- 13. Letter, official correspondence: pre-printed form letter of Dutch Red Cross, inscribed by "B. Goldstein Amsterdam Zuid...." [Michael's maternal grandfather] to "Erwin Graumann <u>Van Nuys</u>/California" initially stamp-dated December 30, 1943 and subsequently dated February 8, 1944 and September

19, 1945 [rough translation: Long without news from you and the Gutmanns. We hope you are all well. We and also the Weinbaums [Michael's maternal Aunt's family] are all right. Write at once, also about the Farm. Heartfelt regards from parents and the Weinbaums...] in German

Document: hand-inscribed official certificate identifying five children born between 1815 and 1830 to Itzig Moses Graumann and his wife [first name illegible] neé Mattersdorf, dated December 28, 1881, issued by police of Schweidnitz based upon locally kept register of the "Jew-Congregation" Schweidnitz, Germany [present day Poland], in German
- 15. Document: certificate of good conduct identifying pupil Erwin Graumann for purposes of examination accompanying application for voluntary service in Army, dated January 31, 1917, Berlin, Germany, in German
- 16. Document: certificate of good conduct identifying pupil Erwin Graumann for purposes of examination accompanying application for voluntary service in Army, dated June 10, 1918, Berlin, Germany, in German
- 17. Document: certificate of good conduct issued to Erwin Graumann, accompanying application for voluntary service in Army, dated March 10, 1918, Berlin, Germany, in German
- 18. Document: birth certificate issued for Michael Rolf Graumann, born February 9, 1929, dated February 12, 1929, Berlin, Germany, in German
- 19. Document: certificate qualifying Erwin Graumann, after examinations, for one year voluntary service, dated June 24, 1918, Berlin, Germany, in German

Letter, official correspondence: pre-printed form letter of Dutch Red Cross, type-written inscription by "Benno Goldstein" in Amsterdam to "Erwin Graumann" in California, initially stamp-dated October 11, 1945 [rough translation: Received June letter, content gladdens. Here all are well, hope you and the Gutmanns are likewise. Wish for a speedy reunion over there. Our heartfelt greetings to all of you. Parents Weinbaums] in German
- 21. Document: official vaccination certificate issued for Michael Rolf Graumann, dated November 30, 1929, Berlin, Germany, in German
- 22. Document: official vaccination certificate issued for Erwin Graumann, dated May 27, 1901, Berlin, Germany, in German
- 23. Document: birth certificate for Erwin Adolf Graumann, vintage copy re-issued and stamped, verso, with Nazi national insignia and dated July 2, 1938, Berlin, Germany, in German
- 24. Document: marriage certificate, civil, for Julius Graumann and Gertrud Graumann neé Konigsberger, originally issued May 14, 1900, vintage copy re-issued and stamped, verso, with nazi national insignia and dated June 18, 1938, Berlin, Germany, in German
- 25. Document: release certificate issued for Erwin Graumann stating that he was an inmate in concentration camp Buchenwald from November 12, 1938 until November 15, 1938, dated November 16, 1938, Weimar, Germany, in German
- 26. Document: certificate awarding Erwin Graumann the Austrian War Memorial, dated September 10, 1935, Vienna, Austria, in German
- 27. Document: discharge paper issued to Erwin Graumann, artillerist, dated December 1, 1918, in German
- 28. Letter: official correspondence addressed to Erwin Graumann from Finance Chief in Magdeburg stating one thousand RM must remain in Erwin's account after his emigration in order to cover any remaining obligations, thus asking him to renew his application disclosing plans for asset management, dated October 24, 1938, Magdeburg, Germany, in German
