Scope and content of collection

Consists of directives for organizing the Four-Year Plan, with estimates of labor needed from civilian prisoners, foreign workers, and POWs; a 1936 memorandum from Hitler about German foreign policy, including preparation for war with the Soviet Union, "Lebensraum," and ascriptions of collective Jewish responsibility for economic crimes; information about Göring's conferences with military commanders and the Agriculture Ministry regarding increasing food production for Germany from the Occupied Territories; records about Göring's orders on forced mobilization of the male and female population, the confiscation of food and animals, and the organization of new industry in Occupied Territories; reports on the growth of the partisan movement in the Ukraine; statistics on German losses from partisans in the Ukraine and Belorus; information about Göring's conferences regarding overall military actions in the Occupied Territories; and several 1943 reports on the Four-Year Plan, fighting partisans, and on partisan activities (apparently translations from German into Russian).

Historical note

The commissioner of the Four-Year Plan was appointed on 18/10/1936 for the central control of all economic and especially wartime measures and tasks resulting from the implementation of the (second) four-year plan proclaimed in 1936 within the framework of autarchy efforts and war preparations; The Prussian Ministry of State was headed by Hermann Göring (office of Secretary of State Körner). For the economic exploitation of the occupied and annexed areas, a number of special facilities have been set up within the framework of the Commissioner (eg Headquarters East, Chief Representative for the Economy of Serbia). From 1942, more and more powers were transferred to the Reich Minister of Armaments and Munitions (later for armaments and war production).

As one of the many organizational parts of the Commissioner for the Four-Year Plan (Business Groups, Agents / Plenipotentiaries, Special Representatives, etc.) Colonel Adolf von Schell was appointed on 15 November 1938 by the Chief Representative for Motor Vehicles (GBK). The Ordinance on Type Limitation in the Motor Vehicle Industry of 2 March 1939 gave him the power to approve all newly built motor vehicles: the "Plenipotentiary decides the type of construction, displacement classes, type numbers and payload limits to be complied with by the manufacturer" and determines "the Factories that are allowed to produce engines for motorcycles "(RGBI 1939 I, p. 386). Thus, a unification of motorcycle and car production in the Reich should be enforced, especially in order to enable the Wehrmacht in case of war easier maintenance and service of their fleet. The Schell Plan, submitted on March 15, 1939 and coming into force on January 1, 1940, provided only a few basic types for motorcycles, trucks, and passenger cars. The 114 existing truck types have been reduced to 19, based on four basic types, the car types from 52 to 30.

In August / September 1942, the Chief Representative for Motor Vehicles lost part of his duties to the Amtsgruppe Motorization at the Plenipotentiary for Armaments and the Reich Ministry for Armaments and War Production (Albert Speer). From now on, he only held the title of authorized representative for the motor vehicle industry. [Source: Archives.
