The organization of the Council of the Elders in Częstochowa

The Council was called to life by the authorities on 1 October 1939. In the beginning of 1940 the following people made up the council: (names are listed on p. 11). During the reporting time the make-up of the Council changed because some of the members withdraws, renouncing their post (one person lift the country). In place of the outgoing persons, new people were added to that by the end of the reporting period the Council counted 25 persons (alphabetical roster follow on p. 11).

B. The Presidium

Similarly to the changes in the Council memberships, the personal make-ups of the Presidium underwent change. In the beginning Kopenski Lejb, president; Bromberg Lejb, vice-president; Berliner Nathan Dawid; Gerichter Chil, and; Newfeld Maurycy. Already after the first quarter of 1940, the roster was changed and the following persons were making up the presidium: Kopinski Lejb and 6 other members. Model of the ID for the president of the Council, 4" x 6" (p. 15), with the remark that he is to be free of all forced labor.

The Arbitrary Commission for the Committee of Elders in

Częstochowa came into being as a consequence of the resolution of the general meeting of lawyers and apprentices which took place on 29 December 1939. The Commission began its work in January 1940. The Arbitrary Commission bases its activity on the organizational statute and on general and internal proceedings regulations. To the scope of the Commission belongs the giving of legal help to Jewish population and especially to decide in the course of conciliatory or amicable proceedings in civil cases between the parties of whom at least one is Jewish. In the first quarter of 1940, 24 members made up the Arbitrary Commission. During the year one of the members left and ten were added, so that at the end of December 1940 the Commission counted 35 persons.

The chairman of the Arbitrary Commission is M. Konarski, lawyer, vice-chairman; Rajchman, lawyer; A. Rodał, secretary. Following is the agenda of the Commission: 1) conciliatory proceedings; 2) decision in amiable proceedings; 3) legal clinic.

The course of a proceeding is as follows: one party asks, applies, names the reasons and circumstances of the case, that the other party appears in the commission's office for the purpose of reconciliation. The Commission sets and collects payment, eventually releases the indigent party from charges. As next the secretary of the Commission submits the application to the chairman of the Commission for a decree. The chairman sets the time for the debate, and the Secretary calls the parties in for the purpose of reconciliation. The proceedings are conducted by a member of the Arbitrary Commission, usually a lawyer with the participation of the apprentice clerk who acts as a recorder.

In case that the proceedings does not end in reconciliation, the chairman of the reconciliatory proceeding proposes to the parties that they sign up for conciliatory trial.

Mostly watched the workers going and coming from the Aryan side who had to report to the police station and have their passes checked. Sometimes they would take a worker to his destination. The roster is marked with letters and numbers:

A - sentry guarding coal

A1 - guard sent for a physician

A2 - free to a certain hour

A3 - sent to hospital

A4 - special action

At any rate, everyone's time had to be accounted for. The names are handwritten, mostly illegible. Cannot find out if the same policemen had steady duties or if the groups were changed from one post to another. Some (1-7) were employed temporarily. On some sheets, names were crossed out. It could have been a check on the sentries. Certain time was set aside for briefing of policemen on duty.

Notes concerning personal, disciplinary matters of the Jewish policemen. Name lists of the Jewish policemen, date of birth, and address (125 persons). Reports of thefts. Sick call, reports. Physician's certificates. Rooms assignments. 150 names of auxiliary functionaries. Affidavits (marriages). October 1941 - 1942. 64 pages.

June - August 1942. 392 pages.

213/16 Instructions of the Częstochowa Chief of Police to the Jewish Police of the ghetto. The ghetto was under the control of the Second Polish Police section: discipline has to be maintained. Persons of lower rank in the Jewish police have to salute the higher ups. Reports have to be worded in a certain way. Even the Jewish Police must were Star of David arm bands (9 April 1941). A copy of orders to close certain streets and establish a Jewish ghetto (28 streets). Among others: all Poles have to move out by April 17, if they do not go on their own, they will be forcible removed and allowed only 25 kilos per person (same goes for the Jews from non-Jewish neighborhoods). The Jewish Committee is to assign living space to the Jews moving by April 17. Jewish businesses outside the future ghetto are temporarily excused from displacement. Under the penalty of 10,000zt, or prison, no Jew can leave the ghetto without a pass. 24 April 1941. 18 pages.
