5W197 Prefectural file on Jews: Aryanization of Jewish goods: Nomination of managing commissioners and provisional administrators with their pay schedules; the sale of [Jewish] goods; restoration of goods to victims according to the laws and measures of spoliation. Freezing of Jewish belongings: general orders, investigations for banks, confiscation of T.S.F. mail. 1940-1944.

5W267 Operational control of Jewish real property: Instructions and application of the law of 16 November 1940 and the ministerial decree of 22 January 1941. Application of regulatory texts for those acknowledging Jewish status: name lists of Jews living in the Côtes-du-Nord, the Ille-et-Vilaine, and Morbihan. 1940-1945.

11W1 Nomadic gypsies, 1st Directorate of the prefectural administration: Gypsies: Individual notices serving for the establishment of anthropometric notebooks [to serve as identity papers]; information on research into gypsies, telegrams. Information concerning concentrations of gypsies in camps around the Sarthe. Requests for certificates of residence in a [gypsy] camp. 1940-1955.

109W50 Dinan sub-prefecture: Arrests made by the German authorities. 1942-1944.

109W51 Dinan sub-prefecture: Census of Jews and Jewish businesses, declarations of not belonging to the Jewish race, Aryanization of goods, the wearing of the yellow star, expulsions from the costal zone, internment of Jewish foreigners, gypsies, and aliens; communist propaganda; [racial] purifications, the Deahaye affair in Calorguen; visits of the Prefects; the murder of a Russian soldier in Bourseul; crime; interdiction of newspapers 1942-1952; discovery of Allied handbills; the placing of the military archives in the Duguesclin quarter (formerly the military mustering area for Dinan); requisitions, the Nudant affair in Plénée-Jugon; the Territorials [i.e. National Guard]; administrative internments; war trophies recorded in the arrondissement; [foreign language] interpreters in the Dinan sub-prefecture and mayoral jurisdiction of Dinan, employees of the soldier's home in Dinan; burial of dead English sailors discovered on the coast; substantial combat engagements of the occupying forces; census and general upkeep of German military grave sites; departmental protective measures; departmental committee for rearmament; objections of the civic association; crimes, bombings, and sabotage. 1939-1952. 1140W83 Departmental Liberation Committee: Resistance: Executions by firing squad: lists, correspondence; Deportees: lists, correspondence, notes, creation of a departmental office for tracking the movement of young deportees; Requests to the center in Rennes for deportation certificates; The newspaper *Voix et Visage de l'Association Nationale des Déportés Internés de la Résistance*; Disability and widowhood pensions: correspondence, information on the death of patriots [i.e. Resistance fighters], *Morts pour la France*: mail, two samples of the newspaper *Les familles des Morts pour la*

France (March and May 1950), medals, orders; Monuments dedicated to the memory of the Resistance: correspondence, dedications at the Fleury Abby, the Lycée Anatole-Le-Braz, and Saint-Brieuc; Various correspondence featuring a letter from M. Branchoux to General Allard titled *Aperçu des faits, Lutte entre les différents groupes de Libération*; Story of the Maquis resistance fighters of Plouha. 1944-1948.

1140W84 Departmental Liberation Committee: Research into victims killed by the Germans: lists, descriptive files, lists of bodies recovered from [execution] ditches; National funerals: circulars, correspondence, notices, press articles; the Malaunay [execution] ditch (Métairie, Fleury. Le Gorrec, Paumier); Resistance fighters of Saint-Brieuc (who were students at the lycée Anatole-Le-Braz: Salaün, Cornec, Portron, and Geffroy) and Callac (inclusive of the fighters of Dulaut, Plestan, Plougonver, and the Lorge forest); Personnel file of M. Rouvrais who was responsible for Resistance memorials in the department; Various ceremonies: correspondence. 1944-1948.
