### **Scope and Content of Collection**

Contains correspondence, reports, orders and various other documents relating to administrative matters handled by the Feldkommandantur in Radom, Poland, from ca. December 1944 to ca. March 1945. Includes promotions for military personnel; special operations for German military formation Korück 532; distribution of weapons; building of trenches and defenses; dismantling of businesses in Radom; and report of "bandit" or partisan attacks on German soldiers.

### **System of Arrangement**

Records are arranged in the original order of their acquisition from the source archive. The museum has acquired only selected records from Institute of National Remembrance (Instytut Pamięci Narodowej-Komisja Ścigania Zbrodni przeciwko Narodowi Polskiemu, or IPN).
