Biographical note

Evelyn Klein Altman was born on June 12, 1930, near Vienna, Austria, to Maria Hermanda. Her mother later married Miklos (Nicolaus) Klein and she and Evelyn adopted his last name. In 1939, the Klein family acquired entry visas and landing permits for Havana, Cuba, and purchased tickets for the Hamburg-Amerika luxury liner, MS *St. Louis*. The family left Hamburg, Germany, for Havana aboard the ship on May 13, 1939. They reached Havana on May 27. The Klein family was among the 28 passengers, out of 937, who's landing permits for Cuba and visas for the United States were considered valid by the Cuban government. The ship, with the remaining passengers, nearly all Jewish refugees from Nazi controlled countries, was forced to return to Europe. The Klein family disembarked in Havana, where they stayed until 1941 when they left for the United States. Hermanda died in 1988. Evelyn married Don Altman and had three children. She died in Denver, Colorado, age 71, on July 5, 2001.
