**Title:** Selected Records from the Reichskreditkassen collection (R 29), 1941-1943.

**Extent:** 1 microfilm reel.

**Provenance:** Original records located in the Bundesarchiv, Berlin, Germany. The United States Holocaust Memorial Museum's International Archives Project received the microfilm in Mar. 2004 through its mutual microfilm exchange program.

**Restrictions on Access:** Restrictions on access. To access Bundesarchiv collections researchers must fill out a "Request for Access to Bundesarchiv Documents." German and English language copies of the "Law on the Preservation and Use of the German Federal Archival Documents" are available at the Archives reference desk. The Bundesarchiv stipulated the requirement in the cooperative agreement signed with the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum.

**Restriction on Use:** Restrictions on use. Requests for reproduction must be directed to the Bundesarchiv. A copy of all publications based on its material must be provided to the Bundesarchiv. Researchers may not publish any Bundesarchiv material on the Internet, the World Wide Web, or any other publicly accessible on-line network without permission from the Bundesarchiv.

**Scope and Content:** Contains documents related to the operations of the Reichskreditkassen (German central bank) in the occupied territories.

**Biographical/historical note:** The Reichskreditkassen (RKK) was created in 1939, originally only for occupied Poland. The RKK functioned as the German central bank in the occupied territories. Beginning in May, 1940 the responsibilities of the RKK were expanded to include the distribution of payroll accounts for the occupying forces. Apart from their roll as payroll regulators for the armed forces, the RKK also served to control cash flow and credit transactions in and between the occupied territories.
