Provenance: The Leopold Levy family accumulated the materials during the process of their immigration to the United Kingdom and the United States from ca. 1936 to 1941. Erica Levy donated the collection via the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum Collections Department in September 1991.

Biographical/Historical Note: Erica Levy (b.1931) grew up in Viersen, Germany. In 1938, she moved to Brussels, Belgium, with her sister, Karola, where she attended a convent school. She eventually reunited with her parents in London, England, in May 1940. The entire family immigrated to the United States in September 1940.

Scope and Content: Contains correspondence, photographs, lists, and various other documents relating to the Leopold Levy family in the 1930s and 1940s. Includes letters to the American Consulate General relating to employment for refugees, the immigration of Erica Levy as a child, and personal letters describing the fate of other Levy family members unable to escape Germany before the Holocaust. The materials date from 1936 to 1941.
