Included are clippings of her artwork that appeared in the *Frankfurter Zeitung* until she was fired in 1935 for being Jewish; other samples of her artwork including a homemade book of clippings of maps and Friends Worldwide Service pamphlets; family history documents; her diary from 1916-1917; notebooks of hers and her brother Wilhelm (Willy) Schwabacher; family photographs; a post-war photograph album of family life in England; and her son Michael Rossmann's German passport from 1935.

### **Biographical note**

Nelly Rossmann (born Cornelia Bertha Schwabacher, 1899-1957) was born on 14 February 1899 in Frankfurt, Germany to Anna Cahn and Heinrich Schwabacher. Heinrich was a wealthy merchant and rare coin dealer. She had one brother, Wilhelm (Willy, 1897-1972). On 30 January 1930, Nelly married Alexandre Sasha Rossmann. Alexandre came from a wealthy non-Jewish family in Wiesbaden. Some of his family were anti-Semitic and members of the Nazi Party. Their son, Michael was born on 30 July 1930. Nelly and Alexandre divorced in 1933, and Nelly and Michael lived with Nelly's parents in Frankfurt. Nelly worked as a graphic artist for the *Frankfurter Zeitung*. She also became a Quaker.

In 1935 Nelly was fired from the *Frankfurter Zeitung* after a government decree ruled Jews could no longer work in the publishing industry. She then opened a crafts studio to teach Jewish children in the area. In December 1938, due to increased anti-Semitism Nelly sent Michael to a Quaker school in the Netherlands. Nelly's parents immigrated to London in early 1939 and lived with Nelly's maternal aunt, but Nelly was hesitant to leave Germany. Michael returned home from the Netherlands in the summer of 1939, and in July they visited her family in London. Shortly before Michael was to return to school, Germany invaded Poland and they remained in London. Nelly worked as a graphic artist for *Die Zeitung*, a London-based German language newspaper. Michael got a scholarship to a Quaker boarding school in Essex, and remained there for the duration of the war.

Nelly and Michael became British citizens in 1945. Michael received his Ph.D in Chemical Crystallography from the University of Glasgow in 1956 and pursed a career in academia. He married Audrey Pearson, and they immigrated to the United States in by the early 1960s, settling in Lafayette, Indiana.

### Scope and content of collection

The collection primarily documents Nelly Rossmann's career as a graphic artist in Frankfurt, Germany.
