Biographical/historical note: The Fuchs watch and jewelry store (marked with Jude in images 2 and 3) was located on Museumstrasse 6 in Innsbruck. At the time of the Anschluss, it was owned by Dr. Eduard Fuchs; he lived in the same building with his wife Sara and daughter Wally. Leopold Fuchs, the founder of the business, was Eduard's father and died in December 1928. During Kristallnacht, a group of people broke into the store, badly injured Eduard Fuchs on the face and nose, and destroyed the contents of the home/store. Fuchs and his family fled the city. Eventually, the business was aryanized.

Scope and content note: The collection includes images of Jewish persecution in Germany and Austria before the Holocaust, Nazi propaganda photographs, and images from the Strop report of the Warsaw, Poland, ghetto.

on the window. The photograph was taken by Hans Kogler; the photograph was acquired on the orders of one of the Nazi Gau officials.
