Scope and content note: The papers consist of a Certificate of Discharge from Buchenwald concentration camp issued to “Jude” Leopold Grün [donor’s brother], a letter written by William N. Fraleigh, American Vice Consul in Naples, Italy, to Leopold Grün regarding the German quota waiting list, and a letter written by the Grün children to their parents [envelope included with letter].

Inventory

1. Certificate of discharge issued to “Jew” Leopold Gruen permitting him to return to Vienna, 1939 Feb. 17.
2. Letter to Leopold Grün and family informing them that in view of the large number of persons registered before them on the German quota waiting list, their numbers will probably not come up for over a year, 1939 Dec. 22.
3. Letter from Leopold and Frances Gruen to their parents in Germany. Includes birthday wishes for their father, 1942 May 29.
4. Envelope for above letter. Opened and inspected by Italian and German censors. Returned to sender marked, “addressee moved, no forwarding address.”
