### **Biographical note**

Rabbi Noah Golinkin (1913-2003) was born in Zhitomir (Ukraine). His father and grandfather were both rabbis. He grew up in Vilnius and immigrated to New York in 1938 and studied at Yeshiva University. He graduated from Clark University and was ordained at Jewish Theological Seminary in New York. During World War II, he participated in activist organizations aimed at raising public awareness about the fate of Jews in Europe.
