Eve Rich Blumberg Collection Inventory

1. Photograph of Eva Rich before she was sent to the Ghetto, approximately twelve or thirteen years old.
2. Photograph of a soldier, probably Russian, standing in front of a pile of corpses, undated.
3. Likely a Signal Corps photograph of corpses at Dachau concentration camp following liberation. The photograph was given to Eva Rich by soldiers.
4. Telegram received by on the S.S. Marine Flasher, addressed to Eva Wugshire, June 1946. The message reads: "HAPPY MEET YOU AT BOAT- LOVE EDITH."
5. Telegram received on the S.S. Marine Flasher, addressed to Eva Wugshul, June 1946. The message reads: "BOHAGEM L SHOLOM TO OUR BELOVED COUSIN- MR MRS ISRAEL N NISSENBAUM."
6. Copyprint of a photograph of Eva Rich and Nathan Rich shortly after liberation. Eva Rich wore a wig in the picture because her hair had not yet completely grown back. Eva eventually married Nathan Rich.
7. Obituary for Col. Bernard McKahon (Ret.), who had helped liberate Majdanek concentration camp where Eva Rich was imprisoned.
