Wolfgang Mueller RG-50.106*0091

Born in Hanover, Germany on March 10, 1919

Father leader in Jewish community - head of B'nai B'rith

Aware of Nazis at an early stage - saw posters on kiosks denouncing Jews

Wouldn't 'Heil Hitler' in school - principal advised him to leave country

Summer after Bar Mitzvah went to London - 1932

Attended Ewell School - went back to Germany on vacations, pretended he was English

Went To Cranbrook School - tuition paid by Max Nordhaus, relative in US

Nordhaus advised him to leave and sent affidavit

Got visa - arrived in US July 26, 1936, went to relative in New Mexico

Sister and mother came over, heard about Kristallnacht

Drafted September 1941 - sent to Florida, volunteered to go overseas

In England, was Technical Supply Sergeant as a liaison with the RAF

After V-E Day worked in Air Technical Intelligence Office

Interrogated prisoners in Czechoslovakia and Austria, engineers at Zeiss works

In Nordhausen for 1 hour - saw tunnels, got V-2 documents, translated

Discharged January 11, 1947

Married, worked in meat business, real estate and wholesale fish company

Proud of being a Jew though trauma of being a Jew in Germany and his parent's

difficult marriage has hardened him

At dedication of Holocaust Museum, he couldn't believe that "we won."
