Title: Materials relating to the imprisonment of Josif Gerber and the death of Teodor Gerber.

Extent: 1 folder.

Provenance: The donor, Tudor Olaru, obtained the materials in this collection from a variety of sources: the photos and negatives are from a source unknown to the USHMMA, as is the photograph of a prison document, originated by the *Ministerul Afacerilor Interne*. The photocopy of printed pages derives from a book by Matatias Carp. Radu Ioanid of the USHMM staff originally routed the material to the USHMM Collections and Acquisitions Department, which turned it over to USHMM Archives via intramural transfer in Aug. 1991.

Biography: The younger of the two boys in the photographs in the collection is Teodor Gerber. Teodor Gerber was a Jew killed by the Romanian Iron Guard. His corpse was eventually turned over to his parents by the Romanian *Institutul Medico-Legal* on 25 November 1940.

The older of the two boys in the photographs is Josif Gerber, Teodor's brother. On 24 August 1944, Josif was arrested and imprisoned on the grounds of communist connections.

Summary: The collection contains photographs and electrostatic copies related to the death of Teodor Gerber, a Jewish youth who was killed by the Iron Guard in Bucharest in 1940, and his brother Josif, who was imprisoned on the grounds of communist connections.
