- 2. Photograph of Srulek Kilanski (eleven years old) and Shmulek (five years old), sons of Yankel and Blima Kilanski. The Kilanski family disappeared in the 1940s and presumably died during the Holocaust.

The letter states that Isrulek Frydman has written to his aunt and uncle several times without receiving a reply, and would like to hear from them. He inquires about his cousins and other relatives, recalls past memories of spending time with the family when he lived in Lodz. He states he is the eldest son of Berysza Frydman (brother of A. Friedman) and has been on his own for two years. He sends thanks and best wishes on his and his relatives' behalf.
