Biographical note

Mickey Quittner (1924-2014) was born Miklos Quittner on August 2, 1924 in Budapest, Hungary. He survived the war in hiding in Budapest and Salgotarjan, Hungary and in Filakovo and Jelsava, Czechoslovakia. His wife was born Magda Manyi Cline on May 25, 1924 in Mándok, Hungary. She survived the Kisvárda ghetto and in hiding in Budapest and Szabolcs, Hungary. Their son George was born on July 21, 1947 at the Pocking displaced persons camp in Germany. The family immigrated to the United States in November 1949 to join relatives living in the Bronx. Mickey died in Sarasota in 2014 and Magda in 2015.
