Includes material related to Rabbi Kronheim's rabbinical work in pre-war Bielefeld, his 1938 immigration and the 1939 immigration of his family, and of his wartime work as a rabbi in Jamestown, NY.

### **Biographical note**

Hans Kronheim was born in Crone an der Brahe on April 5, 1885. He attended the Hochschule für die Wissenschaft des Judentums in Berlin and graduated with a rabbinical degree in 1912. In 1917, he became the rabbi of the Jewish community in Bielefeld, where he co-founded the Sozialer Ausschuss fuer jüdische Wohlfahrtspflege in Westfalen (Social Committee for Jewish Charitable Aid). He was also a board member of the Bielefeld branch of the Vereinigung für das liberale Judentum (Association of Liberal Judaism). In 1938, Hans Kronheim immigrated to the United States, and became a rabbi at the Mayfield Temple in Cleveland, Ohio, where he died on October 15, 1958.
