Abstract: The John M. Steiner collection comprises biographical material, research, writings, correspondence, photographs, notes, and printed and audiovisual material documenting John M. Steiner, his survival of the Holocaust, postwar migration, academic career, research interests in sociology, the Holocaust, and the SS, and publications. The collection is particularly strong in correspondence, writings, and files documenting Steiner's research into the sociology of the Holocaust, the social psychology of perpetrators and authoritarian personality traits, and his research interactions with former Nazis and SS members.

Biographical materials document Steiner's postwar migration to Australia and the United States, education, academic career, and restitution claims. Schutzstaffel (SS) materials documenting Steiner's sociological research on SS members. Writings comprise published articles, stories, essays, drafts, speeches, and notes authored or co-authored by Steiner. Sonoma State University materials document Steiner's professional career there. Correspondence primarily relates to Steiner's research and teaching but includes some personal messages. Subject files assemble various topics of interest to Steiner and include sections on Otto Strasser, Herbert Taeye, and Philip Zimbardo. Photographs depict Steiner and professional events in his life but also include reproductions of Holocaust-era images. The collection includes many of Steiner's original notes for his research and writings. Printed material covers subjects such as the Holocaust, the SS, sociology, and Czechoslovakia. Audiovisual material has not yet been evaluated but appears to document conversations and events related to Steiner's sociological research and interests in the Holocaust and the SS.

### **Biographical note**

John Michael Steiner (1925-2014) was born August 3, 1925 in Prague, Czechoslovakia, the son of Kurt and Ilse Steiner. Raised as a Christian, Steiner and his family nevertheless were identified as being Jewish by the Nazis during the German occupation of Bohemia and Moravia. In August 1942, Steiner was arrested and sent to a series of concentration camps, beginning with Theresienstadt, and including Auschwitz-Birkenau (1943), Blechhammer (early 1944), Reichenbach (early 1945), and ending with Dachau (February 1945), from which he was liberated in April 1945. His father also survived the Holocaust, but his mother and her relatives perished. Steiner returned to Prague to begin his studies at Charles University in 1946. After the Communist seizure of power, he fled Czechoslovakia in 1949 for Australia, where he earned a bachelor's degree in German language and psychology at Melbourne University in 1952. He then moved to the United States, where he earned a master's degree in German language and sociology at the University of Missouri in 1955, then continuing his studies at the University of California, while teaching as adjunct faculty and working as a social worker at the San Quentin State Prison.

In 1962, he moved to Germany to pursue his doctorate at the University of Freiburg, examining social structures of the National Socialist regime and its concentration camps. During this period, he began the work for which he became best known: conducting surveys among former concentration camp guards and members of the S.S. Between 1962 and 1966, with the help of a former general in the Waffen-SS, Felix Steiner, and former SS-Obergruppenführer Karl Wolff, who were supportive of his research, he distributed several hundred questionnaires to former Nazis, and attended some of their meetings in order to make further contacts and do research. Few of those he met realized that he was a Holocaust survivor who had spent several years in concentration camps. His work was also encouraged by those who were involved in the prosecution of former Nazis, such as Fritz Bauer and Heinz Meyer-Velde, of the ministry of justice in the West German state of Hessen, as well as criminologist Armand Mergen. While at Freiburg, Steiner also worked at the Arnold Bergstraesser Institute, doing work in nearby prisons in order to implement group counseling as a means of rehabilitating prisoners. He completed his doctoral dissertation, under the supervision of sociologist Eduard Baumgarten, titled "Power Politics and Social Change in National Socialist Germany." He returned to California, where he was appointed as a sociologist to the faculty of Sonoma State University, where he remained until being named professor emeritus in 1997.

During his tenure at Sonoma State, he conducted research in a number of areas related to criminology, including conducting studies of theft and shoplifting, and working with Stanford professor Philip Zimbardo on the latter's well-known "Stanford Prison Experiment." He also remained engaged with the subject of the authoritarian personality and other topics related to the sociology of Nazi perpetrators. He collaborated with scholars such as Joel Dimsdale, Jochen Fahrenberg, and Jobst Freiherr von Cornberg, among others. In relation to this work, he continued to correspond and meet with a number of former Nazis and members of the S.S., and to collect testimonies and source documentation from them. Steiner also founded the Holocaust Studies Center at Sonoma State University, and was a prominent as a Holocaust survivor and speaker in Northern California during his later years. He was

awarded the *Bundesverdienstkreuz* (Order of Merit) by the German government in 2004. John Steiner died in Novato, California on May 6, 2014.

### **Scope and content of collection**

The John M. Steiner collection comprises biographical material, research, writings, correspondence, photographs, notes, and printed and audiovisual material documenting John M. Steiner, his survival of the Holocaust, postwar migration, academic career, research interests in sociology, the Holocaust, and the SS, and publications. The collection is particularly strong in correspondence, writings, and files documenting Steiner's research into the sociology of the Holocaust, the social psychology of perpetrators and authoritarian personality traits, and his research interactions with former Nazis and SS members.

Series 1, Biographical materials, includes general records, Australia records, academic records, printed materials, student papers, and restitution files documenting John Steiner's life following the Holocaust. General records include biographical notes, financial records, an oral history transcript, and other materials documenting Steiner's life. Australia records include correspondence, forms, programs, and printed material documenting Steiner's years in Australia after the Holocaust and before his immigration to the United States. This subseries also includes four Australian Customs and Deportation files of unknown provenance. Academic records include resumes, evaluations, recommendations documenting Steiner's academic career. Printed materials include press clippings about Steiner. Student papers include correspondence and records documenting Steiner's education at Charles University in Prague, the University of Melbourne, the University of Missouri, the University of California, and the University of Freiburg. Restitution files include correspondence and documentation supporting Steiner's claims to receive restitution on behalf of himself, relatives, and friends.

Series 2, Schutzstaffel (SS) materials, includes project and research files documenting John Steiner's sociological research on SS members. Records include correspondence, autobiographical accounts, interviews, tape transcripts, charts, and notes as well as correspondence with individuals such as Heinrich Baab, Karl Wolff, Josef Erber, Herbert Taege, Werner Best, Martin-Gerhard Sommer, Karl Brandt, and Gunter d'Alquen. The series also includes several folders of questionnaires completed by former SS officers.

Series 3, Writings, comprises published articles, stories, essays, drafts, speeches, and notes authored or co-authored by Steiner spanning his interests in sociology, the Holocaust, and topics such as Ideology, survivors, perpetrators, violence, and authoritarianism. Researchers may find writings by other authors intermingled.

Series 4: Sonoma State University, includes correspondence, forms, course material, and printed material documenting Steiner's professional career at Sonoma State University. This series includes academic evaluations and records documenting the Alliance for the Study of the Holocaust, the Holocaust Study (Studies) Center, the Holocaust Lecture Series, Steiner's faculty status, and special exhibits Steiner mounted on campus about the Holocaust. This series also documents efforts by the University's Public Affairs Office to promote Steiner and includes information about the Sociology department in general.

Series 5, Correspondence, is arranged alphabetically and includes letters, greeting cards, and emails exchanged with individuals and organizations. Most of the correspondence is related to Steiner's professional career, but some personal messages are included as well. Some notable files in this series

documenting Steiner's research and teaching include correspondence with Steiner's mentor, Eduard Baumgarten; with professional collaborators Jobst von Cornberg, Jochen Fahrenberg, Joel Dimsdale, and Philip Zimbardo; and with his Dachau liberator, Dan Dougherty.

Series 6, Subject files, assembles secondary literature, correspondence, and published material on various topics, individuals, and organizations of interest to Steiner. Individuals include fellow sociology and Holocaust history researchers as well as perpetrators. Topics focus on Holocaust history and projects and organizations documenting the Holocaust, but they also include subject such as Armenia, conscientious objectors, Czechoslovakia, futurology, power, sociology, suicide, and terrorism.

Subject Files subseries 2, 3, and 4 document the research and writings of Otto Strasser, Herbert Taege, and Philip Zimbardo. Otto Strasser (1897-1974) was a World War I veteran, joined the Nazi Party in 1925, and was a leading member of the party's left-wing faction. He broke with the party in 1930 and formed the Black Front, an opposition group to the Nazi Party. His brand of Nazism is now referred to as Strasserism. Herbert Taege (1921-?) volunteered in 1939 for the Waffen-SS, was wounded in Russia, and assigned to be a perimeter guard at Dachau in 1942. After seeing burning bodies in 1943, he began viewing Dachau through the eyes of a witness. He became a journalist after the war and founded Askania, a publishing company. His subseries includes a manuscript about Warsaw of unclear authorship. Philip Zimbardo (1933-) is an American psychologist and a professor emeritus at Stanford University. He is known for his 1971 Stanford prison experiment examining the power of roles, rules, symbols, group identity and situational validation of behavior that generally would repulse ordinary individuals. The study has been severely criticized for both ethical and scientific reasons.

Series 7, Photographs, includes images from some of Steiner's exhibits at the Sonoma Holocaust Study Center, John Steiner showing an American soldier the crematorium at Dachau, photos of Nazi officers, Hitler's secretary Christa Schroeder from war times to the 1980s, exhibit photos on the Third Reich, professional portraits of John Steiner, and personal photographs. Additional photographs can be found throughout the collection.

Series 8, Notes, includes handwritten, typed, bound, and loose notes by Steiner for his research, writings, lectures, speeches, and ideas for future work. The notes are often interspersed with personal memos or drafts of correspondence. This series is arranged by topic, when the topic could be discerned from labels or folder titles. Topics relate to the Holocaust, the SS, prisons, mental illness, sociology, and Steiner's dissertation research, among others.

Series 9, Printed material, consists of clippings, articles, newsletters, pamphlets, and photocopies of primary sources on subjects including, for example, the Holocaust, the SS, sociology, and Czechoslovakia.

Series 11, Audiovisual materials, has not yet been evaluated and might not be playable in the USHMM reading room.
