Provenance: From the Archives of the Department of the High Alpes and the Provence. Camp Commission 1941-1943. Series 6J, General Association of Jews in France (5th directorate, 3rd section). The archives of the General Association of Jews in France, from the office of the town Sisteron, was recovered in 1985, were it was almost lost in an attic of a house on Droite Street in Sisteron. The U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum Archives received the microfilms via the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum International Programs Division in 1996.

Biographical/historical note: This Camp committee consists of the main Jewish assistance organizations, with at the head an executive committee of 3 members. Albert Levy, president of the committee for assistance for refugees, Dr. Weil and Georges Picard, General Secretary.

They Chose Toulouse as their headquarters because of the location of the town (7 Rue Caffarelli) half way between the Camps: Noe' Recebedou and Vernet. The committee had a goal: to centralize the Jewish archives. Georges Picard was the secretary general.

In April 1942 the General Association of Jews in France charged the Camp Committee from the 5th directorate to the 3rd section L'UGIF

This directorate stayed in Toulouse, under the responsibility of Georges Picard. In January 1943, L'UGIF decided to reorgan the 3rd Section. From January 13, Edgar Dreyfus (born in Paris, on May 20, 1902) took charge of the general secretariat, in place of Georges Picard, and temporary settled in Marseille, until the Camp Committee turned back to Sisteron on March 24, 1943. It worked at the Paul Ar`ene street till November 4, the date of arrest and deportation of all the members of the office.

The record groups (archival term) of national and international interest, have a great value because of their unquestionable testimony about refugees and internment camps in southern France, during the second world war.

Written under censorship, the hundreds of letters in French and German, consist of an exceptional intensity: cries of distress of people hurt and murdered, humiliated, mentally tortured and very conscious of being condemned. These documents give an incontestable strong link of knowledge about the condition of the Jews during the second world war.

Restrictions on Access: No restrictions on access.

Scope and Content: These archives consist of a group of documents from the Camp Committee, started in the beginning of 1941. Consists of records relating to the operations of the Union Générale des Israélites de France Commission des Camps. The Commission des Camps was headquartered in Toulouse, halfway between the camps of Gurs and Rivesaltes, and proximate to three other camps. The Commission's goal was the centralization of camp archives. The collection includes hundreds of letters from refugees and internees, testifying to the plight of Jews in France during occupation.
