Below is an inventory of the Hans Robert Levy papers.

- 1 **Notarized Birth Certificate;** stating that Hans Robert Levy was born in Gladbeck on February 2, 1927; son of Salomon Levy, merchant and Helene Weinberg Levy; typewritten note in the left upper corner states that as of January 25, 1939, his middle name will be "Israel"; blue ink round stamp with Nazi eagle; dated: May 4, 1939; location: Gladbeck, Germany; in German
- 2 **Declaration;** handwritten in black ink; statement attesting that Salomon Levy and Helene Levy grant permission to their two sons: Hans Levy and Oskar Levy to emigrate to the United States; dated: March 5, 1941; location: Dortmund, Germany; in German
- 3 **Red Cross letter;** written by Salomon Levy, donor's father, in Dortmund, Germany to Hans and Oskar Levy in Manchester, UK; German Red Cross preprinted form with red ink Red Cross stamp; blue ink handwritten inscription: "Dear boys, we were happy to get news about you via Elsbeth and Hans Tischler. Expect message soon. We are fine. Warm kisses, Mother and Father"; dated: June 18, 1942; location: Dortmund, Germany; in German
- 4 **Red Cross letter;** written by Salomon Levy, donor's father, in Dortmund, Germany to Hans and Oskar Levy in Manchester, UK; German Red Cross preprinted form with red ink Red Cross stamp; blue ink handwritten inscription: "Dear boys, we have no news from you, please write soon. We will travel in a few days. Be healthy and keep up the good mood. Warm kisses, Mommy and Daddy"; dated: July 25, 1942; location: Dortmund, Germany; in German
- 5 **Red Cross letter;** written by Hermann Kleeblatt, donor's uncle, in Amsterdam, Holland to Hans and Oskar Levy in Manchester, UK; Dutch Red Cross preprinted form with red ink Red Cross stamp; black ink handwritten inscription: "How are you? We await news from you. Your parents wrote that they are fine, as is Elsbeth. Uncle Hermann and aunt Lina"; dated: July 24, 1943; location: Amsterdam, Netherlands; in Dutch and German
- 6 **Red Cross letter;** written by Lina Kleeblatt, donor's great aunt, in Amsterdam, Holland to Hans and Oskar Levy in Manchester, UK; Dutch Red Cross preprinted form with red ink Red Cross stamp; typewritten inscription: "Received your message. Your parents' address: Salomon Levy, Theresienstadt, Protectorate, L 206. Greetings from Käthe and Robert [Hans Robert Weinberg]. How are you doing in your endeavors? Regards, Aunt Lina; Elsbeth"; dated: March 4, 1943; location: Amsterdam, Netherlands; in Dutch and German
- 7 **Birth Certificate;** issued to certify that baby Hans Robert Levy was born on February 2, 1927 and that his parents are: Salomon Levy, merchant and Helene Weinberg Levy, both of Jewish religion; preprinted form; black ink inscription; blue ink round stamp of City Hall; dated: February 5, 1927; location: Gladbeck, Germany; in German
- 8 **School Certificate;** issued by West Didsbury Hebrew Classes in Manchester, UK stating that Hans Levy achieved excellent and very good grades in rabbinics; his conduct was good, he is sixth

- in his class and works steadily; preprinted form; graphite inscriptions; dated: March 1941; location: Manchester, UK; in English
- 9 **Photographic print;** black and white image of group of children and their caretakers standing in front of children's home; these German Jewish children arrived on a Kindertransport in January 1939; sixth from left in second row is Oscar Levy, donor's younger brother; seventh from left in the same row is Hans Levy, donor; dated: c.
