#### **Rywek Żytnik Photograph Collection Inventory**

1. Photograph of Herszl Żytnik, uncle of Rywek Żytnik, seated his wife and children, Wierzbica, Poland, circa 1935. Rywek Żytnik notes that only the son from this family survived the war.
2. Photograph of five rows of Polish public school children with their teacher, Bukowa Mala, Poland, 1930. Both Polish and Jewish school children attended the school. Ruchl Rózia Żytnik is seen in the second row from the top, fourth from the left. Inscribed in Russian "Rywek Żytnik."
3. Photograph of two women and two children seated on the ground, Sawin, Poland, circa 1936. Ruchl Rózia Żytnik is seated first from left wearing a white dress. Rywek Żytnik's aunt (first from right) and her children are seated in the middle.
4. A group photograph including Wigdor holding his daughter, Ruchl Rózia Żytnik, and Zalman Żytnik, standing in the middle, Dative, Soviet Union, circa 1940. Zalman Żytnik was killed during the first Aktion in December 1941. Wigdor was killed in action in the Red Army. Ruchl Rózia Żytnik survived. Inscribed in Yiddish and Russian.
5. Photograph of Rywek Żytnik's maternal cousin, name unknown, standing on wooden steps wearing a suit, Chelm, Poland, circa 1938. Inscribed in Polish; "Foto-Film "Venus", Chelm, address."
6. Photograph of two men and a woman rowing, Sawin, Poland, August 1, 1931. From left are friends of Rywek Żytnik's brother-in-law, Wigdor: Goldlatminc; Brus and L. Lonenberg, Wigdor. Inscribed in Polish.
7. Photograph of Wigdor (left) and an unidentified friend, Sawin, Poland, August 10, 1935. Inscribed in Polish: "Photographic Studio of A. Stepaniuk in Sawin."
8. Photograph of two women, Rywek Żytnik's paternal cousins, posing on a ladder and a tree branch, Sawin, Poland, circa 1936. Inscribed in Yiddish.
9. Photograph of Zalman Żytnik's employer wearing from a hat and looking from a window, Sawin, Poland, circa 1938. Inscribed in Polish.
10. Photograph of Wigdor (middle) with two unidentified men wearing suits and walking in a street, Sawin, Poland, circa 1937.
11. Photograph of Szmil and his wife, owners of the tailor shop where Wigdor worked, Sawin, Poland, 1936. Inscribed: "I give this picture to my friend, Wigdor, from Szmil."

12. Group photograph of four men, four women, and two children posing on a front porch, Sawin, Poland, circa 1940. Front row, from right: Herszl Żytnik and his wife Adela Żytnik; second row, Rózia Żytnik and her husband Wigdor, and their friends.
13. Group photograph of Wigdor's friends wearing winter coats and hats, posing outside, Sawin, Poland, 1933.
14. Group photograph of Wigdor (left) and his unidentified friends, Sawin, Poland, circa 1936.
15. Photograph of Gitale Żytnik standing outside, holding a ball, Sawin, Poland, 1934.
16. Photograph of Zalman Żytnik with three unidentified men wearing coats and hats, Sawin, Poland, circa 1938. Inscribed in Polish: "Photographic Studio of A. Stepaniuk in Sawin."
17. Photograph of three men, a woman and child standing inside a fenced memorial, Dashev, Soviet Union, circa 1950. Inscribed in Russian: "Initiators of memorial to victims murdered by German bandits, in 1941-1942 in Dashev; M.B.Weksler, M.N. Parchonowski; N.M. Grinberg."
