Scope and content note: The collection consists of three photographs of a Nazi Party propaganda parade that took place on August 18, 1935.

1. 1 photoprint: b&w. Photograph of a Nazi Party propaganda parade. The photograph shows SA men standing on a truck. Billboards on the truck read: "The spirit [of World War I] gives me courage; "we want a German State, German Nation;" and "The Jew triumphs with lies and is killed with the truth." Anti-Semitic poster near the front of the truck is barely visible, but concerns "The Eternal Complainer." On the back of the photograph is the official stamp of the SA and the handwritten note, "S.A. Sturm 40/143, Propaganda parade on August 18, 1935."
2. 1 photoprint: b&w. Photograph of a Nazi Party propaganda parade. Shows SA men standing on a truck. Billboards on the truck read: "Who knows a Jew, knows the Devil;" a poster of a man using a swastika to crush stereotypical Jewish faces and snakes; "The bourgeois... the economy is everything;" and "Guard of the [illegible]." On the back of the photograph is the official stamp of the SA and
