The Resettlement Department of Council of People's Commissars of MASSR was formed on 14 September 1939. Beginning July 1941, with the beginning of evacuation, the Department was charged with the work on registration of evacuated population.

In October 1941 the position of Representative of the Council on evacuation of Council of People's Commissars of MASSR was introduced and the Resettlement department was transferred to the Representative.

Based on the decision of the Council of People's Commissars of MASSR of 23 March 1942, the Resettlement department was reorganized into Department on economic accommodation of evacuated population of Council of People's Commissars of MASSR, which was subordinate to Department on economic accommodation of evacuated population of Council of People's Commissars of RSFSR and Council of People's Commissars of MASSR.

The responsibilities of the department included work on labor and economic arrangements of evacuated population and its material-domestic services.

The department's staff in 1942 included: the head of the department, 3 inspectors of economic accommodations, inspector of children's institutions, head of the resettlement sector, five inspectors of resettlement, two statisticians, accountant, 12 regional inspectors, and secretary.

Based on the decision of Council of People's Commissars of MASSR on 14 August 1945, the Department on economic accommodation of evacuated population was reorganized into Resettlement department of Council of People's Commissars of MASSR, and from 1946 – Council of Ministers (SM) of MASSR.
