Biographical note

Martha Geller (1921-2001) was born Martha Ackner on April 23, 1921 in Vienna, Austria, to Sidney (Sindel) Ackner and Sabina (Sheve) Ackner. She and her parents relocated to Belgium and then immigrated to the United States, departing Liverpool, England and arriving in New York on February 6, 1940 aboard the Lancastria. She married Sheldon Geller on November 30, 1941, and the couple had two daughters: Suzanne and Annette.

Sheldon Geller (1919-1981) was born Sigmund Geller in Vienna, Austria, on February 26, 1919 to Chaskel and Mathilde Geller. His father was a World War I veteran. Sheldon and his parents relocated to Riga before Kristallnacht in November 1938. He immigrated the United States, sailing from Gothenburg, Sweden and arriving in New York on December 6, 1939. He married Martha Ackner on November 30, 1941, and the couple had two daughters: Suzanne and Annette. He served in the US Army from 1943-1946. During the Holocaust, his parents were deported to Siberia, where his mother died. His father returned to Vienna, married Josefina Brull in 1947, and later immigrated to the United States.
