**Biographical/Historical note:** Martha Bindeman's father, Nathan Koenig, was a journalist with an agricultural expertise. During World War II, he wrote a column for the *Washington Jewish Review*, the column was largely concerned with Jews in Europe. In 1945 he was appointed the Executive Assistant to the United States Secretary of Agriculture. In that capacity he accompanied a delegation to Poland where he took photographs of concentration camps, the city of Warsaw, Poland, in ruins, and agricultural areas.

**Scope and content note:** The collection consists of nine film negatives of bombed and ruined buildings in Warsaw, Poland, and two film negatives of Majdanek concentration camp.
