Born Romuald Gutter on December 26, 1926 in Sanok, Poland
Family in Poland for many generations
Grandfather had farm, father sold fertilizer
Anti-semitic teacher in school
War began - father taken away, no school
2 months later, family went to Rymanov and then to relatives in Lvov
Late1940 - Russians took him, mother and younger brother to train
Went to labor camp in Berezovsk in Ural mountains
Father taken to Japanese border for duration of war

Went to high school, mother cut down trees and worked in a bakery

After graduation he worked sewing uniforms and repaired sewing machines

End of war - father joined them in the Ural mountains

Early 1946 - went to DP camp Neu-Ulm in Germany

Sailed to Israel in 1948 - fought in War of Independence worked as a civilian for IDF repairing trucks married in 1959

Late 1959 - Sailed to US

Worked in electronics, opened up hearing aid business Has 2 children

Feels no connection to Poland, wanted Eichmann to get the death sentence Upset at President Reagan's trip to Bitburg Remembering his experiences is very painful
