**Provenance:** Records from the Österreichisches Staatsarchiv (Austrian State Archives) located in Vienna, Austria. The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum Archives received the filmed collection via the United States Holocaust Museum International Archives Project in October 2008.

**Biographical/Historical Note:** Records from the Österreichisches Staatsarchiv (Austrian State Archives) located in Vienna, Austria, pertaining to Department III for Cultural Affairs in the Reich Governor's Office (Abteilung III für kulturelle Angelegenheiten im Amt des Reichsstatthalters).

After the annexation of Austria by Nazi Germany, the Austrian Chancellor's Office (*Bundeskanzleramt*) was liquidated. Its functions were taken over by newly created ministerial offices. In June 1938 Department III for Cultural Affairs in the Reich Governor's Office (*Abteilung III für kulturelle Angelegenheiten im Amt des Reichsstatthalters*) was created. Department III was headed by Dr. Kajetan Mühlmann. The Office of *Reichsstatthalter* was disbanded in 1940.

**Restrictions on Access:** Users are required to fill out a "User Declaration" at USHMM reference desk in order to gain access to collection. "User Declarations" must be forwarded by USHMM once a year to Austrian State Archives.

**Restrictions on Use:** Use of archival material from the Austrian State Archives is limited to personal or scholarly research or for research about the applicant's family members. Transfer of the reproduced archival material to third persons is not permitted. Publication of archival material requires the written permission of the Austrian State Archives. If permission is granted, the applicant agrees to cite original archival reference and name of source archive in all publications, personal data are to be published in anonymous form only, a copy of any publication in which archival material from the Austrian State Archives was used shall be sent to the Austrian State Archives free of charge.

#### Organization and Arrangement: Arrangement is thematic.

**Scope and Content:** The content of the collection pertains to cultural institutions and art in Nazi-annexed Austria, in particular the confiscation and aryanization of Jewish-owned and Church-owned artwork and cultural properties.
