00:00:28,750 --> 00:00:33,540 I know only after the war what had been.

7

00:00:33,540 --> 00:00:37,470 During the war, you practically knew nothing.

8

00:00:37,470 --> 00:00:40,920 Because if you went to the places

9

00:00:40,920 --> 00:00:44,910 who we are supposed to know, you heard only

10 00:00:44,910 --> 00:00:48,220 you should do what you are told.

11 00:00:48,220 --> 00:00:51,410 We don't know what happened. 00:00:51,410 --> 00:00:53,500 We do not know what you should do.

13

00:00:53,500 --> 00:00:57,040 We cannot give you any answer because we do not know.

14

00:00:57,040 --> 00:00:59,680 This was the official.

15

00:00:59,680 --> 00:01:06,100 What private was, I don't know when that did start.

16

00:01:06,100 --> 00:01:11,370 But I do know that very close friends of ours

17

00:01:11,370 --> 00:01:24,620 came to us in 1942, in July, that they had a few people who

18 00:01:24,620 --> 00:01:27,100 offered to help.

19

00:01:27,100 --> 00:01:32,700 And this was a small church of blue collar workers

20

00:01:32,700 --> 00:01:38,240 who made it their goal to help Jewish people who

21

00:01:38,240 --> 00:01:44,700 needed it to take in their homes as far as possible.

22 00:01:44,700 --> 00:01:47,880

And we naturally said we do. 23

00:01:47,880 --> 00:01:51,150 Because by that time, we were already

24

00:01:51,150 --> 00:02:01,330 ordered to come to the train on the 15th of July, 1942 at

25

00:02:01,330 --> 00:02:03,280 night.

26

00:02:03,280 --> 00:02:07,540 And we brought-- would be brought east--

27

00:02:07,540 --> 00:02:10,039 that was on this letter--

28

00:02:10,039 --> 00:02:11,660 to work.

29

00:02:11,660 --> 00:02:16,140 So this didn't-- we didn't like this sort of expression it was

30

00:02:16,140 --> 00:02:16,640 supplied.

31

00:02:16,640 --> 00:02:23,040 And the Jewish-the Jewish people

32

00:02:23,040 --> 00:02:26,590 who were in charge of that didn't help us at all.

33

00:02:26,590 --> 00:02:30,030 So we were very happy to accept the help of this group.

34

00:02:30,030 --> 00:02:32,280 And they did help us.

35 00:02:32,280 --> 00:02:36,810

We have-- the first thing go to those people.

36

00:02:36,810 --> 00:02:39,450 What did you and your husband decide to do?

37

00:02:39,450 --> 00:02:42,960 Explain to me about how big your family was,

38

00:02:42,960 --> 00:02:47,250 and how much you knew of what was going on,

39

00:02:47,250 --> 00:02:49,110 what fear you had, and then what you

40

00:02:49,110 --> 00:02:51,600 decided to do with your child.

41

00:02:51,600 --> 00:02:54,600 Now, we had no idea.

42

00:02:54,600 --> 00:02:58,890 And like everybody else, we only knew since we came originally

43

00:02:58,890 --> 00:03:02,130 from Germany, that practically all the people who

44

00:03:02,130 --> 00:03:05,820 had left in Germany, Jewish people, were not there anymore.

45

00:03:05,820 --> 00:03:11,020 They were taken-- they were taken by train, or whatever,

46 00:03:11,020 --> 00:03:14,670 and nobody had ever

heard anything from them

47

00:03:14,670 --> 00:03:15,750 when they were gone.

48

00:03:15,750 --> 00:03:18,750 And nobody knew where they were.

49

00:03:18,750 --> 00:03:21,150 So this was already enough for us

50

 $00:03:21,150 \rightarrow 00:03:27,000$ to decide that we would do anything, and take any help.

51

00:03:27,000 --> 00:03:32,390 The first thing we did was that my husband discussed it

52

00:03:32,390 --> 00:03:34,860 with a doctor if he could get his--

53

00:03:34,860 --> 00:03:38,210

54

00:03:38,210 --> 00:03:41,270 now, I don't know the word anymore--

55

00:03:41,270 --> 00:03:42,300 removed.

56 00:03:42,300 --> 00:03:42,980 Appendix.

57 00:03:42,980 --> 00:03:46,770 Yes, his appendix removed, even the appendix was fine.

58 00:03:46,770 --> 00:03:48,380 And when he woke up in the hospital,

59 00:03:48,380 --> 00:03:50,870 there were more lost appendixes.

60 00:03:50,870 --> 00:03:56,080 So this would-- since we had to be at the 15th

61 00:03:56,080 --> 00:03:59,330 at the station, that was a few days before.

62

00:03:59,330 --> 00:04:06,110 So we had time with the doctor thing at--

63

00:04:06,110 --> 00:04:14,090 doctors telling what he had done to get two weeks time,

64 00:04:14,090 --> 00:04:16,500 and then we should come again.

65

00:04:16,500 --> 00:04:19,610 So with this two weeks, we were using

66

00:04:19,610 --> 00:04:27,550 because I had heard that the Jewish council was hiring

67

00:04:27,550 --> 00:04:29,650 people for all kinds of work.

68

00:04:29,650 --> 00:04:36,700 And all those people were on a piece of paper at that moment

69

00:04:36,700 --> 00:04:39,170 free of deportation.

70 00:04:39,170 --> 00:04:42,710 Our family was my husband, our little girl,

71

00:04:42,710 --> 00:04:49,770 which was at that time four years old, and me.

72

00:04:49,770 --> 00:04:51,750 So we decided to do all that.

73

00:04:51,750 --> 00:04:54,900 And I went around and I got a job, which

74

00:04:54,900 --> 00:05:04,840 made us all available not to go, and we could stay

75

00:05:04,840 --> 00:05:07,270 the time-- there was no limit.

76

00:05:07,270 --> 00:05:14,120 So my husband came home and we thought maybe with a job I have

77

00:05:14,120 --> 00:05:19,050 that we would be helped at the time.

78

00:05:19,050 --> 00:05:24,850 I worked at old people's home in the kitchen.

79

00:05:24,850 --> 00:05:28,500 And I worked every day.

80 00:05:28,500 --> 00:05:31,670 And I cooked for 40 people.

81 00:05:31,670 --> 00:05:32,570 I liked it.

82 00:05:32,570 --> 00:05:36,260 I liked the work, and it seemed to be safe.

83 00:05:36,260 --> 00:05:40,010 And one morning after about six weeks of working,

84 00:05:40,010 --> 00:05:43,400 I came at 7:00 and the doors were open,

85 00:05:43,400 --> 00:05:46,580 and all the people in there were gone.

86 00:05:46,580 --> 00:05:51,510 It was a terrible, terrible frightening.

87 00:05:51,510 --> 00:05:54,870 Rooms-- every room was looked for probably

88 00:05:54,870 --> 00:05:56,250 for valuable things.

89 00:05:56,250 --> 00:05:57,300 I don't know.

90 00:05:57,300 --> 00:06:00,960 When I saw what had happened that most of the people who

91 00:06:00,960 --> 00:06:05,440 couldn't walk and were taken and must

92 00:06:05,440 --> 00:06:10,060 have been taken in stretchers, I didn't believe any word 93 00:06:10,060 --> 00:06:10,570 any more.

94

00:06:10,570 --> 00:06:15,820 I ran out and ran home, and I knew what we had was not safe,

95

00:06:15,820 --> 00:06:16,850 the piece of paper.

96

00:06:16,850 --> 00:06:19,890

97

00:06:19,890 --> 00:06:22,170 Describe to me what you and your husband

98

00:06:22,170 --> 00:06:25,730 decided to do with your daughter.

99 00:06:25,730 --> 00:06:29,730 This same man who came just--

100

00:06:29,730 --> 00:06:32,670 I talked about before, which came just after that

101

00:06:32,670 --> 00:06:40,620 has happened to us, he told us that our friends,

102

00:06:40,620 --> 00:06:42,960 and our friends told us, also.

103 00:06:42,960 --> 00:06:44,350

They had a daughter.

104

00:06:44,350 --> 00:06:48,950 She was about five, six months older than ours. 105 00:06:48,950 --> 00:06:52,590 And we were-- the mother of the child,

106 00:06:52,590 --> 00:06:55,530 we were friends from school in Germany.

107

00:06:55,530 --> 00:06:58,270 So we all knew each other very well.

108

00:06:58,270 --> 00:07:01,680 And they had told us that they had made the decision

109

00:07:01,680 --> 00:07:04,200 and the child is already gone.

110

00:07:04,200 --> 00:07:13,300 And he and she and his mother who lived with them was gone.

111

00:07:13,300 --> 00:07:15,820 They won't be going that one of the leader

112

00:07:15,820 --> 00:07:20,410 into wherever they were safe, where they're supposed to be.

113

00:07:20,410 --> 00:07:22,670 We never-- we didn't hear anything.

114

00:07:22,670 --> 00:07:24,110 And that was the right way.

115

00:07:24,110 --> 00:07:26,650 And this man said, we will try that for you, 00:07:26,650 --> 00:07:29,050 too, if you want to give up your child.

117

00:07:29,050 --> 00:07:32,050 Because three of you cannot be in one part.

118

00:07:32,050 --> 00:07:34,780 You have to give your child somebody.

119

00:07:34,780 --> 00:07:37,480 And the leader, he said he had somebody

120

00:07:37,480 --> 00:07:41,020 as we found out much, much later, that was

121

00:07:41,020 --> 00:07:43,240 his sister, this man's sister.

122 00:07:43,240 --> 00:07:45,220 That was Joe Fisch.

123 00:07:45,220 --> 00:07:46,930 He's still alive.

124 00:07:46,930 --> 00:07:55,040 And that's where they took our child.

125 00:07:55,040 --> 00:07:58,430 And there was very, very helpful.

126 00:07:58,430 --> 00:08:01,790 They got the bed and the toys and clothes and everything

127 00:08:01,790 --> 00:08:04,490 there already, that Contact reference@ushmm.org for further information about this collection

when she would come,

128

00:08:04,490 --> 00:08:08,910 it wasn't all foreigners, strangers.

129

00:08:08,910 --> 00:08:11,880 And then he was trying to look for us for a place,

130

00:08:11,880 --> 00:08:14,430 and that took a little longer, maybe a month,

131

00:08:14,430 --> 00:08:18,340 until we found the first place to go so-called underground.

132

00:08:18,340 --> 00:08:19,690 It was never underground.

133

00:08:19,690 --> 00:08:23,210 It was always in an attic.

134

00:08:23,210 --> 00:08:27,110 Describe what your daughter knew about hiding,

135

 $00:08:27,110 \rightarrow 00:08:30,920$ and how difficult it was for you to part with her.

136

00:08:30,920 --> 00:08:34,150 My daughter didn't know she was hiding.

137

00:08:34,150 --> 00:08:37,000 As I said, she was not five yet.

138 00:08:37,000 --> 00:08:43,809 And we-- my husband and I had more than a year ago decided

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139 00:08:43,809 --> 00:08:48,010 since we knew of children transports from Germany

140

00:08:48,010 --> 00:08:53,460 to England, maybe that would be one day possible.

141

00:08:53,460 --> 00:08:56,310 So we would give away our child any

142

00:08:56,310 --> 00:09:01,470 place we knew where she would be welcome.

143

00:09:01,470 --> 00:09:06,680 And why should she maybe has to die

144

00:09:06,680 --> 00:09:09,240 when she can live a good life.

145

00:09:09,240 --> 00:09:11,720 We have family in the United States

146

00:09:11,720 --> 00:09:14,360 who were only too happy to take her.

147

00:09:14,360 --> 00:09:19,910 So we decided that we-- that to make it to her-- for her heart

148

00:09:19,910 --> 00:09:27,910 not to kiss her anymore, not to have her too close physically.

149 00:09:27,910 --> 00:09:29,160 Both of us did that.

151 00:09:32,060 --> 00:09:33,890 And that has helped her.

152 00:09:33,890 --> 00:09:39,590 Because when we had the time that she had to leave,

153

00:09:39,590 --> 00:09:40,880 and we told her--

154 00:09:40,880 --> 00:09:43,070 she was an outgoing child.

155

00:09:43,070 --> 00:09:49,490 She would go and visit a couple and they have no children,

156

00:09:49,490 --> 00:09:52,560 and they would so much like to see her.

157

00:09:52,560 --> 00:09:56,790 And she was-- she always like to visit people.

158

00:09:56,790 --> 00:10:00,740 So when those other people came to talk to her, they had--

159

00:10:00,740 --> 00:10:05,770 when they came on a Sunday afternoon,

160 00:10:05,770 --> 00:10:08,240 and we didn't know their name.

161 00:10:08,240 --> 00:10:10,300 We didn't know where they lived. 00:10:10,300 --> 00:10:13,690 And she saw them and we told her this was

163

00:10:13,690 --> 00:10:17,120 the friends who would like you to see where they're living.

164

00:10:17,120 --> 00:10:19,670 See, they have no children.

165

00:10:19,670 --> 00:10:25,700 And she went with-- we took-- we went with her to the streetcar

166 00:10:25,700 --> 00:10:28,250 and we said goodbye like that.

167 00:10:28,250 --> 00:10:29,420 No kissing, nothing.

168 00:10:29,420 --> 00:10:32,670

169

00:10:32,670 --> 00:10:34,150 That comes afterwards.

170

00:10:34,150 --> 00:10:39,290 And this is very personal, and it's

171

00:10:39,290 --> 00:10:41,270 ridiculous to say that it's difficult

172

00:10:41,270 --> 00:10:44,350 because it never changes.

173 00:10:44,350 --> 00:10:47,790 It never changes for all those years.

00:10:47,790 --> 00:10:54,600 Because it was '45 before we saw her--

175

00:10:54,600 --> 00:10:56,068 before I saw her.

176 00:10:56,068 --> 00:10:58,820

177 00:10:58,820 --> 00:11:01,190 But you rescued her.

178 00:11:01,190 --> 00:11:03,380 In that way, I rescued her, yes.

179 00:11:03,380 --> 00:11:07,630 We rescued her-- my husband and I, we did so.

180 00:11:07,630 --> 00:11:09,410 There was no arguing about it.

181 00:11:09,410 --> 00:11:13,060 This was just one way to do if we want her to live.

182 00:11:13,060 --> 00:11:24,360

183 00:11:24,360 --> 00:11:28,250 I'd like you to describe for me what

184 00:11:28,250 --> 00:11:30,950 it was like to live in hiding.

185 00:11:30,950 --> 00:11:33,920 How restricted you were, how you felt, were you afraid.

186 00:11:33,920 --> 00:11:36,590 187 00:11:36,590 --> 00:11:37,680 To be in hiding?

188 00:11:37,680 --> 00:11:42,780 I don't think that anybody can be trained for that.

189

00:11:42,780 --> 00:11:48,370 Because every situation, since you are in people's homes,

190 00:11:48,370 --> 00:11:50,150 is different.

191

00:11:50,150 --> 00:11:55,510 So the first place where we were was a bungalow.

192

00:11:55,510 --> 00:11:59,290 We had downstairs, a young couple with two small children

193

00:11:59,290 --> 00:12:00,340 was living.

194

00:12:00,340 --> 00:12:03,550 And on the second floor, the mother of one of them.

195

00:12:03,550 --> 00:12:07,740 And she was alone and she cooked for us.

196

00:12:07,740 --> 00:12:12,540 And we had to bring beds, metal beds.

197

00:12:12,540 --> 00:12:14,460 We had to bring them there because they 198 00:12:14,460 --> 00:12:16,980 didn't have beds for us, and we were in the attic.

199 00:12:16,980 --> 00:12:20,240

200 00:12:20,240 --> 00:12:21,770 This was the situation.

201 00:12:21,770 --> 00:12:26,710 We came, and they were kind of primitive people,

202 00:12:26,710 --> 00:12:28,750 but they meant well.

203 00:12:28,750 --> 00:12:32,980 And since they got some money, that was helping them, too.

204 00:12:32,980 --> 00:12:40,900 But we would have stayed.

205 00:12:40,900 --> 00:12:44,140 There was really no connection to talk about

206 00:12:44,140 --> 00:12:45,740 with this is old--

207 00:12:45,740 --> 00:12:47,050 now, I say old lady.

208 00:12:47,050 --> 00:12:49,640 She wasn't as old as I am now.

209 00:12:49,640 --> 00:12:55,420 And she wasn't-- she wasn't interested that we were there. 00:12:55,420 --> 00:12:57,830 But it came then, though, [INAUDIBLE]

211

00:12:57,830 --> 00:12:59,560 that when there was a holiday and there

212

00:12:59,560 --> 00:13:02,830 was a little special meat or so available,

213

00:13:02,830 --> 00:13:04,820 that we didn't even get it.

214 00:13:04,820 --> 00:13:06,410 But that was not important.

215

00:13:06,410 --> 00:13:08,540 Important was that all of a sudden,

216

00:13:08,540 --> 00:13:14,510 they said to Joe Fisch that they cannot stand it anymore to have

217

00:13:14,510 --> 00:13:18,950 those two people around, and he has to get us out the same day

218 00:13:18,950 --> 00:13:21,740 and not the next.

219 00:13:21,740 --> 00:13:25,110 So Joe-- that was--

220 00:13:25,110 --> 00:13:27,120 Joe was a hard working man.

221 00:13:27,120 --> 00:13:27,900 He did this.

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00:13:27,900 --> 00:13:30,780 He found places sometimes.

223

00:13:30,780 --> 00:13:33,660 Not the right ones, and we only could stay there

224

00:13:33,660 --> 00:13:39,620 a day or two because the people who were hiding us got scared.

225

00:13:39,620 --> 00:13:43,520 Because there were so openly in the newspapers,

226 00:13:43,520 --> 00:13:48,110 he who hides Jews will

he who hides Jews will be treated like the Jews.

227

00:13:48,110 --> 00:13:51,170 It didn't say a word about killing or anything.

228 00:13:51,170 --> 00:13:57,210 Because at that time, we did not know what was happening.

229 00:13:57,210 --> 00:13:59,500 We did not know.

230 00:13:59,500 --> 00:14:07,520 It was known to the British and the American governments,

231

00:14:07,520 --> 00:14:11,670 but we, the people, did not know.

232 00:14:11,670 --> 00:14:17,460 And we came to places where we were very short, some of them

233 00:14:17,460 --> 00:14:20,580 maybe was four weeks, and then they got scared.

234

00:14:20,580 --> 00:14:23,070 And some of them was very, very lovely people.

235

00:14:23,070 --> 00:14:27,250 But they couldn't work anymore they were so much afraid.

236

00:14:27,250 --> 00:14:30,760 Until we got to Harlem.

237

00:14:30,760 --> 00:14:34,510 And we were there in a bungalow where

238

00:14:34,510 --> 00:14:38,754 there was a mother with three teenage daughters.

239

00:14:38,754 --> 00:14:42,520 It was nice and roomy building, and we

240

00:14:42,520 --> 00:14:46,470 had in the attic a small room.

241

00:14:46,470 --> 00:14:49,560 We were there for a long time till the end,

242

00:14:49,560 --> 00:14:52,530 until we were found.

243

00:14:52,530 --> 00:14:55,390 And we were very--

244

00:14:55,390 --> 00:14:58,630 you could be alone in our room.

00:14:58,630 --> 00:15:04,510 And my husband for the time we lived there, more than a year,

246

00:15:04,510 --> 00:15:11,110 he was writing 19 books all with a pencil.

247

00:15:11,110 --> 00:15:15,030 And in school-- this was blue school--

248

00:15:15,030 --> 00:15:18,250 blue school papers.

249

 $00:15:18,250 \rightarrow 00:15:22,380$ I have all those things, but there is not too much

250

00:15:22,380 --> 00:15:25,590 interest in there because he wrote only

251 00:15:25,590 --> 00:15:30,590 about what he would wish for the country, Holland.

252 00:15:30,590 --> 00:15:32,870 He felt very close to Holland.

253 00:15:32,870 --> 00:15:40,500 And the whole world, and the human--

254 00:15:40,500 --> 00:15:43,830 the humans, what they would do when the war was--

255 00:15:43,830 --> 00:15:45,750 when the war would be over.

256 00:15:45,750 --> 00:15:52,300 And he was sure already for

years that Germany would lose.

257

00:15:52,300 --> 00:15:55,810 And even when it looked uncertain times

258 00:15:55,810 --> 00:16:01,820 that it was impossible because they were, practically,

259

00:16:01,820 --> 00:16:04,040 in all of Germany, in all of Europe,

260 00:16:04,040 --> 00:16:06,920 every country besides two or three,

261 00:16:06,920 --> 00:16:09,560 we are not under the Germans.

262 00:16:09,560 --> 00:16:11,750 But he said the Germans will lose.

263 00:16:11,750 --> 00:16:19,140 And from this view out, he had articles about economics,

264 00:16:19,140 --> 00:16:24,200 about religions, about anything you can think of-- philosophy,

265 00:16:24,200 --> 00:16:25,820 form of philosophy.

266 00:16:25,820 --> 00:16:29,840 And how it was that the people who were helping us

267 00:16:29,840 --> 00:16:34,850 to get to the place that every two weeks, one came and he 268 00:16:34,850 --> 00:16:38,730 had a whole list of books he wanted for his writings.

269 00:16:38,730 --> 00:16:41,300 And they all came every two weeks

270 00:16:41,300 --> 00:16:46,370 when we also got our food slips.

271 00:16:46,370 --> 00:16:51,500 How much the food was for any person in Holland.

272 00:16:51,500 --> 00:16:53,240 How much they could have.

273 00:16:53,240 --> 00:16:57,540 And all the people who were underground

274 00:16:57,540 --> 00:17:02,630 were supported and were helped with those coupons.

275 00:17:02,630 --> 00:17:10,099 Because every month, the places where there were--

276 00:17:10,099 --> 00:17:13,710 where the people could pick it up themselves,

277 00:17:13,710 --> 00:17:16,790 they broke in and then took out what they needed.

278 00:17:16,790 --> 00:17:19,430 And it was every month another place.

279

 $00:17:19,430 \rightarrow 00:17:25,650$ And they never found who did this for more than two years.

280

00:17:25,650 --> 00:17:27,470 That's really remarkable.

281

00:17:27,470 --> 00:17:31,430 And the woman who had us there, she needed it.

282

00:17:31,430 --> 00:17:34,210 Otherwise, she couldn't have fed us at all.

283

00:17:34,210 --> 00:17:36,700 Because everything which was edible,

284

00:17:36,700 --> 00:17:42,910 everything, needed a piece of paper and a coupon.

285

00:17:42,910 --> 00:17:45,590 At that time, I was still smoking.

286

00:17:45,590 --> 00:17:47,740 And I was making from one cigarette,

287

00:17:47,740 --> 00:17:50,230 I think, three new ones.

288

00:17:50,230 --> 00:17:53,830 And so-- and I--

289 00:17:53,830 --> 00:17:56,350 we got a package, I think--

290 00:17:56,350 --> 00:17:59,810 my husband didn't smoke so it wasn't very nice of me

291 00:17:59,810 --> 00:18:02,290 that I was smoking in that little room.

292 00:18:02,290 --> 00:18:06,600 But I thought at that time, I couldn't live without smoking.

293 00:18:06,600 --> 00:18:10,850 And he was writing, and on the second floor

294 00:18:10,850 --> 00:18:13,160 was a woman who lived there with her mother.

295 00:18:13,160 --> 00:18:18,260 She was a seamstress, a very nice, very nice person.

296 00:18:18,260 --> 00:18:20,900 And I sat very often downstairs with her

297 00:18:20,900 --> 00:18:23,330 because she very seldom had clients.

298 00:18:23,330 --> 00:18:26,190 And when she knew when they would be coming.

299 00:18:26,190 --> 00:18:31,360 And I learned how to make, I think, seamless.

300 00:18:31,360 --> 00:18:33,760 But that was about all.

301 00:18:33,760 --> 00:18:37,070 She didn't let me do so much. 302 00:18:37,070 --> 00:18:43,146 What were the rescuers like, and why do you think they did it?

303 00:18:43,146 --> 00:18:43,940 What do you mean?

304

00:18:43,940 --> 00:18:46,450 People who hid you, what were they like?

305 00:18:46,450 --> 00:18:49,090 Were they all different kinds of people, and why

306

00:18:49,090 --> 00:18:50,200 do you think they did it?

307

00:18:50,200 --> 00:18:53,380 No, the others who were before we were in Harlem

308

00:18:53,380 --> 00:18:56,740 did not know where we were, naturally.

309

310 00:18:58,900 --> 00:19:06,130 The people in Harlem, this was a woman who told anybody.

311 00:19:06,130 --> 00:19:08,950 And I heard from the top floor always

312 00:19:08,950 --> 00:19:12,920 when people came with anything to do in the house 00:19:12,920 --> 00:19:16,210 that she told them that her husband had left her when

314

00:19:16,210 --> 00:19:17,860 her youngest child was a baby.

315

00:19:17,860 --> 00:19:21,100 The baby was in the meantime 15 years.

316

00:19:21,100 --> 00:19:23,920 But she told various, she had a hard life.

317

00:19:23,920 --> 00:19:25,570 I'm sure she did.

318

00:19:25,570 --> 00:19:27,890 She did it probably to get some money,

319

00:19:27,890 --> 00:19:33,400 but we didn't have to pay, I mean, outlandish amounts.

320

00:19:33,400 --> 00:19:38,560 But we paid about what she's spending a little bit more.

321

00:19:38,560 --> 00:19:40,390 So it was-- it was a very decent.

322

00:19:40,390 --> 00:19:42,130 But she-- but she needed it.

323 00:19:42,130 --> 00:19:46,510

324 00:19:46,510 --> 00:19:50,537 Was she afraid-- what was she risking by doing this?

325 00:19:50,537 --> 00:19:51,370 And was she afraid--

326 00:19:51,370 --> 00:19:51,910 No.

327 00:19:51,910 --> 00:19:55,720 Everybody thought-- everybody-and you can read about

328 00:19:55,720 --> 00:20:00,940 that the people who were hiding the Jews

329 00:20:00,940 --> 00:20:03,580 would be treated like the Jews.

330 00:20:03,580 --> 00:20:04,750 So they were scared.

331 00:20:04,750 --> 00:20:08,620 And the more things got bad for the Germans,

332 00:20:08,620 --> 00:20:12,490 the more they got against who were to take people in.

333 00:20:12,490 --> 00:20:17,450

334 00:20:17,450 --> 00:20:21,070 Political, we didn't talk much with--

335 00:20:21,070 --> 00:20:22,670 with this woman.

336 00:20:22,670 --> 00:20:24,140 There was not much interest. 337 00:20:24,140 --> 00:20:28,160 And then it was that she was a poor woman,

338

00:20:28,160 --> 00:20:31,840 and she had that house and she didn't belong to her.

339

00:20:31,840 --> 00:20:32,900 It was rented.

340

00:20:32,900 --> 00:20:36,470 But she made something on the rent from the people upstairs,

341

00:20:36,470 --> 00:20:37,700 and she got our money.

342

00:20:37,700 --> 00:20:41,180 And so she could get her children to--

343

00:20:41,180 --> 00:20:43,880 at least to high school.

344

00:20:43,880 --> 00:20:47,270 Did you know about persecutions in this period of time

345

00:20:47,270 --> 00:20:48,440 while you were hiding?

346 00:20:48,440 --> 00:20:50,070 No.

347 00:20:50,070 --> 00:20:54,230 We heard one story, and that was the saddest of all this.

348

00:20:54,230 --> 00:20:59,450 Joe Fisch, who had at that time, I think, 349 00:20:59,450 --> 00:21:02,720 three children and his wife was pregnant,

350 00:21:02,720 --> 00:21:05,780 he took people into his house when he had no other place

351 00:21:05,780 --> 00:21:07,490 anymore, and they wouldn't have--

352 00:21:07,490 --> 00:21:09,950 they wouldn't know where to go.

353 00:21:09,950 --> 00:21:13,430 And he had a man at that time--

354 00:21:13,430 --> 00:21:28,630 I think that must have been in July 1943, late

355 00:21:28,630 --> 00:21:31,990 '43, that he had a man in his house

356 00:21:31,990 --> 00:21:35,020 with all the other people and the children

357 00:21:35,020 --> 00:21:40,560 that he was from the Spanish war on the black list

358 00:21:40,560 --> 00:21:42,270 of the Germans.

359 00:21:42,270 --> 00:21:45,540 And he had for a few days no place to go.

360

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00:21:45,540 --> 00:21:48,280 He was from Holland, originally.

361 00:21:48,280 --> 00:21:49,920 And so he took him in.

362 00:21:49,920 --> 00:21:56,680 And that night they came and emptied the whole house.

363 00:21:56,680 --> 00:21:58,630 The neighbors took the children.

364 00:21:58,630 --> 00:22:01,450 But everybody else who was there,

365 00:22:01,450 --> 00:22:06,310 there was two people I knew very well.

366 00:22:06,310 --> 00:22:10,420 I had sent to Joe Fisch, if he would help them.

367

00:22:10,420 --> 00:22:13,870 They were there because they had no-- he had no other places.

368 00:22:13,870 --> 00:22:16,400 And that man and he and his wife,

369 00:22:16,400 --> 00:22:17,590 and they were brought to--

370 00:22:17,590 --> 00:22:22,200

371 00:22:22,200 --> 00:22:24,900 I don't know, they were brought to a person, I know. 372 00:22:24,900 --> 00:22:27,550 But when they found out that his wife was pregnant,

373 00:22:27,550 --> 00:22:29,520 they sent her home.

374

 $00:22:29,520 \rightarrow 00:22:34,730$ And the others, Joe came to the house and said from that,

375

00:22:34,730 --> 00:22:35,330 he lifts--

376 00:22:35,330 --> 00:22:38,200

377

00:22:38,200 --> 00:22:38,860 OK.

378 00:22:38,860 --> 00:22:41,830 Paint me a portrait of this man, Joe.

379

00:22:41,830 --> 00:22:47,740 Joe Fisch was like very many people are in Holland--

380 00:22:47,740 --> 00:22:53,170 white, blond hair, tall, husky guy.

381 00:22:53,170 --> 00:22:58,810 And this part of Holland where we found the friends,

382 00:22:58,810 --> 00:23:02,350 and we found most of the places where we could hide,

383 00:23:02,350 --> 00:23:05,050 and where he brought some of his people,

384

00:23:05,050 --> 00:23:08,140 and that was the churches.

385

00:23:08,140 --> 00:23:16,780 He was-- he was a carpenter starting out.

386

00:23:16,780 --> 00:23:23,080 But when I met him, he was already in connection

387

00:23:23,080 --> 00:23:24,310 with childrens--

388 00:23:24,310 --> 00:23:27,720

389 00:23:27,720 --> 00:23:31,770 all kinds of difficulties with childrens and the children.

390

00:23:31,770 --> 00:23:37,770 And he was-- he had some-a completely different job

391

00:23:37,770 --> 00:23:44,430 above his way what he originally went in schooling.

392 00:23:44 4

00:23:44,430 --> 00:23:48,810 And so he was--

393 00:23:48,810 --> 00:23:52,990 this church was quite liberal.

394 00:23:52,990 --> 00:23:56,500 And-- but they were not very rich.

395 00:23:56,500 --> 00:23:58,200 And he was not very rich.

396

00:23:58,200 --> 00:24:01,670 But he was a friend.

397

00:24:01,670 --> 00:24:05,480 He and his wife came very many times at night

398

00:24:05,480 --> 00:24:07,490 when you're not allowed to be on the street,

399

00:24:07,490 --> 00:24:11,720 and took things which were needed for our daughter,

400

00:24:11,720 --> 00:24:14,140 or which we would need when we can

401

00:24:14,140 --> 00:24:19,880 go to the first place, beds and linen, and all those things.

402

00:24:19,880 --> 00:24:23,740 We couldn't carry anything when we were going.

403

00:24:23,740 --> 00:24:28,650 When we were going, we had to take off the star

404

00:24:28,650 --> 00:24:30,720 and go by train.

405

00:24:30,720 --> 00:24:35,470 And that's a very obvious, very difficult

406

00:24:35,470 --> 00:24:37,780 because they were obviously looking for a younger 407 00:24:37,780 --> 00:24:42,340 man, that my husband was never asked for any identification

408 00:24:42,340 --> 00:24:44,650 because we had none.

409

00:24:44,650 --> 00:24:48,220 And everybody had to have identification.

410 00:24:48,220 --> 00:24:53,140 Joe was, for the people he helped, more than a father--

411 00:24:53,140 --> 00:24:54,910 more than a father.

412

00:24:54,910 --> 00:25:02,380 Because really, he had the best things in his mind

413

00:25:02,380 --> 00:25:03,520 what should be done.

414

00:25:03,520 --> 00:25:07,240 And when he was arrested, his best friend

415 00:25:07,240 --> 00:25:09,550 took over like nothing.

416 00:25:09,550 --> 00:25:13,330 In this best friend was the gardener of the City

417 00:25:13,330 --> 00:25:18,040 of Zan--Zandarn.

418 00:25:18,040 --> 00:25:22,150 And he had a library, and he brought --

419

00:25:22,150 --> 00:25:25,900 what we found out afterwards-- the books my husband wanted.

420 00:25:25,900 --> 00:25:28,160 He all had them at home.

421 00:25:28,160 --> 00:25:33,640 He had a tremendous library, and a very, very highly intelligent

422 00:25:33,640 --> 00:25:34,340 man.

423 00:25:34,340 --> 00:25:36,500 As I said, he came

every two weeks. 424 00:25:36,500 --> 00:25:39,340

And we were looking forward when he came, because he

425

00:25:39,340 --> 00:25:42,610 brought with him his--

426

00:25:42,610 --> 00:25:45,100 what he thought about what was going on.

427

00:25:45,100 --> 00:25:51,190 And he was also listening to the British BBC,

428

 $00:25:51,190 \rightarrow 00:25:57,790$ which was forbidden, because they would kill you.

429

00:25:57,790 --> 00:25:59,610 And then you'd know that you have 430 00:25:59,610 --> 00:26:02,910 left the radio on that station.

431

00:26:02,910 --> 00:26:06,390 And he told us everything-- everything--

432

00:26:06,390 --> 00:26:07,830 what he heard.

433

00:26:07,830 --> 00:26:15,270 And he was the first one who told us in July 1944,

434

00:26:15,270 --> 00:26:19,380 that by that time 1 and 1/2 or 2 million Jews

435

00:26:19,380 --> 00:26:21,150 had been killed in Auschwitz.

436 00:26:21,150 --> 00:26:22,620 We had no idea.

437

00:26:22,620 --> 00:26:25,230 We had never heard the name of Auschwitz.

438

00:26:25,230 --> 00:26:27,540 And I think practically all the people

439

00:26:27,540 --> 00:26:35,280 who had nothing to do with the Nazis or whatever didn't know.

440

00:26:35,280 --> 00:26:37,470 So-- but he told us that.

441 00:26:37,470 --> 00:26:42,120 That helped us later on to get a better Contact reference@ushmm.org for further information about this collection

442 00:26:42,120 --> 00:26:48,540 picture when we were arrested where we would be going.

443 00:26:48,540 --> 00:26:53,360 How many people did Joe rescue, do you think?

444 00:26:53,360 --> 00:26:56,650 I don't-- you see, only the ones I know.

445 00:26:56,650 --> 00:26:58,800 I'm sure he had many, many more.

446 00:26:58,800 --> 00:27:03,500

447 00:27:03,500 --> 00:27:04,880 How many?

448 00:27:04,880 --> 00:27:09,920 It's Doris and it's me and it is the friends in--

449 00:27:09,920 --> 00:27:14,840 I introduced him to who had three daughters,

450 00:27:14,840 --> 00:27:17,060 all three daughters-- no.

451 00:27:17,060 --> 00:27:18,020 Yeah.

452 00:27:18,020 --> 00:27:21,260 The third-- the oldest daughter was in his house

453 00:27:21,260 --> 00:27:26,810 when they were all arrested there.

454

00:27:26,810 --> 00:27:31,580 So the oldest daughter up to that point, she was--

455

00:27:31,580 --> 00:27:35,510 she was with him, and she was taken to Bergen-Belsen

456

00:27:35,510 --> 00:27:38,250 where she found her mother.

457

00:27:38,250 --> 00:27:43,290 And the mother and this daughter came along at least six months

458

00:27:43,290 --> 00:27:49,270 before the war was over and a changing of prisoners

459

00:27:49,270 --> 00:27:53,110 of Germany and Jews.

460

00:27:53,110 --> 00:27:56,530 Why do you think Joe was a rescuer?

461

00:27:56,530 --> 00:28:04,300 Now, he-- at first, he made us open the place to go and hide.

462

00:28:04,300 --> 00:28:07,410 We wouldn't have known anybody.

463

00:28:07,410 --> 00:28:10,470 Why do you think he did it?

464

00:28:10,470 --> 00:28:14,370 Oh, I know why, because he loved people. 00:28:14,370 --> 00:28:21,710 He was basically very, very good man.

466

00:28:21,710 --> 00:28:25,560 There was nothing wrong in any way to complain ever.

467

00:28:25,560 --> 00:28:31,470 He was a fantastic, hardworking man and loving man.

468

00:28:31,470 --> 00:28:35,290

469

00:28:35,290 --> 00:28:37,330 Was he risking not only his own--

470

00:28:37,330 --> 00:28:38,080 Oh, sure.

471 00:28:38,080 --> 00:28:38,950 --but his family?

472 00:28:38,950 --> 00:28:40,300 His family, too.

473

00:28:40,300 --> 00:28:43,900 But he's not the only one who did that for us.

474

00:28:43,900 --> 00:28:48,040 The family would have suffered already in the first days

475

00:28:48,040 --> 00:28:50,140 when they were arrested.

476

00:28:50,140 --> 00:28:54,880 But nothing would have happened to his wife and nothing did. Contact reference@ushmm.org for further information about this collection

477 00:28:54,880 --> 00:28:58,090 But he would-- you don't know when you do that.

478 00:28:58,090 --> 00:29:01,420 But I think he didn't even think about.

479

00:29:01,420 --> 00:29:06,280 We have other friends who risked everything.

480

00:29:06,280 --> 00:29:09,820 We did not come from this place, from him.

481

00:29:09,820 --> 00:29:11,450 They didn't know each other.

482

00:29:11,450 --> 00:29:14,740 We brought them together, and the two of them

483

00:29:14,740 --> 00:29:19,180 really did get more groups and different kind of people.

484

00:29:19,180 --> 00:29:23,950 The other man had all our belongings.

485

00:29:23,950 --> 00:29:26,920 The most important thing were our books.

486 00:29:26,920 --> 00:29:31,500

And he had clothes. 487 00:29:31,500 --> 00:29:34,530 The first thing you would

need if you have nothing.

488

00:29:34,530 --> 00:29:39,090 That's why my husband said, if he takes it, it will be right.

489

00:29:39,090 --> 00:29:43,210 Into so he had--

490

00:29:43,210 --> 00:29:47,010 he went and-- went when Joe was--

491

00:29:47,010 --> 00:29:51,510 Joe was arrested and was gone, he came in by himself

492

00:29:51,510 --> 00:29:54,240 to go every two weeks to my daughter, too.

493

00:29:54,240 --> 00:29:59,160 And in some way, he made our daughter his--

494 00:29:59,160 --> 00:30:01,880 a wonderful man.

495 00:30:01,880 --> 00:30:04,640 Did you have-- did you get news about your daughter

496 00:30:04,640 --> 00:30:06,230 while you were in hiding?

497 00:30:06,230 --> 00:30:07,820 Not personally.

498 00:30:07,820 --> 00:30:11,720 But everybody was there at least every two weeks sometimes.

499 00:30:11,720 --> 00:30:12,920 Yeah. 500 00:30:12,920 --> 00:30:14,060 Yes, we know.

501 00:30:14,060 --> 00:30:17,120 We got those pictures they had made.

502 00:30:17,120 --> 00:30:21,440 But we did not want any other contact.

503 00:30:21,440 --> 00:30:25,610 We had no contact only really before she was gone.

504 00:30:25,610 --> 00:30:30,140 And we did not want her ever to feel that she's

505 00:30:30,140 --> 00:30:31,880 homesick for her parents.

506 00:30:31,880 --> 00:30:33,430 She should forget it.

507 00:30:33,430 --> 00:30:35,720 And she did.

508 00:30:35,720 --> 00:30:40,670 That-- this is maybe one-- some of the reasons

509 00:30:40,670 --> 00:30:46,280 that she maybe forgot it for a long time, our relationship.

510 00:30:46,280 --> 00:30:49,430 And this is what we did.

511 00:30:49,430 --> 00:30:53,720 Because she would not call it that 512 00:30:53,720 --> 00:30:57,920 we saved her life at that time and much later.

513 00:30:57,920 --> 00:31:00,510 But what she called it abandoned.

514 00:31:00,510 --> 00:31:02,460 And she's not the only one.

515 00:31:02,460 --> 00:31:05,780 There's a very big literature about children

516 00:31:05,780 --> 00:31:09,300 who were brought by their parents to other people.

517 00:31:09,300 --> 00:31:11,570 They always said that they were abandoned.

518 00:31:11,570 --> 00:31:16,210

519 00:31:16,210 --> 00:31:19,830 Tell me about getting arrested.

520 00:31:19,830 --> 00:31:24,220 Oh, that came very suddenly and unexpected.

521 00:31:24,220 --> 00:31:27,700 Because the-- more than a year we were in that house,

522 00:31:27,700 --> 00:31:32,840 I was only one time out to get a tooth pulled at night. 00:31:32,840 --> 00:31:35,230 And the dentist was more excited than I was.

524 00:31:35,230 --> 00:31:37,700 He was shaking until he gets it.

525 00:31:37,700 --> 00:31:40,460 I don't know what he thought what he had to do with it.

526 00:31:40,460 --> 00:31:44,150 But anyway, we didn't get out, and we could hardly

527 00:31:44,150 --> 00:31:46,790 look out of the window.

528 00:31:46,790 --> 00:31:57,270 It was on a Friday morning, and it was the 25th of August,

529 00:31:57,270 --> 00:32:04,440 the same day that Paris was liberated by the Allies.

530 00:32:04,440 --> 00:32:06,830 We didn't know.

531 00:32:06,830 --> 00:32:09,920 But that was the day we were arrested.

532 00:32:09,920 --> 00:32:14,820 And we-- as I said, we lived on the top floor.

533 00:32:14,820 --> 00:32:17,460 And we heard a knock on the door--

534 00:32:17,460 --> 00:32:19,890 not a kick, a knock. 535 00:32:19,890 --> 00:32:21,930 And here were two men--

536 00:32:21,930 --> 00:32:23,340 not in uniform.

537 00:32:23,340 --> 00:32:26,310 I found out later on that there were two men downstairs

538 00:32:26,310 --> 00:32:29,250 on each side of the house.

539 00:32:29,250 --> 00:32:33,090 Those two men said that we were under arrest.

540 00:32:33,090 --> 00:32:34,350 They knew our names.

541 00:32:34,350 --> 00:32:37,320 Nobody in that house knew our names.

542 00:32:37,320 --> 00:32:42,830 And they would come in and they looked around.

543 00:32:42,830 --> 00:32:47,300 And then saw a picture of the last picture we got

544 00:32:47,300 --> 00:32:49,320 from our daughter on the wall.

545 00:32:49,320 --> 00:32:52,580 And one of them said, if this is your child,

546 00:32:52,580 --> 00:32:56,270 if you have other children in hiding,

547

00:32:56,270 --> 00:33:01,880 we suggest you take them with you, because you are brought--

548

00:33:01,880 --> 00:33:06,350 you will be brought to work and to take care of the children

549

00:33:06,350 --> 00:33:09,980 while the parents are working.

550

00:33:09,980 --> 00:33:15,770 And then we were both found out if we had any money on us.

551

00:33:15,770 --> 00:33:20,360 and we had money on us, but they didn't even find it.

552

00:33:20,360 --> 00:33:23,900 And they also said-- they looked in the drawers.

553

00:33:23,900 --> 00:33:28,550 We had very little clothes, just absolutely necessary.

554

00:33:28,550 --> 00:33:31,430 And they said, take cold--

555

00:33:31,430 --> 00:33:33,230 take winter clothes with you.

556

00:33:33,230 --> 00:33:35,720 Where you are going, it's very cold.

557

00:33:35,720 --> 00:33:37,850 Now, that was true. 00:33:37,850 --> 00:33:40,500 The other thing of the children were [? bad life. ?]

559 00:33:40,500 --> 00:33:41,000
