Rosenbaum Family Papers Inventory

1. Postcard, addressed to "Fraulein/Ursula Budnik/Berlin P.O. 36/Adalbertstr. 87/1" from "...Budnik/Theresiensdat.Westgasse 8/10", handwritten in graphite, two postage stamps printed in brown ink both with image of Hitler, "Deutsches Reich" printed above and "30/Bohmen und Mähren/Cechy a Moravia" printed on bottom, adhered in upper right corner; black ink postmark across top and in upper left corner, circular black ink stamp "11b" below postmark in upper left corner. Includes preprinted message in black ink, handwritten entries in graphite, signed "Mutti"; dated September 4, 1944; Terezin, Czechoslovakia; in German.
2. Visa issued to Siegfried Halberstadt from the "Amerikanisches Generalkonsult" in Hamburg, Germany, photocopy of preprinted document with handwritten entries, original dated October 21, 1938, in German.
3. Album, a blue textile cover with small metal clasp, pages edged with gold leaf; blank pages, some with inscriptions handwritten in black ink dating from January 1906-October 1909; one entry by Eva Abraham-Podietz dated "18.9.38" [September 18, 1938]; in German. Eva Abraham-Podietz regarding her entry: "I wrote this in Sept '39, aged 11 in Hamburg. My father and brother were already in England and my mother and I alone in Germany – daily waiting for a visa to join them. By December 1938, no visa and I was sent on the Kindertransport to England. Fortunately my mother joined us before WWII."
