9 00:00:40,940 --> 00:00:42,740 Do one or two of these spring to mind?

10 00:00:42,740 --> 00:00:45,350

11 00:00:45,350 --> 00:00:53,180 Well, I think every case that we handled,

12 00:00:53,180 --> 00:00:59,150 and we were able successfully close the file, 13 00:00:59,150 --> 00:01:04,190 and put away for the future was successful.

14 00:01:04,190 --> 00:01:06,380 The frustrating ones do stay in the mind,

15 00:01:06,380 --> 00:01:12,480 and they're really too many of them to numerate.

16 00:01:12,480 --> 00:01:16,120 But each one of them is important.

17 00:01:16,120 --> 00:01:20,910 And one in particular stands out to this day

18 00:01:20,910 --> 00:01:23,190 as a total miscarriage, in my opinion,

19 00:01:23,190 --> 00:01:28,320 of justice on the part of our own United States government.

20 00:01:28,320 --> 00:01:32,280 That sometimes I'm ashamed to admit

21 00:01:32,280 --> 00:01:39,450 that I've spent all my life, and those of my compatriots,

22 00:01:39,450 --> 00:01:43,410 in the service defending our country and our American way

23 00:01:43,410 --> 00:01:45,300 of doing things.

24 00:01:45,300 --> 00:01:49,890 And see decisions made by

to the American way,

26 00:01:52,620 --> 00:02:01,950 the American awareness of things in life, the American fair play

28 00:02:03,460 --> 00:02:15,490 For example, in August 11, 12, and 13, and 14 of 1941,

29 00:02:15,490 --> 00:02:20,640 the Germans very methodically, very systematically,

30 00:02:20,640 --> 00:02:26,670 massacred 44,000 Jews in the Polish Ukraine

31 00:02:26,670 --> 00:02:28,380 in a town called Kowel.

32 00:02:28,380 --> 00:02:40,490 K-O-W-E-L. This town and the 44,000 people was deeply

33 00:02:40,490 --> 00:02:45,110 involved in the Luftwaffe program of building

34 00:02:45,110 --> 00:02:52,680 fast-forward airstrips in support of the Wehrmacht

35 00:02:52,680 --> 00:02:57,900 and its plunge into Russia, approximately 50 to 150 miles

36 00:02:57,900 --> 00:03:02,580 behind the then fluid front lines.

37 00:03:02,580 --> 00:03:11,460 And as won't be the case, the officer--

38 00:03:11,460 --> 00:03:15,750 in many instances, a civilian in charge of the project--

39 00:03:15,750 --> 00:03:18,300 would receive orders from up above

40 00:03:18,300 --> 00:03:20,910 to move on to the next project.

41 00:03:20,910 --> 00:03:22,740 Nothing further said or done.

42 00:03:22,740 --> 00:03:25,090 Move on to the next project.

43 00:03:25,090 --> 00:03:28,020 However, eliminate any vestige of cooperation

44 00:03:28,020 --> 00:03:30,330 by the inhabitants in the previous one.

45 00:03:30,330 --> 00:03:34,260 In other words, exterminate all the slave laborers

46 00:03:34,260 --> 00:03:36,310 that worked on that project.

47 00:03:36,310 --> 00:03:43,890 Orders came down for the SS to eliminate 44,000 Jews

48 00:03:43,890 --> 00:03:45,810 in Polish Ukraine. 49 00:03:45,810 --> 00:03:50,700 I vaguely remember this when it happened.

50 00:03:50,700 --> 00:03:53,610 There were some rumors in the newspapers of massacres

51 00:03:53,610 --> 00:03:56,880 going on in the Ukraine.

52 00:03:56,880 --> 00:04:00,530 In fact, the name Kowel struck to mind.

53 00:04:00,530 --> 00:04:03,600 And remember we were not at all even remotely involved

54 00:04:03,600 --> 00:04:06,170 in war crime activities at that time.

55 00:04:06,170 --> 00:04:10,740 But it was an event that seemed to shake the world

56 00:04:10,740 --> 00:04:12,340 in mammoth proportions.

57 00:04:12,340 --> 00:04:15,810 44,000 in just a few days massacred.

58 00:04:15,810 --> 00:04:23,310 So that in 1945, in the late spring of 1945,

59 00:04:23,310 --> 00:04:28,140 when one of our informants, probably Simon Wiesenthal,

60 00:04:28,140 --> 00:04:32,610 brought to our attention

## that the chief perpetrator

61 00:04:32,610 --> 00:04:38,310 of the Kowel massacre of 1941 was alive and well.

62 00:04:38,310 --> 00:04:41,850 And recently released from our internment camp at Hirschberg,

63 00:04:41,850 --> 00:04:47,880 and living at home in Bamberg, Germany.

64 00:04:47,880 --> 00:04:53,310 We received permission-with that type of a case

00:04:53,310 --> 00:04:56,840 where some mass atrocity, we received permission

66 00:04:56,840 --> 00:04:58,700 to go further.

67 00:04:58,700 --> 00:05:02,480 While we were, by order of priority,

68 00:05:02,480 --> 00:05:06,830 concentrating more on cases involving military personnel

69 00:05:06,830 --> 00:05:09,980 as opposed to strictly civilian personnel,

70 00:05:09,980 --> 00:05:14,330 we were still permitted to take on any crimes against humanity

71 00:05:14,330 --> 00:05:15,410 cases.

72 00:05:15,410 --> 00:05:17,215 Atrocities, wherever they showed up--

73

00:05:17,215 --> 00:05:20,030 an atrocity was an atrocity--

74

00:05:20,030 --> 00:05:24,110 in addition to war crimes cases [? that popped up ?]..

00:05:24,110 --> 00:05:26,630 This was certainly both.

76

00:05:26,630 --> 00:05:29,330 The war crimes, even though it didn't

77

00:05:29,330 --> 00:05:33,140 involve American military forces or even

78

00:05:33,140 --> 00:05:38,090 allied military forces, and definitely, an atrocity case.

79

00:05:38,090 --> 00:05:42,890 We captured Andreas Müller, the engineer in charge of that

80

00:05:42,890 --> 00:05:47,780 project, at his home in Bamberg in 1945,

81

00:05:47,780 --> 00:05:50,690 in the late spring of '45.

00:05:50,690 --> 00:05:54,290 Brought him to the Lennéstrasse in Nuremberg that day,

00:05:54,290 --> 00:05:57,290 and he tried to commit suicide on us that night.

00:05:57,290 --> 00:06:00,610

85 00:06:00,610 --> 00:06:04,350 He was very cooperative with subsequent interrogation.

86 00:06:04,350 --> 00:06:09,160 He acknowledged the orders that came from up above, which

87 00:06:09,160 --> 00:06:12,170 were now part of the main trials going on

88 00:06:12,170 --> 00:06:15,830 in Nuremberg, and particularly in the case against Goering.

89 00:06:15,830 --> 00:06:19,430 Orders came from the Luftwaffe to exterminate these towns,

90 00:06:19,430 --> 00:06:22,280 and Kowel was just one of them.

91 00:06:22,280 --> 00:06:23,990 At the main trial in Nuremberg, they

92 00:06:23,990 --> 00:06:28,920 were talking about dozens of towns, hundreds of thousands

93 00:06:28,920 --> 00:06:31,680 of people exterminated.

94 00:06:31,680 --> 00:06:34,515 But this one little town, this one little case

95 00:06:34,515 --> 00:06:37,380 seemed to appeal to us completely.

96 00:06:37,380 --> 00:06:40,740

## Primarily because we had the principal perpetrator

97 00:06:40,740 --> 00:06:43,350 right in our grasp.

98 00:06:43,350 --> 00:06:46,560 We developed the case against Müller.

99 00:06:46,560 --> 00:06:53,040 We could find only two or three other possible perpetrators

100 00:06:53,040 --> 00:06:56,195 involved, but we knew we had a weak case against them.

101 00:06:56,195 --> 00:06:58,320 We had a strong case against Müller because we flew

102 00:06:58,320 --> 00:07:02,010 to the Ukraine, we picked up seven live witnesses,

103 00:07:02,010 --> 00:07:07,320 flew them back to Dachau to the witness center.

104 00:07:07,320 --> 00:07:08,460 They were going to testify.

105 00:07:08,460 --> 00:07:11,550 They saw him not only in existence there

106 00:07:11,550 --> 00:07:16,805 every single day, and giving orders to build the strip,

107 00:07:16,805 --> 00:07:21,300 and orders to his troops to begin firing on the villages,

108

00:07:21,300 --> 00:07:24,540 but actually deliver coup de grace walking around.

109

00:07:24,540 --> 00:07:28,170 One of those that may still be swearing, shooting.

110

00:07:28,170 --> 00:07:30,600 Müller was a fierce looking individual.

111

00:07:30,600 --> 00:07:34,590 He was a Junker, a brilliant engineer,

112

00:07:34,590 --> 00:07:37,320 came from a long line of engineers.

113

00:07:37,320 --> 00:07:41,340 He had fierce Heidelberg dueling scars on his face,

114

00:07:41,340 --> 00:07:44,042 and he was much respected among his peers.

115

00:07:44,042 --> 00:07:45,750 So he would have been what was considered

116

00:07:45,750 --> 00:07:46,950 an aristocrat among--

117

00:07:46,950 --> 00:07:50,550 He was an aristocrat.

118

00:07:50,550 --> 00:07:53,650 Number of times, he tried to commit suicide.

119

00:07:53,650 --> 00:07:57,540 He tried to commit suicide in the Lennéstrasse in Nuremberg,

120

00:07:57,540 --> 00:07:58,920 twice at Dachau.

121

00:07:58,920 --> 00:08:00,930 We had him down there.

122

00:08:00,930 --> 00:08:05,580 We brought him back to Nuremberg, tried again.

123

00:08:05,580 --> 00:08:09,930 Yet, he would never plead guilty.

124

00:08:09,930 --> 00:08:14,490 Only that because he was ordered to do what he did.

125

00:08:14,490 --> 00:08:17,430 He acknowledged everything that he was accused of doing.

126

00:08:17,430 --> 00:08:20,700 How do you plead not guilty?

127

00:08:20,700 --> 00:08:23,280 There's your psyche.

128

00:08:23,280 --> 00:08:30,890 We remanded the case to Wiesbaden, the theater war

129

00:08:30,890 --> 00:08:34,610 crimes judge advocate section, for trial

130

00:08:34,610 --> 00:08:37,059 and it was scheduled to go on in Dachau.

131

00:08:37,059 --> 00:08:39,799

132

00:08:39,799 --> 00:08:43,460

The very week that we remanded it to trial,

133

00:08:43,460 --> 00:08:48,470 we received wired instructions from Washington signed,

134

00:08:48,470 --> 00:08:52,400 "we understand Stettinius, secretary of state,

135

00:08:52,400 --> 00:08:56,390 to drop the action against Andreas Müller."

136

00:08:56,390 --> 00:09:00,260 Dropped the case, released the man,

137

00:09:00,260 --> 00:09:03,410 and as we subsequently found out, we needed him.

138

00:09:03,410 --> 00:09:07,250 We Americans needed him to build up our own airfields

139

00:09:07,250 --> 00:09:07,940 in Germany.

140

00:09:07,940 --> 00:09:10,460 The Iron Curtain was then falling.

141

00:09:10,460 --> 00:09:15,290 And he was instrumental in building up Fürstenfeldbruck

142

00:09:15,290 --> 00:09:17,420 in Bavaria.

143

00:09:17,420 --> 00:09:24,460 He died in bed a very wealthy man in 1961.

144

00:09:24,460 --> 00:09:27,210 There's a case unfinished.

145

00:09:27,210 --> 00:09:29,180 To us, it's frustrating.

146

00:09:29,180 --> 00:09:31,900 We had the evidence against the man.

147

00:09:31,900 --> 00:09:34,990 He personally killed several of these people.

148

00:09:34,990 --> 00:09:40,120 He's got the blood of 44,000 others on his hands,

149

00:09:40,120 --> 00:09:45,080 permitted to live out his life peacefully.

150

00:09:45,080 --> 00:09:48,000 So in this case, there wasn't even

151

00:09:48,000 --> 00:09:53,000 the covert action that has been attributed to bringing Nazi war

152

00:09:53,000 --> 00:09:56,810 criminals to freedom in order to fight communism, so to speak.

153

00:09:56,810 --> 00:09:59,690 This was a case where at the highest levels of government,

154

00:09:59,690 --> 00:10:03,200 there was condonation of this action.

155

00:10:03,200 --> 00:10:05,210 Highest levels of our government.

156 00:10:05,210 --> 00:10:05,880 Yeah. 157 00:10:05,880 --> 00:10:11,090 Was there ever any legal justification? 158 00:10:11,090 --> 00:10:13,730 The actual reason was that we needed this man skills 159 00:10:13,730 --> 00:10:17,840 or knowledge or whatever to do something for our own purposes. 160 00:10:17,840 --> 00:10:19,670 Was there ever any legal reason given 161 why he should not be held--162 None whatsoever.

00:10:19,670 --> 00:10:23,240

00:10:23,240 --> 00:10:23,907

00:10:23,907 --> 00:10:24,573 None whatsoever.

164 00:10:24,573 --> 00:10:26,535 It's an arbitrary decision, drop the action.

165 00:10:26,535 --> 00:10:29,860

166 00:10:29,860 --> 00:10:30,390 Wow.

167 00:10:30,390 --> 00:10:30,890 Wow.

168 00:10:30,890 --> 00:10:34,810 169

00:10:34,810 --> 00:10:37,210 There were many reasons given as we later--

170

00:10:37,210 --> 00:10:38,590 we complained about it.

171

00:10:38,590 --> 00:10:41,470 Colonel Bates and I went to Wiesbaden,

172

00:10:41,470 --> 00:10:45,010 and was summarily chased out of the office

173

00:10:45,010 --> 00:10:47,380 up there as we protested this.

174

00:10:47,380 --> 00:10:50,470 We were told, in no uncertain terms, that look,

175

00:10:50,470 --> 00:10:53,370 we've been wasting a lot of time with these cases.

176

00:10:53,370 --> 00:10:59,440 This man committed no crimes against the Army, no crimes

177

00:10:59,440 --> 00:11:02,440 against Americans.

178

00:11:02,440 --> 00:11:04,540 What they were implying was that his only crime

179

00:11:04,540 --> 00:11:08,020 was against foreign Jews.

180

00:11:08,020 --> 00:11:10,630 Therefore, unimportant, drop it.

181

00:11:10,630 --> 00:11:13,360

Greater things, bigger things coming.

182 00:11:13,360 --> 00:11:18,040 And that attitude, I'm afraid, prevailed from that point on.

183

00:11:18,040 --> 00:11:21,190 From that point on, that to me, was the death knell

184

00:11:21,190 --> 00:11:23,937 of the American War crimes era.

185

00:11:23,937 --> 00:11:27,930

00:11:27,930 --> 00:11:31,480 To your knowledge, at least, did any other government,

187

00:11:31,480 --> 00:11:34,640 Polish or Soviet, ever express an interest in this man?

188

00:11:34,640 --> 00:11:35,140 No.

189

00:11:35,140 --> 00:11:36,243 Whatsoever.

190

00:11:36,243 --> 00:11:36,910 None whatsoever.

191

00:11:36,910 --> 00:11:37,420 Right.

192

00:11:37,420 --> 00:11:40,090 His crimes were solely against Jews.

193

00:11:40,090 --> 00:11:46,260

00:11:46,260 --> 00:11:50,850 At the time, you mentioned that this stood out

195

00:11:50,850 --> 00:11:57,210 as a particularly egregious example of justice miscarried.

196

00:11:57,210 --> 00:12:00,210 Was there any indication in other cases

197

00:12:00,210 --> 00:12:03,510 that, in effect, your own side was working against you

198

00:12:03,510 --> 00:12:06,780 in trying to obtain justice?

199

00:12:06,780 --> 00:12:12,930 Well, in many instances, the normal botch-up in bureaucracy,

200

00:12:12,930 --> 00:12:15,450 the red tape that you go through,

201

00:12:15,450 --> 00:12:18,390 a lack of experience at the other end-- really,

202

00:12:18,390 --> 00:12:20,070 who had experience in these matters

203

00:12:20,070 --> 00:12:22,950 except those of us who were in, let's say, in the trenches?

204

00:12:22,950 --> 00:12:24,630 We learned the hard way.

205

00:12:24,630 --> 00:12:27,360 And we would forward

our recommendations up

206

00:12:27,360 --> 00:12:28,890 to Wiesbaden.

207

00:12:28,890 --> 00:12:31,080 They would come back

"we do not consider

208

00:12:31,080 --> 00:12:34,950 it germane enough to issue that you raised,"

209

00:12:34,950 --> 00:12:37,950 whatever it may be, and the case was dropped.

210

00:12:37,950 --> 00:12:39,180 We lost many.

211

00:12:39,180 --> 00:12:42,120

00:12:42,120 --> 00:12:45,930 What we think was, could have been an important war criminal.

213

00:12:45,930 --> 00:12:48,090 At least we made no effort to turn him over

214

00:12:48,090 --> 00:12:51,660 to any of the allied forces that might have an interest in him.

215

00:12:51,660 --> 00:12:55,740 Everyone seemed to be going his own way.

216

00:12:55,740 --> 00:12:58,620 We got to a point now, there's a concern

217

00:12:58,620 --> 00:13:00,510 American military forces--

218

00:13:00,510 --> 00:13:01,770 forget British.

219

00:13:01,770 --> 00:13:02,970 American military forces?

220

00:13:02,970 --> 00:13:05,110 If not, drop it.

221

00:13:05,110 --> 00:13:08,310 And that was a phase out of the war crimes program.

222

00:13:08,310 --> 00:13:10,222 It just disappeared.

223

00:13:10,222 --> 00:13:12,180 Did any of this appear attributable to the fact

224

00:13:12,180 --> 00:13:14,127 that there was, in fact, a divided command?

225

00:13:15,210 --> 00:13:17,418 There were Soviet zones, French zones, British zones.

227

00:13:17,418 --> 00:13:18,570 Had nothing to do with it.

228

00:13:18,570 --> 00:13:20,820 Nothing to it?

229

00:13:20,820 --> 00:13:23,145 Nothing to it.

230

00:13:23,145 --> 00:13:25,350 They had created a monster by creating 00:13:25,350 --> 00:13:32,630 us, the war crimes team with rather ill-defined purposes.

232

00:13:32,630 --> 00:13:35,900 I think the teams, in general, all nine of us,

233

00:13:35,900 --> 00:13:38,600 all nine teams performed well.

234

00:13:38,600 --> 00:13:42,240 In some instances, over and above what

235

00:13:46,280 --> 00:13:48,480 Worked day and night.

00:13:48,480 --> 00:13:51,840 We tried to see that justice was done.

241

00:14:00,690 --> 00:14:02,540 Now you're faced with a choice.

242

00:14:04,670 --> 00:14:08,600 You know damn well that you had some bigwigs sitting there

244

00:14:08,600 --> 00:14:12,770 in the pen, and you know that they got out.

245

00:14:12,770 --> 00:14:16,940 And the feeling of personal culpability

246

00:14:16,940 --> 00:14:20,420 begins coming over you after a while.

247

254

00:14:38,930 --> 00:14:41,310 There were some of the biggies.

255

00:14:41,310 --> 00:14:44,000 Let them all get out.

256

00:14:44,000 --> 00:14:46,340 Now, now, we're spending millions

257

00:14:46,340 --> 00:14:47,792 of dollars trying to find them.

258

00:14:47,792 --> 00:14:50,340

259

00:14:50,340 --> 00:14:51,337 It's a little too late.

260

00:14:51,337 --> 00:14:54,259

261

00:14:54,259 --> 00:14:58,230 We lack the sincerity to start a program,

262

00:14:58,230 --> 00:15:03,130 probably as important as this, and carry it through.

263

00:15:03,130 --> 00:15:06,520 That's my opinion there.

264

00:15:06,520 --> 00:15:09,820 Do you think this is because we regard

265

00:15:09,820 --> 00:15:11,800 yesterday's enemy as today's friend,

266

00:15:11,800 --> 00:15:14,078 and we have new antagonists, and therefore, we--

267

00:15:14,078 --> 00:15:15,620 I think you hit it right on the head.

268

00:15:15,620 --> 00:15:17,770 I think we saw that

back in '45 when we got

269

00:15:17,770 --> 00:15:19,810 the telegram from Stettinius.

270

00:15:22,510 --> 00:15:23,940 Let's look at it.

272

00:15:23,940 --> 00:15:27,640 Who are our best economic partners in the world today?

00:15:31,090 --> 00:15:33,830 Let me ask you this question.

00:15:33,830 --> 00:15:40,460 You are now a private citizen with a nonmilitary profession

## You've gathered material and have

285

00:16:12,700 --> 00:16:14,380 What has motivated you?

286

00:16:14,380 --> 00:16:17,350 And to what extent does your own Jewishness have

287

00:16:17,350 --> 00:16:20,020 something to do with it?

288

00:16:20,020 --> 00:16:23,350 My own Jewishness has very little to do with it

289

00:16:23,350 --> 00:16:26,260 I'd like to believe.

290

00:16:26,260 --> 00:16:28,210 I'm of the belief that it can, probably will,

291

313 00:17:33,270 --> 00:17:34,220 OK.

314 00:17:34,220 --> 00:17:36,230 And there you were given access to a great deal

315 00:17:36,230 --> 00:17:39,440 of classified information as to what was going on.

316 00:17:39,440 --> 00:17:42,470 Did you have a sense then, based upon what you were taught

317 00:17:42,470 --> 00:17:45,290 and the materials to which you had access,

318 00:17:45,290 --> 00:17:47,870 that at least some allied governments had 319

00:17:47,870 --> 00:17:51,050 a fairly good idea of what was going on,

320

00:17:51,050 --> 00:17:53,690 as early as at least the time you were trained?

321

00:17:53,690 --> 00:17:55,490 Well, the London War Crimes Commission

322

00:17:55,490 --> 00:17:57,920 was very much in existence then.

323

00:17:57,920 --> 00:17:59,900 And they were collating information

324

00:17:59,900 --> 00:18:02,280 from all parts of occupied Europe,

325

00:18:02,280 --> 00:18:04,620 very accurate information.

00:18:04,620 --> 00:18:06,230 Those pipelines were kept open.

00:18:08,790 --> 00:18:12,450 And given these materials you saw,

329

330

00:18:19,490 --> 00:18:19,990 for it?

00:18:19,990 --> 00:18:21,580 Realism's always a shock.

333

00:18:21,580 --> 00:18:23,250 Realism, admittedly, must have been.

00:18:23,250 --> 00:18:28,400 Because along with the realism comes the sights, the smells.

I would rather reserve comment on that.

358

00:19:45,830 --> 00:19:49,030 been lost at Flossenbürg in the area.

00:19:51,950 --> 00:19:54,910 So as we're winding down toward the end of our afternoon

361

00:19:54,910 --> 00:20:00,915 together, to conclude the interview, Mr. Wegard,

362

00:20:00,915 --> 00:20:02,290 is there anything that you'd like

363

00:20:02,290 --> 00:20:06,640 to leave us with as far as why you mentioned that you thought

365

00:20:09,250 --> 00:20:11,320 With all of our discussion, it's very difficult

366

00:20:11,320 --> 00:20:15,238 to assign reasons as to why it happened the first time.

371

00:20:27,400 --> 00:20:29,860 1917 period on forward.

372

00:20:29,860 --> 00:20:32,680 Let's go back into history.

373

00:20:32,680 --> 00:20:36,040 There's always a Caligula showing up across the horizon

374

00:20:36,040 --> 00:20:37,810 somewhere.

377

00:20:51,970 --> 00:20:58,230 And the groundswell, you can almost call it a groundswell,

383

00:20:58,230 --> 00:21:01,870 is beginning to develop.

00:21:01,870 --> 00:21:06,070 All the rudiments are there now for something like that.

385

00:21:06,070 --> 00:21:09,540 You keep repeating a lie, after a while, it becomes the truth.
