- 1. Photograph of Mr. and Mrs. Weitzenblum walking down a snowy, wet street, Poland, 1936. Inscribed "Zakopane 1936." The Weitzenblums perished in the Holocaust.
- 2. Photograph of infant Andrew Hartman seated outdoors on a chair, Roskoviany, Czechoslovakia, November 24, 1935. Inscribed: Roskoviany/1935 XI. 24." Andrew survived in hiding with Bianca, her husband Fred, Andrew, and Bianca's aunt Nelly Hartman, Nelly's husband Desider, and their child.
- 3. Photograph of five children, Bianca Hartman, her sisters Valery Hartman and Olga Hartman, and their cousins, Magda and Eugene, Roskoviany, Czechoslovakia, circa mid-1930s. Magda perished in the Holocaust. Olga and Valery were deported to Auschwitz concentration camp, where they perished.
- 4. Photograph of a Julius Hartman, undated. Julius Hartman was deported to Auschwitz concentration camp in 1944, where he perished.
- 5. Photographic postcard of Teresia Hartman, undated. Teresia Hartman was deported to Auschwitz concentration camp, where she perished.
- 6. Photographic postcard of the Hartman family, Julius and Teresia Hartman, and their children, Bianca Hartman and Olga Hartman, circa mid-1920s.
- 7. Photograph of Olga Hartman seated outdoors, late 1930s early 1940s.
- 8. Photograph of Anuska Hartman, Bianca Hartman's paternal aunt, undated. Anuska perished in the Holocaust.
- 9. Photograph of Wally Goldman in the Krakow ghetto, Poland, 1941. Wally Goldman perished in the Holocaust.
- 10. Photograph of Julius Hartman holding his son, Andrew Hartman, Roskoviany, Czechoslovakia, November 24, 1935.
- 11. Photograph of four women posing outside, Bianca Hartman's paternal aunts is possibly pictured, Czechoslovakia, March 31, 1935; stamped "Presov."
- 12. Photograph of a group of young men doing agricultural work, performing forced labor, likely Czechoslovakia, August 27, 1939. Yani Gelb, Bianco Hartman's uncle, pictured standing on the left. Inscribed in Czech, "Ivoncice [possibly Ivancice] 27 VIII 1939." Yani Gelb perished in the Holocaust.

- 14. Photograph of Andrew Hartman outside with dogs, after liberation, Presov, Czechoslovakia, October 8, 1945. Inscribed in Czech: "Presove...8 X 1945."
- 15. Postcard written by Klara Herz (Bianca Hartman's distant cousin) to Lenke Hertzka, written while Klara Herz was interned in Auschwitz II Birkenau to relatives in Presov, Slovakia, October 25, 1943; in German.
- 16. Postcard addressed to Klara Herz interned in Auschwitz II Birkenau, from relatives in Presov, Slovakia, and send through "Reichsvereinigung der Juden" [Reich Association of Jews in Berlin].
- 17. Bible, "Die Funf Buecher Moses"; inscribed inside front cover and dated "29.VIII.1947" book published in 1877, Prague; in German and Hebrew. The Bible was given to donor by maternal aunt who kept Bible while in hiding in Budapest, Hungary during the war.
