Below is an inventory of the Adam Gicz collection.

1. **Newspaper;** three pages of "Gazeta Lwowska", German newspaper published in Polish in Lvov; on the first page appears an article relating to the Katyn massacre and the documents uncovered in the NKVD offices in Smolensk; dated: June 7, 1943; location: Lvov, Poland; in Polish
2. **Newspaper;** three pages of a Jewish newspaper published in Lower Silesia; an article: "On the fourth anniversary of the liquidation of the Stanisławów ghetto; Hoshana Raba 5702" written by Dr. S. Gunsberg appears on page 7. In his article Dr. Gunsberg described the "aktion" of October 12, 1941 during which the Germans under the command of SS-man Kruger concentrated some 12,000 Jews in the market place of town, confiscated all valuables and publicly humiliated Jewish men by ordering them to uncover their heads and to kneel. The 12,000 Jews were led to the Jewish cemetery, where all were shot into a mass grave. Dated: March 1947; location: Wrocław, Poland; in Polish
- .3 **Birth Certificate;** handwritten certificate stating that Amalia Schwimmer, Adam's mother, daughter of Karp and Chana nee Finkelman Schwimmer was born in Jazłowiec on August 10, 1914 and her birth has been recorded in the Israelite Registration Books; the certificate bears a stamp of the Israelite Registration Office; dated: April 2, 1923; location: Jazłowiec, Poland; in Polish
- .4 **School Diploma;** issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully third grade of public elementary school named after St. Stanisław; on first page appear her grades upon completion of first and second semester; signature of Anna Schwimmer, Amalia's mother, appears on the bottom of grades for the first semester; dated: February 11, 1922 and June 28, 1922; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .5 **School Diploma;** issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully fourth grade of public elementary school named after St. Stanisław; on first page appear her grades upon completion of first and second semester; signature of M. Schwimmer appears on the bottom of grades for the first semester; dated: February 1, 1924 and June 28, 1924; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .6 **School Diploma;** issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully fourth grade of public elementary school named after St. Stanisław; on first page appear her grades upon completion of first and second semester; signature of Anna Schwimmer, Amalia's mother, appears on the bottom of grades for the first semester; dated: January 31, 1925 and June 27, 1925; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .7 **School Diploma;** issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully fifth grade of public elementary school named after St. Stanisław; on first page appear her grades

- upon completion of first and second semester; signature of Anna Schwimmer, Amalia's mother, appears on the bottom of grades for the first semester; dated: January 30, 1926 and June 28, 1926; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .8 **School Diploma**; issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully sixth grade of public elementary school named after St. Stanisław; on first page appear her grades upon completion of first and second semester; signature of Karp Schwimmer, Amalia's father, appears on the bottom of grades for the first semester; dated: January 31, 1927 and June 28, 1927; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .9 **School Diploma**; issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she did not complete the first semester of seventh grade of public elementary school named after St. Stanisław Kostka; she failed in Russian language; dated: January 30, 1928; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .10 **School Diploma**; issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully seventh grade of public elementary school named after St. Stanisław Kostka; dated: June 28, 1928; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .11 **School Diploma**; issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully first grade of Jewish Trade School for Girls (ORT) in sewing department; dated: June 28, 1929; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .12 **School Diploma**; issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully first semester of second grade of private Jewish Trade School for Girls (ORT) in dressmaking department; dated: January 30, 1930; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .13 **School Diploma**; issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully second grade of private Jewish Trade School for Girls (ORT) in dressmaking department; dated: June 28, 1930; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .14 **School Diploma**; issued to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she completed successfully first semester of third grade of private Jewish Trade School for Girls (ORT) in dressmaking department; dated: January 30, 1931; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .15 **Certificate**; stating that Amalia Schwimmer worked in the dressmaking workshop of Mr. Moses Rubin from 1934 till 1937 as ladies dressmaker and her work was satisfactory; signed by Moses Rubin, master dressmaker; red ink oval stamp of the workshop; certified in green ink by head of the dressmaking trade union, Salomon Kinich; blue ink stamp of the union; dated: November 5, 1938; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .16 **Certificate**; issued to Amalia Schwimmer allowing her to shorten her apprenticeship by six months and directing her to the Trade Union to receive a graduating diploma; dated: June 17, 1938; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .17 **Diploma**; issued by the Stanisławów Trade Union to Amalia Schwimmer, stating that she is a certified dressmaker; dated: June 15, 1939; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .18 **Baptismal Certificate**; stating that Michael Ladislaus Gicz, son of Johannes Gicz and Catherina Pabst Holska was born on September 8, 1914 and baptized on September 20, 1914; dated: August 16, 1939; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Latin
- .19 **Diploma**; issued by Examination Committee stating that Michał Gicz, Adam's father, passed the external exam and is eligible to receive a graduating diploma of a trade school with specialization in varnishing; dated: March 15, 1939; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .20 **"Arbeitskarte"**; labor card No. 528 issued by the Stanisławów Judenrat to Amalia Schwimmer, residing on 61 Sapiezynska Street in the ghetto and allowing her to leave the premises to go to work; dated: August, November 15; December 15 and December 31, 1942; location: Stanisławów ghetto, Poland; in German

- .21 **Certificate**; issued to Amalia Schwimmer stating that she is employed in a bakery and that this certificate is issued in order to apply for a passport; dated: January 29, 1945; location: Stanisławów, USSR; in Ukrainian
- .22 **Marriage Certificate**; issued to Michał Gicz and Amalia Schwimmer stating that they got married on January 27, 1945; dated: January 27, 1945; location: Stanisławów, USSR; in Ukrainian and Russian
- .23 **School Diploma**; issued to Michal Wladyslaw Gicz stating that he successfully completed sixth grade and is promoted to seventh grade; dated: June, 28, 1927; location: Stanislawów, Poland; in Polish
- .24 **Trade Card**; stating that Maria Gicz is entitled to work in her profession as a dressmaker without the teaching privileges; dated: December 18, 1945; location: Bytom, Poland; in Polish
- .25 **Trade Identification Card**; No. 1966/3844 issued to Michał Gicz stating that he is licensed to work in varnishing business; dated: April 14, 1939; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .26 **Health Insurance card**; No. 8878202 issued to Michał Gicz; dated: June 7, 1939; location: Stanisławów, Poland; in Polish
- .27 **Identity card**; issued to Michal Gicz, Adam's father; dated; November 20, 1930; location: Stanislawów, Poland; in Polish
- .28 **Receipt**; No. 365/12 for 600 zloty paid at the time of filing for a passport; dated: August 14, 1950; location: Bytom, Poland; in Polish
- .29 **Prescription**; issued by Dr. Woloschanskyj, an ophthalmologist, prescribing glasses for Michal Gicz; dated: June 27, 1943; location: Stanislawów, Poland; in German
- .30 **Certified Translation of Birth and Baptismal Certificates**; of Michał Gicz from Polish into English; location: Salzburg, Austria
- .31 **Certified Translation of Professional Diploma**; of Michał Gicz from Polish into English; location: Salzburg, Austria
- .32 **Membership booklet**; issued by a vocational guild to Amalia Schwimmer; dated: June 15, 1939; location: Stanislawów, Poland; in Polish
- .33 **Photograph**; studio portrait of Natan and Anna Schwimmer; Amalia stands on right; Feluś stands on left and Josef in the middle; dated: c. 1936; location: Stanislawów, Poland
- .34 **Photograph**; studio portrait of Natan and Anna Schwimmer with their youngest son, Feluś; dated: c. 1939; location: Stanislawów, Poland
- .35 **Certified Translation of Birth and Baptismal Certificates**; of Michał Gicz from Polish into English; location: Salzburg, Austria
- .36 **Certificate**; stating that Michał Gicz arrived in Israel as a new immigrant on November 8, 1949 on board SS "Campidilio"; dated: August 23, 1950; location: Tel-Aviv, Israel; in Hebrew
- .37 **Certificate**; stating that Michał Gicz and Maria Schwimmer were married on March 5, 1945 in Stanisławów; issued by the St. Joseph parish in Haifa and signed by the Latin Parish Priest; dated: January 28, 1958; location: Haifa, Israel; in English and Arabic
- .38 **Photograph**; image of the Schwimmer family sitting on a blanket outside, during an outing: from left: Roza Schwimmer; her mother, Anna Schwimmer; Josef Schwimmer; Natan Schwimmer, the father; Feluś and Amalia Schwimmer; dated: c. 1932; location: Stanislawów, Poland
- .39 **Passport**; No. 131428 issued to Amalia Maria Gicz nee Schwimmer and to her son, Saul Felix Johann Gicz; dated; February 17, 1958; location: Haifa, Israel; in Hebrew and French
- .40 **Photographic print**; portrait of Chana Anna Schwimmer, Adam's maternal grandmother and Feliks Schwimmer, Adam's maternal uncle; dated: c. 1932; location: Stanislawów, Poland
