- :30 He has a health food business; wife takes care of stores; Good health, nutrition are important
- 1:00 Serve God by being healthy
- 2:00 Doesn't eat meat; exchanged meat with other prisoners when in the camps; makes a living helping people
- 3:00 He was in the textile industry in New York out of necessity
- 4:00 He recommends film by a Dutch filmmaker; story of a boy whose family is destroyed by WW II
- 5:00 He has helped people who became famous later; ministers of justice he helped to escape
- 6:00 He says he doesn't know what would've happened to him if there had not been the war
- 7:00 His sister died in a concentration camp for helping him to help the Jews
- 7:30 He believes in the justice of God; father was a minister in the church of the Seventh Day Adventists; family observed the Saturday Sabbath, same as the Jews
- 8:00 Father refused to send kids to school on Saturday; went to jail in Switzerland; John says he had to help the Jews when the war started, thanks to his religious training and concept of right and wrong, instilled in him by his father
- 9:00 Didn't consider priesthood for himself; believes in special callcalling; does his duty to church as a member
- 10:00 Every day he remembers his sister
- 11:00 He was arrested, tortured; can speak now only with one side of his face; he acknowledges that he is hard to understand!

- 11:30 He cannot forget seeing SS hitting babies on the head for making noise
- 12:00 Came to the US to try to forget; sister was arrested on the Sabbath
- 13:00 He says that members of the underground are disappointed with the fact that Germany has been able to come back as a power; doubts the justice in this
- 14:30 War helped him understand how important love and compassion are; We should study the past and remember so that it will not happen again
- 16:00 He had strong concept of helping others, love, due to his upbringing in the church
- 17:00 Sympathy with Jewish people in Holland before the war; strike to protest arrest of Jews
- 18:30 Father thankful to Jews for the Bible; John taught to love and respect the Jews
- 19:30 He had a brother who died before the war and another sister was nearly arrested with the other sister; she is still alive and lives in Switzerland
- 22:00 He was honored by the City of Hope as the Man of the Year; he says it is nice to be recognized but he is not excited
- 23:00 He wants to give message to non-Jewish people, for the Catholics and the Protestants to come together
- 24:00 The Christian world needs to observe basis of love and the word of Christ more; they must practice what they believe in
- 26:30 He lived near the Swiss border of Holland; Jews could be saved if they could reach Switzerland and he helped them do it
- 27:00 In the beginning the persecutions were not so bad; after July, 1942 began the mass arrests
- 27:30 He helped refugees who came into France from Germany when he lived in Lyon
- 28:00 He helped to take 300 people from Holland to France, Switzerland, Spain
- 29:00 He says Americans have--no idea what the war experience was
- 30:30 Man has not learned, has not changed, despite the war; maybe Germany had learned something, but there is Waldheim in Austria allowed to come back; few people learn the lessons of history

- 32:00 American society most compassionate gives a lot of outside help
- 34:00 Americans ignored horrors of the camps, but Jews welcome in US after the war; US realized they were wrong, remorse
- 37:00 He housed Jews in the beginning, then the Gestapo arrested him He traveled with false papers as an escort to the Jews escaping
- 39:30 Having seen what he has seen, he feels more responsibility to help people; he stays in business to make money for church, charity organizations
- 40:00 He accepts speaking engagements to remember the Holocaust
- 42:00 Parents and children should be educated about the Holocaust; parents must lead as example of love, selflessness
- 43:30 One must stick to beliefs, regardless of the consequences
- 44:00 He now finds work for Ethiopian refugees; works with handicapped children; gives money to many organizations
- 49:00 He discusses the Jewish kosher laws, the importance of nutrition and health; responsibility to God to take care of yourself
- 50:00 Effects of war on physical health: nervous tension, not sleeping; he his happy to be still alive
- 51:00 He says he is far from perfection, he is just nothing
- 52:00 He repeats the importance of love and compassion; asks God to take his selfishness from him; says his relationship to God should be stronger; God must give him the conscience to do what is right
- 55:30 He has seen how far man is capable of going in his inhumanity against man; it could happen in America or anywhere
- 56:30 Must be careful when we put responsibility on other people rather than on ourselfs
- 59:30 He has been treated well by Jewish people
- 61:00 He doesn't think rescues were great acts of bravery; he did his duty
- 63:00 People who worked with him in the underground were all united in concept of love, despite the fact that they were of many religions: Catholic, Protestant, Agnostics, Jews
- 64:00 Girl in the underground was arrested while carrying a book of names, then 50 of them were arrested in one night; 40 of them, including his sister, died in camps

- 65:00 The woman should not have been carrying the book, should never have spoken after her arrest; he did not speak when arrested
- 77:00 It was easier to shelter children; more likely to find them places to stay with families
- 80:30 Seventh Day Adventists work with Jews for the separation of church and state, to protect freedom of minorities
- 83:00 Other Dutch rescuers are in the LA area; many Dutch helped the Jews; Dutch population was sympathetic to them
- 84:00 Polish population was unsympathetic; Catholic Church never was sympathetic to Jews
- 90:00 Many people are very thankful to him; some do not acknowledge him at all, but he is not bitter towards those he helped who do not thank him
- 91:00 He also saved American airmen who landed behind the lines .END
