Scope and Content: The collection contains lists of refugees from Germany (1936–1937); documents on internment camps for foreigners at Agde, Ceilhes-et-Rocozols, and Olargues; statistics; documents from the sub-prefecture of Béziers on foreigners interned in the camp of Agde, Jews with safe passage documents or under house arrest, and the dissolution of “secret societies” (Freemasons); lists of missing, deceased, or deported Jewish veterans; information on miners’ strikes at la Caunette, roundups of Jewish families, and social services for foreigners; a report by social worker Mlle. Hirsch from Toulouse concerning children in the care of Mme. Zlatin in Izeiu; information on Department of Obligatory Labor “special cases” (foreigners, North Africans, and Jews); documents of the prefecture of

police for the Midi-Pyrénées region (including the Aude, Aveyron, Gard, Lozère, Hérault, and Pyrénées-Orientales); documents on pillaged, sequestered, or Aryanized Jewish property; documents on the Cambous children's home at Viols-en-Laval (1953–1958); and documents concerning Jewish professors and students.
