Many of the photographs include typed annotations on the back. Included are depictions of Bergen-Belsen, Buchenwald, Natzweiler-Struthof, Wöbbelin, Flossenburg, and Vught. Also included are depictions of Germany's surrender at Reims, France, and several executions of perpetrators. Other material includes Dutch food ration stamps, clippings, and a 1938 Austrian postcard regarding the German annexation of Austria (Anschluss).
