Biographical note: Eli Rozycki (b. Kraków, Poland) is a survivor of Oranienburg concentration camp.

Scope and content of collection: Contains nine black-and-white photographs of post-liberation scenes at Dachau concentration camp. Includes scenes of dead bodies, the crematoria, and liberators viewing dead bodies. The photographs were taken ca. April 1945, mass-produced and distributed throughout Europe.
