the prognosis,

509

00:25:01,850 --> 00:25:03,950 with the possibilities of whether resettlement

510

00:25:03,950 --> 00:25:05,210

could have worked.

511

00:25:05,210 --> 00:25:08,150

I don't think that the question of the Zionist

512

00:25:08,150 --> 00:25:11,860 stand on mass resettlement really is an important one.

513

00:25:11,860 --> 00:25:13,610 It's a hypothetical question.

514

00:25:13,610 --> 00:25:16,460 The fact is, that there were no mass havens

515

00:25:16,460 --> 00:25:20,240 for Jews being offered, which could have been used.

516

00:25:20,240 --> 00:25:22,820 And that in order for mass rescue to work,

517

00:25:22,820 --> 00:25:27,080 we would have had to have mass resettlement, infiltration

518

00:25:27,080 --> 00:25:29,750 of individual Jews into existing societies,

519

00:25:29,750 --> 00:25:33,110 and a more liberal immigration policy in both Latin

520

00:25:33,110 --> 00:25:35,180 America and the United States.

521

00:25:35,180 --> 00:25:40,280 Now, the issue comes up in 1943 with the so-called Bergson

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00:25:40,280 --> 00:25:43,490

Group, a group of

Israelis in America

523

00:25:43,490 --> 00:25:46,520 representing the right wing, representing revisionists.

524

00:25:46,520 --> 00:25:47,360 Palestine Jews--

525

00:25:47,360 --> 00:25:52,550 Palestinians at that time, right, who do the unthinkable,

526

00:25:52,550 --> 00:25:56,000 as far as the Zionists are concerned, and therefore create

527

00:25:56,000 --> 00:25:57,830 a tremendous conflict.

528

00:25:57,830 --> 00:26:01,790 They separate the homeland issue from the rescue issue

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00:26:01,790 --> 00:26:05,120 and, in fact, give priority to the rescue issue.

530

00:26:05,120 --> 00:26:07,760 For the Zionists, the two were on a continuum.

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00:26:07,760 --> 00:26:11,600 Rescue was possible if Palestine could be opened.

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00:26:11,600 --> 00:26:15,440 The revisionists argue that we cannot open up Palestine

533

00:26:15,440 --> 00:26:16,430 in time.

534

00:26:16,430 --> 00:26:19,490 Therefore, let us get out the Jews by any means.

535

00:26:19,490 --> 00:26:22,880 The Zionists, in a sense, make an error.

536

00:26:22,880 --> 00:26:24,470 Were they too heavy handed, were they

537

00:26:24,470 --> 00:26:27,830 too locked in to their own ideological proclivities,

538

00:26:27,830 --> 00:26:29,150 in this case?

539

00:26:29,150 --> 00:26:32,010 That question will be argued for years to come.

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00:26:32,010 --> 00:26:34,640 But whether or not it could have worked in the end

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00:26:34,640 --> 00:26:36,770 really depends on whether such havens could

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00:26:36,770 --> 00:26:41,600 have been materialized in 1943.

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00:26:41,600 --> 00:26:43,580 The truth is that no matter what decision

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00:26:43,580 --> 00:26:45,170 the Zionists would have taken--

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00:26:45,170 --> 00:26:48,500

It's a question of the heavens, it's a question of the people

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00:26:48,500 --> 00:26:51,150 to put in, as a matter of fact.

547

00:26:51,150 --> 00:26:51,650 Yes.

548

00:26:51,650 --> 00:26:54,862 Could the Jews have pioneered?

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00:26:54,862 --> 00:26:55,820 Could this have worked?

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00:26:55,820 --> 00:26:59,330 Myron Taylor says in 1940, what the Jews really

551

00:26:59,330 --> 00:27:03,260 want is to be given their peace and live peacefully

552

00:27:03,260 --> 00:27:04,370 in settled societies.

553

00:27:04,370 --> 00:27:08,210 They do not really want to pioneer, except in Palestine.

554

00:27:08,210 --> 00:27:10,160 And I think that's a--

555

00:27:10,160 --> 00:27:12,703 They want to settle in societies--

556

00:27:12,703 --> 00:27:13,870 In settled societies, right.

557

00:27:13,870 --> 00:27:15,453

--And they don't

want to be resettled.

558 00:27:15,453 --> 00:27:17,510 It's just completely true.

559

00:27:17,510 --> 00:27:19,850 That's very important.

560

00:27:19,850 --> 00:27:22,190 There's another question that I think

561 00:27:22,190 --> 00:27:26,420 was the key roadblock in the rescue situation.

562 00:27:26,420 --> 00:27:30,050 And that was the question of war aims and war priorities.

563 00:27:30,050 --> 00:27:33,110 If we look back to 1938, the Jews

564 00:27:33,110 --> 00:27:35,690 could not be welcome to the United States,

565 00:27:35,690 --> 00:27:37,490 because of things that we've already

566 00:27:37,490 --> 00:27:41,000 mentioned-- the restrictive legislation, anti-Semitism,

567 00:27:41,000 --> 00:27:44,930 the effects of the Depression, and so forth.

568 00:27:44,930 --> 00:27:49,370 After the war, that rationale changes. 569 00:27:49,370 --> 00:27:52,010 The Jews cannot, now, be rescued,

570 00:27:52,010 --> 00:27:58,160 because the fastest way to rescue Jews is through victory.

571 00:27:58,160 --> 00:27:59,777 When Wise pointed out--

572 00:27:59,777 --> 00:28:01,110 Because the World War broke out.

573 00:28:01,110 --> 00:28:01,490 Yes.

574 00:28:01,490 --> 00:28:03,500 The fastest way to rescue Jews, in other words,

575 00:28:03,500 --> 00:28:04,850 is through victory.

576 00:28:04,850 --> 00:28:07,520 And nothing can be done to interfere with that victory,

577 00:28:07,520 --> 00:28:09,590 including the rescue of the Jews.

578 00:28:09,590 --> 00:28:12,560 Now, when Wise points out that if this is so,

579 00:28:12,560 --> 00:28:16,760 the Jews will all be dead by the end of the war,

580 00:28:16,760 --> 00:28:18,920 there is no answer from Washington.

581 00:28:18,920 --> 00:28:21,830 And yet, to have challenged that idea

582 00:28:21,830 --> 00:28:26,720 that somehow the Jews required a special strategy, a change

583 00:28:26,720 --> 00:28:28,860 in the priorities of the war to make it,

584 00:28:28,860 --> 00:28:35,090 in fact, what Hitler had called it a war to destroy the Jews--

585 00:28:35,090 --> 00:28:38,210 that could not have been done, the changing of the war aims.

586 00:28:38,210 --> 00:28:40,530 Not a single one of the conferences that we have,

587 00:28:40,530 --> 00:28:43,280 which discussed war aims and war strategies from Argentia which

588 00:28:43,280 --> 00:28:46,790 produced the Atlantic Charter, to Tehran, to Yalta,

589 00:28:46,790 --> 00:28:50,300 ever discussed the idea that the rescue of the Jews

591 00:28:51,590 --> 00:28:53,900 As a matter of fact, Stalin and Roosevelt

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00:28:53,900 --> 00:28:58,220 were very careful not to make the war against the Nazis

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00:28:58,220 --> 00:28:59,300 a war to save the Jews.

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00:28:59,300 --> 00:29:02,570 Perhaps they knew instinctively that that would have interfered

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00:29:02,570 --> 00:29:04,940 with the mobilization plans.

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00:29:04,940 --> 00:29:07,700 With the Russians it became the Great Patriotic War,

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00:29:07,700 --> 00:29:10,070 and for the Americans it became the Great Crusade.

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00:29:10,070 --> 00:29:11,720 Nothing about Jews.

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00:29:11,720 --> 00:29:15,080 The interesting thing is that only for the Jews

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00:29:15,080 --> 00:29:17,450 is World War II the war against the Jews.

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00:29:17,450 --> 00:29:21,860 Even today, the textbooks do not give the kind of priority,

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00:29:21,860 --> 00:29:25,190 or follow the same priorities about the Holocaust, that

603 00:29:25,190 --> 00:29:27,770 were actually followed during the war.

604 00:29:27,770 --> 00:29:29,960 And that really brings up the question

605 00:29:29,960 --> 00:29:32,750 to whose history does the Holocaust really belong?

606 00:29:32,750 --> 00:29:36,770 And why didn't Roosevelt and Churchill and Stalin understand

607 00:29:36,770 --> 00:29:39,590 that what was going up in the chimneys of Auschwitz

608 00:29:39,590 --> 00:29:41,090 was a little bit of their own world?

609 00:29:41,090 --> 00:29:43,370 That it was only symbolically Jews,

610 00:29:43,370 --> 00:29:46,520 and that the lack of confidence and the lack of morale

611 00:29:46,520 --> 00:29:50,360 in the Western world today may have

612 00:29:50,360 --> 00:29:53,480 been lost somewhere in Auschwitz after what was happening.

613 00:29:53,480 --> 00:29:58,550 The things that the West produced to enhance life--

614 00:29:58,550 --> 00:30:02,990 production, technology, managerial techniques--

615 00:30:02,990 --> 00:30:07,460 were reversed to produce so many units of death per day.

616 00:30:07,460 --> 00:30:11,300 What else can be said but that Auschwitz is the modern world

617 00:30:11,300 --> 00:30:14,000 and its problems in microcosm?

618 00:30:14,000 --> 00:30:16,610 Are we are we becoming Musselmen in this sense?

619 00:30:16,610 --> 00:30:19,220 Does that tattooed forum really mean

620 00:30:19,220 --> 00:30:22,850 the bureaucratized, standing room only kind of world

621 00:30:22,850 --> 00:30:23,570 that we live in?

622 00:30:23,570 --> 00:30:26,330 Is that happening today?

623 00:30:26,330 --> 00:30:30,170 But leaders don't work on abstract philosophy.

624 00:30:30,170 --> 00:30:33,560 They work on a day to day reality. 625

00:30:33,560 --> 00:30:36,200 Roosevelt worked on the political reality of could he

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00:30:36,200 --> 00:30:37,340 accept the refugees.

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00:30:37,340 --> 00:30:39,380 And the answer was "no".

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00:30:39,380 --> 00:30:41,630 The question was, could they survive?

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00:30:41,630 --> 00:30:44,550 Until Stalingrad in February 1943,

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00:30:44,550 --> 00:30:46,790 which marks the changing of the war,

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00:30:46,790 --> 00:30:49,100 they were worried about their survival.

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00:30:49,100 --> 00:30:53,120 They did not have that kind of a depth to imagine it.

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00:30:53,120 --> 00:30:55,940 And if they came back today, they

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00:30:55,940 --> 00:30:58,580 would not understand why Auschwitz has suddenly

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00:30:58,580 --> 00:31:02,510 become the Auschwitz, not Malmedy,

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00:31:02,510 --> 00:31:05,900 and not the beaches of Normandy, and not the Bataan Death March,

637 00:31:05,900 --> 00:31:08,210 but Auschwitz may, in fact, become

638 00:31:08,210 --> 00:31:10,640 the symbol of World War II.

639 00:31:10,640 --> 00:31:11,330 For who?

640 00:31:11,330 --> 00:31:13,550 Well, right now, perhaps, for the Jews.

641 00:31:13,550 --> 00:31:16,490 But I think ultimately, if we see it as the totalitarian

642 00:31:16,490 --> 00:31:20,030 microcosm that it really was, it may very well be

643 00:31:20,030 --> 00:31:21,680 that more and more people will realize

644 00:31:21,680 --> 00:31:24,860 that what happened in Auschwitz happened to everybody.

645 00:31:24,860 --> 00:31:27,500 That here is a different order of event,

646 00:31:27,500 --> 00:31:29,580 and that our lives can never be the same again.

647 00:31:29,580 --> 00:31:33,523 Now, that may be wishful thinking on my part.

648 00:31:33,523 --> 00:31:34,940 But there is reason to believe it.

649 00:31:34,940 --> 00:31:37,023 Of course, there are other theories about it, too.

650 00:31:37,023 --> 00:31:38,840 It may, in fact, have been an unimportant

651 00:31:38,840 --> 00:31:41,330 event that happened to an unimportant and vulnerable

652 00:31:41,330 --> 00:31:42,680 people.

653 00:31:42,680 --> 00:31:45,240 That's another way of looking at it.

654 00:31:45,240 --> 00:31:47,630 I personally don't think so.

655 00:31:47,630 --> 00:31:51,420 That's why I object to the so-called obscene analogy.

656 00:31:51,420 --> 00:31:53,150 Auschwitz is not Hiroshima.

657 00:31:53,150 --> 00:31:56,990 Although, one could argue that the components were the same--

658 00:31:56,990 --> 00:32:01,280 anonymous dying by fire, the use of technology, a race factor, 659 00:32:01,280 --> 00:32:02,930 also present in Hiroshima.

660 00:32:02,930 --> 00:32:04,770 But Auschwitz is different.

661 00:32:04,770 --> 00:32:07,040 Auschwitz is different, partly because it happened

662 00:32:07,040 --> 00:32:09,110 to a people that were different and were,

663 00:32:09,110 --> 00:32:12,110 in a sense, murdered for the difference.

664 00:32:12,110 --> 00:32:13,460 That's a key point.

665 00:32:13,460 --> 00:32:17,270 So that when we constantly bring up the Armenians and today

666 00:32:17,270 --> 00:32:20,630 the Cambodians, those are all interesting atrocities.

667 00:32:20,630 --> 00:32:23,570 And I do not take away the agony of them.

668 00:32:23,570 --> 00:32:29,270 But Auschwitz is something that has horrendous particularity.

669 00:32:29,270 --> 00:32:35,350 The question of the strategy of victory to save the Jews 00:32:35,350 --> 00:32:37,900 really put men like Stephen Wise in a bind.

671 00:32:37,900 --> 00:32:42,190 Let me read you something that Stephen Wise said

672 00:32:42,190 --> 00:32:45,970 at the introduction speech in the American Jewish Conference

673 00:32:45,970 --> 00:32:50,320 meeting in 1943, to show you how he was bound

674 00:32:50,320 --> 00:32:53,740 by this question of a war aims.

675 00:32:53,740 --> 00:32:55,510 "We are Americans", he says.

676 00:32:55,510 --> 00:32:58,300 "First, last, and all the time.

677 00:32:58,300 --> 00:33:01,150 Everything else that we are and have deepens,

678 00:33:01,150 --> 00:33:05,770 enriches, and strengthens if that can be our Americanism.

679 00:33:05,770 --> 00:33:08,530 As Americans, our first and sternest task

680 00:33:08,530 --> 00:33:11,187 in common with all other citizens of our beloved country

681 00:33:11,187 --> 00:33:13,270 and with all of the citizens of the United Nations

682 00:33:13,270 --> 00:33:15,730 is to win the antifascist war.

683 00:33:15,730 --> 00:33:19,150 Unless the war be won, all else is lost."

684 00:33:19,150 --> 00:33:23,650 Now, what had to happen for Jewish rescue is

685 00:33:23,650 --> 00:33:27,510 that a special case had to be made for Jews.

686 00:33:27,510 --> 00:33:30,670 The Nazi war machine was treating Jews specially.

687 00:33:30,670 --> 00:33:33,430 And to have said, "we want something special",

688 00:33:33,430 --> 00:33:36,670 would have meant to derail that thing.
