Seated are: Gela and Stefania Schanzerow and their children (Henryk Glucksman's aunts and cousins). Inscribed: "Witanowice, 1905 (Mommy is 17 years old, born in 1888)."
- 4. Photograph of Paulina Gluksman seated on a rail, wearing a kerchief and her friend, Henryk Glucksman, wearing a white armband with Star of David on his left arm, Wadowice, Poland, March 1941.
