Consists of arrest reports as well as reports on other Gestapo activities such as raids and persons killed while trying to escape. The reasons for the arrests are included in the reports and include printing illegal material, spreading atrocity reports, suspicion of espionage, illegal possession of weapons, membership/leadership in illegal organizations, and being a Communist, foreigner, or Jew. Also included are reorganization plans for the Sipo Hauptamt in January 1938 and the whole Reichsministrium in July 1941.

Reorganization plan for the Interior Ministry (July 1941); among sections and departments are those for "Citizenship and Race," offices for race questions in the colonies, the Jewish Question. Included is an organization chart of the Bohemian-Moravian Protectorate; also, sections dealing with the New Order in the East and the New Order in the West; one department dealing with issues in Germany related to the war, including an office for POW matters, counterespionage, airraid protection, war damages, etc. Another earlier plan deals with organizational matters in the Sipo Main office (as of January 1938). It lists Reinhold Heydrich as Sipo Chief, and Chief of the Political Police. There are departments for Catholic and Protestant churches, emigrees, Jews, Freemasons, and a section on Protetive Custody and Concentration Camps, headed by Müller. Other organizational material deals with the Orpo and gendarmerie, and lists Heydrich also as Chief of the Kripo (Criminal Police). 1936-1941.
