

Summary of Interview With Harold Ueoka (HHP)

Born in Lawo in 1916. His parents were from Japan. Served with the 526th artillery battalion. Was working in Honolulu before Pearl Harbor. There was no real discrimination before war, except for his summer job working for a plantation. He volunteered for the army when the war started.

Pearl Harbor attack - people ran and watched smoke and planes.

He was the head of the baseball team and four of the team decided to join. He felt that if he didn't volunteer he would shame the people in Hawaii.

When his unit was in Europe, his destination was where Hitler's home was. He saw the crematoriums at Dachau, and saw where people were shot.

During the war he heard from other soldiers what was going on in the camps.
