Biographical Note

The Delegacy of Government was created by the Polish Government in Exile in Apr. 1940. It constitutes the broad structure of the civil authorities of the underground in occupied Poland. The Delegate of Government, the deputy to the Prime Minister, and his deputies in various regions worked until 1945. They monitored the military "conspiracy" and conducted research and investigations on the policies of the German occupiers.

Scope and Content of Collection

Contains information about the activities of the Delegacy of a Government for a Country Poland and its subordinate units during the German occupation. Of special interest is information about prisons in various Polish cities; concentration camps; communist activity; conditions in the Warsaw ghetto; and underground movements.

System of Arrangement

The system of arrangement of the source repository has been preserved in the microfilmed reels.
