Also contains case files of SS personnel and Umwandererzentralstelle employees.

Records are arranged in the original order of their acquisition from the source archive. The museum has acquired only selected records from Institute of National Remembrance (Instytut Pamięci Narodowej-Komisja Ścigania Zbrodni przeciwko Narodowi Polskiemu, or IPN). Historical Note

Der Chef der Sicherheitspolizei (Sipo) and the Einsatzgruppen des Sicherheitsdienstes (SD) [Chief of the Security Police and the Operational Squads of the Security Service], Reinhard Heydrich extablished the Umwanderer-Zentralstelle (UWZ) [Information Unit] on 1 April 1940 in Poznań. The main goal of this unit was to "evacuate" Poles and Jews from the annexed eastern territories of Gdańsk (Danzig -West Prussia) and Warta country or "evacuate", expropriate and deport.
