#### **Martha Fruchter Gulyas Papers Inventory**

1. Photographic postcard of Tibor Fruchter (1929-1944). Tibor Fruchter was born in 1929 in Pestújhely, Hungary. He died in 1944 at the Auschwitz concentration camp. Tibor Fruchter is the younger brother of Martha Fruchter Gulyas.
2. Photographic postcard of Evike Gottlieb (Eva, 1937-1944). Evike Gottlieb was born in 1937 in Hungary and died in 1944 at the Auschwitz concentration camp. Evike Gottlieb was the niece of donor's grandfather.
3. Photograph of Gàbor (left), György Gottlieb (middle) and his daughter Evike Gottlieb (right), probably Hungary, 1941. Gàbor is the cousin of the donor's grandfather, who survived the war. György Gottlieb is the brother of the donor's grandfather, who died at Auschwitz concentration camp. Evike Gottlieb (1937-1944) was the niece of donor's grandfather, who died at Auschwitz concentration camp.
4. Photograph of Györgyne Gottlieb, the wife of György Gottlieb, holding her daughter, Evike Gottlieb, 1937.
5. Photograph of Evike Gottlieb (Eva, 1937-1944), Ujpest, Hungary. The pencil markings on the photograph are her own.
6. Photograph of Evike Gottlieb (Eva, 1937-1944), Ujpest, Hungary, 1938.
7. Photograph of Judith Lefkovics with her parents, Eva Fruchter and Jozsef Lefkovics, Miskolc, Hungary. Judith Lefkovics is donor's grandmother's cousin; she died in 1944.
8. Photograph of Helen Korpner (1896-1944) and Ilona Korpner (1898-1944), Miskolc, Hungary, 1916. Helen Korpner is the donor's grandmother's mother, and Ilona Korpner is the donor's grandmother's aunt. Both women died at Auschwitz concentration camp.
9. Photographic postcard of Piroska Korpner in Pestújhely, Hungary. Piroska Korpner is the donor's grandmother's aunt; she died at Auschwitz concentration camp in 1944.
10. Identification card, "Igazolvány" printed in black ink on green paper, issued to "Fruchter Eva Marta" (Martha Fruchter Gulyas, donor's grandmother) issued by the "Magyarországi Zsidok Szervezete" in Budapest, Hungary, issued April 3, 1945. This was the first identification papers Eva Marta received about her liberation. She received these from the Hungarian Jewish services.
