**Scope and content note:** The papers consist of a “Kennkarte” issued to Leon Weinstein by the General Government from Warsaw, Poland, in 1942, a card identifying Weinstein as the Chairman of the Committee of Polish Jews from Breslau, Germany, (now Wroclaw, Poland) in 1946; and a card identifying Weinstein as a member of the “Ichud,” the Society of Zionist Democrats, from Breslau in 1947.
