Chava Frajhof RG-50.106*0042

September 20, 1923 - born Chava Geister in Belzyce, Poland

1939 - Germans came to the town and used the synagogue as a stable

She would dress as an old woman or would hide in the wardrobe

Spring 1941 - 2 days before Passover family paid the Judenrat(Weissbrodt, Arbus.Kirschenbaum) who then gave the money to the Germans, to be assigned to work in Budzin. Old women and children on the transport were shot in a cemetery.

Worked as a seamstress. Appels. Father shot when someone else ran away.

1943 - went to Krasnik as a dressmaker was needed people from Krasnik would come, took letters back to her brother met Israel Frajhof, her future husband

Russians came, people separated and hid, met up with Israel

Went to Belzyce, then to Lublin

Married in Lublin, had son

Went to Frankfurt and Berlin

1953 - moved to join family in Brazil
