- 3 00:00:03,770 --> 00:00:07,720 You were talking about standing in a field with people
- 4 00:00:07,720 --> 00:00:10,620 with guns.
- 00:00:10,620 --> 00:00:13,172 Can you repeat that to make sure sure we get all in?
- 6 00:00:13,172 --> 00:00:15,400 Thousands of people, one next to the other,
- 7 00:00:15,400 --> 00:00:18,940 on a very cold night.
- 8 00:00:18,940 --> 00:00:22,720 I remember wearing lots of underpanties,
- 9 00:00:22,720 --> 00:00:28,200 I can't count how many, and why that was, I don't know.
- 10 00:00:28,200 --> 00:00:29,920 We were not told.
- 11 00:00:29,920 --> 00:00:32,720 And we were surrounded by machine guns
- 12 00:00:32,720 --> 00:00:37,030 and were supposed to

be shot, all of us,

13 00:00:37,030 --> 00:00:41,740 and then supposedly the word that, this is it.

14 00:00:41,740 --> 00:00:43,960 And then they canceled that.

15 00:00:43,960 --> 00:00:46,930

16 00:00:46,930 --> 00:00:51,760 And I made it again.

17 00:00:51,760 --> 00:00:54,675 So you actually have memories of that time?

18 00:00:54,675 --> 00:00:56,890 Of that time standing there, yes, I

19 00:00:56,890 --> 00:01:00,850 could find my way around there and where that was here.

20 00:01:00,850 --> 00:01:03,880 And of course my grandmother, she

21 00:01:03,880 --> 00:01:07,330 passed in the concentration camp where the bread

22 00:01:07,330 --> 00:01:08,800 was delivered one day.

23 00:01:08,800 --> 00:01:10,560 And the dead people where the others, 00:01:10,560 --> 00:01:12,610 they were thrown in the water there.

25

00:01:12,610 --> 00:01:14,320 They were not buried.

26

00:01:14,320 --> 00:01:18,850 And my mother felt for the rest of her life, really bad.

27

00:01:18,850 --> 00:01:22,600 That was very hurtful to her.

28

00:01:22,600 --> 00:01:26,257 So your grandmother died in the--

29

00:01:26,257 --> 00:01:27,340 In the concentration camp.

30

00:01:27,340 --> 00:01:28,390 In Theresienstadt.

31

00:01:28,390 --> 00:01:31,720 That was my mom's mom, and my dad's mom

32

00:01:31,720 --> 00:01:34,510 died shortly before I was born.

33

00:01:34,510 --> 00:01:36,010 But I'm just saying your grandmother

34

00:01:36,010 --> 00:01:37,050 died Theresienstadt.

35

00:01:37,050 --> 00:01:39,040

In Theresienstadt, yes.

36

00:01:39,040 --> 00:01:41,355

Her name was [? Phillipina ?] Goodman.

37 00:01:41,355 --> 00:01:42,550 OK.

38 00:01:42,550 --> 00:01:47,125 What about clothes, did you have enough warm clothes

39 00:01:47,125 --> 00:01:50,560 No, whatever they gave us, whether it was mine or not

40 00:01:50,560 --> 00:01:54,400 necessarily, whatever these people gave us.

41 00:01:54,400 --> 00:01:57,730 We became this nothing, no suitcases, no anything,

42 00:01:57,730 --> 00:02:00,880 no warm clothes, whatever they want.

43 00:02:00,880 --> 00:02:06,080 I did have some mumps while there.

44 00:02:06,080 --> 00:02:11,320 And I do remember my neck being swollen,

45 00:02:11,320 --> 00:02:14,860 and they put some brown smelly cream on me

46 00:02:14,860 --> 00:02:18,290 which did not seem to help.

47 00:02:18,290 --> 00:02:22,480 And then they put me on a table, not in a hospital,

48 00:02:22,480 --> 00:02:24,670 there was not such a thing there.

49 00:02:24,670 --> 00:02:29,620 On the table, and they cut, to make a cut, then you could--

50 00:02:29,620 --> 00:02:34,120 quite a cut, several inches on the side of my neck,

51 00:02:34,120 --> 00:02:41,830 and whatever, and that took care of, remedied the situation.

52 00:02:41,830 --> 00:02:45,140 And what's the sedation, or what it was, I do not--

53 00:02:45,140 --> 00:02:48,430 I was all by myself.

54 00:02:48,430 --> 00:02:52,120 Whatever they done then-- what could we say?

55 00:02:52,120 --> 00:02:55,540 Being dumb, uneducated, and whatever

56 00:02:55,540 --> 00:03:00,130 was done to us, whether you were young or old,

57 00:03:00,130 --> 00:03:01,750 you had to submit to.

58 00:03:01,750 --> 00:03:03,300 No choice. 59

00:03:03,300 --> 00:03:06,310 So do you remember talking to the other children at all?

60

00:03:06,310 --> 00:03:08,830

61

00:03:08,830 --> 00:03:11,170 I'm sure I did.

62

00:03:11,170 --> 00:03:14,410 I was shy by nature in that situation.

63

00:03:14,410 --> 00:03:17,920 Being away from my family, and was a little spoiled,

64

00:03:17,920 --> 00:03:19,725 being an only child.

65

00:03:19,725 --> 00:03:21,587 Right.

66

00:03:21,587 --> 00:03:24,880 My mom said when I came to visit her

67

00:03:24,880 --> 00:03:29,660 I would put my hands and fingers into her neck to be with her,

68

00:03:29,660 --> 00:03:33,550 but she had to leave, she couldn't stay.

69

00:03:33,550 --> 00:03:36,730 I'm sure I was affected by that.

70

00:03:36,730 --> 00:03:42,250

Growing up, I was pretty reserved and shy

71 00:03:42,250 --> 00:03:43,630 for quite some time.

72 00:03:43,630 --> 00:03:46,780 It has worn off after the years, thank goodness.

73 00:03:46,780 --> 00:03:50,095

74 00:03:50,095 --> 00:03:52,990 Were you as a strong child, physically,

75 00:03:52,990 --> 00:03:54,370 or were you delicate?

76 00:03:54,370 --> 00:03:57,302 How would you describe yourself at that age?

77 00:03:57,302 --> 00:03:57,820 No.

78 00:03:57,820 --> 00:04:04,560 I was, I remember after the war being not a very strong child,

79 00:04:04,560 --> 00:04:09,690 plagued by colds very much, and put under X-ray machines

80 00:04:09,690 --> 00:04:16,339 for my swollen tonsils repeatedly afterwards.

81 00:04:16,339 --> 00:04:19,540 And now, of course, I am very much aware, not more than

82 00:04:19,540 --> 00:04:20,950 absolutely necessary.

83 00:04:20,950 --> 00:04:22,040 I had enough of it.

84 00:04:22,040 --> 00:04:25,060 That was a very in them days of finding out,

85 00:04:25,060 --> 00:04:28,210 and they did not, of course, know the harmful effects which

86 00:04:28,210 --> 00:04:33,480 were much more harmful, the X-rays [INAUDIBLE]

87 00:04:33,480 --> 00:04:36,617 than they are today.

88 00:04:36,617 --> 00:04:40,320 So what other memories do you have of Theresienstadt

89 00:04:40,320 --> 00:04:42,880 that you can talk about?

90 00:04:42,880 --> 00:04:48,170 Then when they came to visit, the SS people and the head

91 00:04:48,170 --> 00:04:48,670 person--

92 00:04:48,670 --> 00:04:51,510 Rahm supposedly was his name--

93 00:04:51,510 --> 00:04:54,760 he would come and there was a nice children's playground

94 00:04:54,760 --> 00:04:56,920 which we never got to play with.

95 00:04

00:04:56,920 --> 00:04:57,940

But he went there.

96

00:04:57,940 --> 00:04:59,250

It's a gate.

97

00:04:59,250 --> 00:05:01,670 It was the entrance to the town.

98

00:05:01,670 --> 00:05:05,630 And then he came in and said--

99

00:05:05,630 --> 00:05:08,310 Uncle Rahm was his name.

100

00:05:08,310 --> 00:05:10,460 We have to eat again sardines.

101

00:05:10,460 --> 00:05:11,900 Well, we never got sardines.

102

00:05:11,900 --> 00:05:14,770 It was just something they told us to do

103

00:05:14,770 --> 00:05:19,340 when the camp was inspected.

104

00:05:19,340 --> 00:05:22,550 But other than hanging around from day-to-day

105

00:05:22,550 --> 00:05:30,240 and having no knowledge of anything, it just passed by--

106

00:05:30,240 --> 00:05:34,850 and being really happy when I could see my parents.

107 00:05:34,850 --> 00:05:35,350 Right.

108 00:05:35,350 --> 00:05:38,090

109 00:05:38,090 --> 00:05:41,920 Do you remember snow, with the bad weather times at all?

110 00:05:41,920 --> 00:05:42,480 I did.

111 00:05:42,480 --> 00:05:44,210 I do.

112 00:05:44,210 --> 00:05:47,310 Many of my memories, and this I'm sure

113 00:05:47,310 --> 00:05:51,237 has to do that, you kind of want to shut down--

114 00:05:51,237 --> 00:05:53,540 Yes, yes.

115 00:05:53,540 --> 00:05:56,460 Things that are not very pleasant.

116 00:05:56,460 --> 00:06:00,090 I think that has a lot to do it.

117 00:06:00,090 --> 00:06:04,805 But of course after the war I had really vivid memories.

118 00:06:04,805 --> 00:06:07,880 Well, we can talk about that later. 119 00:06:07,880 --> 00:06:10,310 So what happened there, it's not,

120

00:06:10,310 --> 00:06:19,590 but when it was over, on our way home, it was on buses--

121

00:06:19,590 --> 00:06:21,300 Let's get to that in a minute.

122

00:06:21,300 --> 00:06:23,630 I just want to talk a little more about Theresienstadt,

123

00:06:23,630 --> 00:06:28,010 about if you have any other memories, any other incidents

124

00:06:28,010 --> 00:06:30,952 that happened while you were there?

125

00:06:30,952 --> 00:06:34,940 Nothing's a [INAUDIBLE] test.

126

00:06:34,940 --> 00:06:40,250 Not eventful or anything, but just being--

127

00:06:40,250 --> 00:06:43,260 For three years.

128

00:06:43,260 --> 00:06:47,120 Exactly according to my mom, 32 months.

129

00:06:47,120 --> 00:06:51,630 Of course no holiday, a birthday celebration, or anything,

130

00:06:51,630 --> 00:06:56,150

the days went by one like the next.

131

00:06:56,150 --> 00:06:58,985 Do you remember the Red Cross coming to visit?

132

00:06:58,985 --> 00:07:04,730 No, no knowledge of that, nor did

133

00:07:04,730 --> 00:07:07,410 I hear that from my parents.

134

00:07:07,410 --> 00:07:07,910 No.

135

00:07:07,910 --> 00:07:10,745

136

00:07:10,745 --> 00:07:12,937 Do you remember what state your mother was in,

137

00:07:12,937 --> 00:07:15,020 or your father, when they would come to visit you?

138

00:07:15,020 --> 00:07:18,320 Were they very emotional or were more reserved?

139

00:07:18,320 --> 00:07:19,575 Or do you have any memories?

140

00:07:19,575 --> 00:07:22,130 They were very happy to see me, having me only,

141

00:07:22,130 --> 00:07:23,660

it means even more.

142

00:07:23,660 --> 00:07:26,720 One child, and then my dad was on in years.

143 00:07:26,720 --> 00:07:31,700 My mom and dad were married 14 years till they

144 00:07:31,700 --> 00:07:34,560 were lucky enough to have me.

145 00:07:34,560 --> 00:07:35,515 Oh my!

146 00:07:35,515 --> 00:07:39,270 So my dad was about 50, 51 and my mom 36.

147 00:07:39,270 --> 00:07:43,190

148 00:07:43,190 --> 00:07:44,590 When you were born?

149 00:07:44,590 --> 00:07:45,890 When I was born.

150 00:07:45,890 --> 00:07:49,425

151 00:07:49,425 --> 00:07:53,450 Because they were married for about 14 years before I

152 00:07:53,450 --> 00:07:56,330 was born, couldn't have any children, nothing was done.

153 00:07:56,330 --> 00:07:57,980 It finally happened.

154 00:07:57,980 --> 00:08:01,712 But of course they wanted children,

155

00:08:01,712 --> 00:08:04,340 but that's how it was and the age difference is

156

00:08:04,340 --> 00:08:07,325 because my dad was married to my mom's sister for seven years.

157

00:08:07,325 --> 00:08:08,720 You said that.

158

00:08:08,720 --> 00:08:12,440 And then he was in the family and stayed in the family.

159

00:08:12,440 --> 00:08:15,490 And my mom was a good-looking woman.

160

00:08:15,490 --> 00:08:20,390 And so that's how that happened.

161

00:08:20,390 --> 00:08:23,330 So what I wanted to bring up is my dad.

162

00:08:23,330 --> 00:08:26,180 He was [INAUDIBLE] perhaps at that age

163

00:08:26,180 --> 00:08:32,240 when people are more mature, children even more meaningful

164

00:08:32,240 --> 00:08:35,030 than when you are young and especially

165

00:08:35,030 --> 00:08:42,680 after they had been through

all that, it means much more.

166 00:08:42,680 --> 00:08:45,740 You had said you had said that he did not

167 00:08:45,740 --> 00:08:48,010 want to talk about what he had been through.

168 00:08:48,010 --> 00:08:51,350 After the war, not in my presence.

169 00:08:51,350 --> 00:08:52,550 Not in my presence.

170 00:08:52,550 --> 00:08:55,530 My mom didn't say anything about that.

171 00:08:55,530 --> 00:09:00,320 But my dad did not want them, my mom and dad together,

172 00:09:00,320 --> 00:09:02,550 or others to talk.

173 00:09:02,550 --> 00:09:06,560 But he couldn't force others but together,

174 00:09:06,560 --> 00:09:10,970 no mention about that time at all.

175 00:09:10,970 --> 00:09:13,340 Do you know what he did in Theresienstadt?

176 00:09:13,340 --> 00:09:15,975 Your mother was in the children's home. 177

00:09:15,975 --> 00:09:17,990 If he do, and he didn't do and--

178

00:09:17,990 --> 00:09:19,425 He wasn't well.

179

00:09:19,425 --> 00:09:21,890 He walked on a cane.

180

00:09:21,890 --> 00:09:28,330 He was a little humped over for the pain which increasingly

181

00:09:28,330 --> 00:09:30,060 got worse and worse.

182

00:09:30,060 --> 00:09:34,790 He finally was, after the war, confined to a wheelchair.

183

00:09:34,790 --> 00:09:37,370

184

00:09:37,370 --> 00:09:43,345 And we get to that after, how that situation--

185

00:09:43,345 --> 00:09:44,720 Is there anything else you wanted

186

00:09:44,720 --> 00:09:47,840 to say about being in Theresienstadt

187

00:09:47,840 --> 00:09:51,530 that you haven't mentioned yet?

188

00:09:51,530 --> 00:09:57,770 If you want to [INAUDIBLE] a time in the camp,

189 00:09:57,770 --> 00:10:02,510 it was really not eventful.

190 00:10:02,510 --> 00:10:06,340 We were separated, living from day to day.

191 00:10:06,340 --> 00:10:09,260 Nothing happened.

192 00:10:09,260 --> 00:10:13,910 As I said the dangers of it, my parents

193 00:10:13,910 --> 00:10:17,750 knew about more than I did and my father as they

194 00:10:17,750 --> 00:10:20,090 said they're selling their wedding bands

195 00:10:20,090 --> 00:10:27,590 and giving all the money to save me a little luck plate

196 00:10:27,590 --> 00:10:33,500 invisible also then I was not taken to the gas chambers.

197 00:10:33,500 --> 00:10:35,682 When they first wanted to.

198 00:10:35,682 --> 00:10:40,220 When you left Frankfurt to go to Theresienstadt,

199 00:10:40,220 --> 00:10:42,725 do you know if you took anything special with you? 00:10:42,725 --> 00:10:44,120 You were very young.

201

00:10:44,120 --> 00:10:46,700 You were five.

202

00:10:46,700 --> 00:10:48,740 Any toys or anything like that?

203

00:10:48,740 --> 00:10:51,800 Not that I remember.

204

00:10:51,800 --> 00:10:53,750 Of course you were limited.

205

00:10:53,750 --> 00:10:56,350 We had to leave already in [PLACE NAME] inside everything

206

00:10:56,350 --> 00:10:57,710 when we went to Frankfurt.

207

00:10:57,710 --> 00:10:59,690 We always had to leave everything.

208

00:10:59,690 --> 00:11:01,345 We couldn't sell or do anything.

209

00:11:01,345 --> 00:11:04,365 So you didn't have a special toy or anything with you?

210

00:11:04,365 --> 00:11:06,340 Not that I remember that.

211

00:11:06,340 --> 00:11:09,655 Only I do remember the Italian bread.

212

00:11:09,655 --> 00:11:12,310 They called it

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[INAUDIBLE],, which

213

00:11:12,310 --> 00:11:22,915 is the smoked sausage that doesn't need refrigeration.

214

00:11:22,915 --> 00:11:25,040 It was very fatty, and the taste of it,

215

00:11:25,040 --> 00:11:27,710 the salt, and the spices.

216

00:11:27,710 --> 00:11:30,650 I seemed to like it so I would tell my mother,

217

00:11:30,650 --> 00:11:35,920 I don't like the apartment but I do like the food here.

218

00:11:35,920 --> 00:11:38,907 So that is something I liked for a few days,

219

00:11:38,907 --> 00:11:39,740 they still had that.

220

00:11:39,740 --> 00:11:42,755 And of course, they take it from me.

221

00:11:42,755 --> 00:11:46,900 So aside from the mumps that you had, your health was with

222

00:11:46,900 --> 00:11:50,430 was pretty good in Theresienstadt?

223

00:11:50,430 --> 00:11:57,780

Well, a few colds, but nothing that stands out.

224

00:11:57,780 --> 00:11:59,240 I was malnourished, of course.

225

00:11:59,240 --> 00:12:02,210

226

00:12:02,210 --> 00:12:08,150 But I did no activity, no nothing,

227

00:12:08,150 --> 00:12:10,880 just an existence [INAUDIBLE].

228

00:12:10,880 --> 00:12:14,000 Do you remember feeling hungry all the time?

229

00:12:14,000 --> 00:12:15,110 No, I was never hungry.

230

00:12:15,110 --> 00:12:18,200 I never wanted to eat.

231

00:12:18,200 --> 00:12:20,780 That was not my favorite pastime.

232

00:12:20,780 --> 00:12:22,610 And did you see people who were dead?

233

00:12:22,610 --> 00:12:24,365 Did you ever--

234

00:12:24,365 --> 00:12:30,880 About my mom, after told me that the dead people,

235

00:12:30,880 --> 00:12:32,880

120 on the attic.

236

00:12:32,880 --> 00:12:37,800 They were kept there for a while next us

237

00:12:37,800 --> 00:12:40,100 till finally removed them.

238

00:12:40,100 --> 00:12:42,440 And my grandmother was put on the wagon

239

00:12:42,440 --> 00:12:47,100 where they transported bread on, to be thrown in the river.

240

00:12:47,100 --> 00:12:50,180 But this is stories I have heard.

241

00:12:50,180 --> 00:12:51,360 I was too young.

242

00:12:51,360 --> 00:12:51,860 Too young.

243

00:12:51,860 --> 00:12:55,460 And especially since I lacked the education and all that.

244

00:12:55,460 --> 00:13:00,310 I wasn't aware of any of these.

245

00:13:00,310 --> 00:13:04,920 Let's now move on to the next chapter,

246

00:13:04,920 --> 00:13:07,770 which is how did you know that you were going

247

00:13:07,770 --> 00:13:09,560 to be leaving Theresienstadt?

248 00:13:09,560 --> 00:13:12,600 What was the next big change for you?

249

00:13:12,600 --> 00:13:15,710 Well, I was not--

250

00:13:15,710 --> 00:13:20,700 I did what I was told to do, and along with my parents

251

00:13:20,700 --> 00:13:26,870 on a big bus we left [PLACE NAME] to Frankfurt.

252

00:13:26,870 --> 00:13:30,650 So what did that mean to an eight-- you're now

253

00:13:30,650 --> 00:13:32,237 eight years old, right?

254

00:13:32,237 --> 00:13:33,245 Right.

255

00:13:33,245 --> 00:13:34,730 What did what did

that mean to you?

256

00:13:34,730 --> 00:13:36,530 You were back with your parents.

257

00:13:36,530 --> 00:13:40,970 I was back with my parents, which was very important,

258

00:13:40,970 --> 00:13:42,035 of course.

259

00:13:42,035 --> 00:13:43,950 Absolutely.

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260 00:13:43,950 --> 00:13:47,870 And upon arriving there, I do vaguely remember--

261

00:13:47,870 --> 00:13:50,460 I think Kolb was his name--

262

00:13:50,460 --> 00:13:54,260 K-O-L-B, if I remember right.

263

00:13:54,260 --> 00:13:56,540 He was the mayor of Frankfurt, and he

264

00:13:56,540 --> 00:14:01,850 treated the bus of survivors somewhere there

265

00:14:01,850 --> 00:14:06,170 with tulips, a bunch of tulips.

266

00:14:06,170 --> 00:14:07,460 And my mom came back.

267

00:14:07,460 --> 00:14:10,250 She didn't have a pair of underpants

268

00:14:10,250 --> 00:14:13,310 to wear under her dress [INAUDIBLE]

269

00:14:13,310 --> 00:14:16,640 And we were fed and taken care of.

270

00:14:16,640 --> 00:14:20,190 We were then taken--

271

00:14:20,190 --> 00:14:24,958 Do you know what month you left Theresienstadt in '45?

272

00:14:24,958 --> 00:14:26,390

No.

273

00:14:26,390 --> 00:14:30,170

I don't want to just take a wild guess,

274

00:14:30,170 --> 00:14:32,970 but I cannot tell you that.

275

00:14:32,970 --> 00:14:35,240

OK, so now you're in Frankfurt.

276

00:14:35,240 --> 00:14:36,590 Now we were in Frankfurt.

277

00:14:36,590 --> 00:14:37,610

For how long?

278

00:14:37,610 --> 00:14:38,750

A short time.

279

00:14:38,750 --> 00:14:42,060

Whether it was days or weeks, I do not know.

280

 $00:14:42,060 \longrightarrow 00:14:45,930$

We were transported to [? Kurtbaden, ?]

281

00:14:45,930 --> 00:14:51,230 which was a hospital with different things like schools,

282

00:14:51,230 --> 00:14:55,580

the empty one being for the Holocaust survivors.

283

00:14:55,580 --> 00:14:59,610

And they housed us

there for 10 months.

284

00:14:59,610 --> 00:15:02,160 It was part of the

hospital because they

285

00:15:02,160 --> 00:15:06,720 didn't know what to do with us.

286

00:15:06,720 --> 00:15:12,630 I was frequently with sickness, plagued by colds, especially

287

00:15:12,630 --> 00:15:14,910 the tonsils, and as I mentioned before,

288

00:15:14,910 --> 00:15:17,060 the X-rays and all that.

289

00:15:17,060 --> 00:15:20,790 And I was finally free and could go outside.

290

00:15:20,790 --> 00:15:27,860 And the people there, talking, and on holidays,

201

00:15:27,860 --> 00:15:33,570 trying to make it a little festive and all that.

292

00:15:33,570 --> 00:15:38,520 So after the 10 months we went back to Frankfurt

293

00:15:38,520 --> 00:15:43,200 and they made available a wing that

294

00:15:43,200 --> 00:15:48,210

was a hospital before the war, was mostly 295 00:15:48,210 --> 00:15:52,920 destroyed but a half of a round building

296

00:15:52,920 --> 00:15:56,580 was made available for all the survivors.

297

00:15:56,580 --> 00:16:02,100 And I go up there, it was called an old people's home,

298

00:16:02,100 --> 00:16:03,330 translated.

299

00:16:03,330 --> 00:16:07,900 It was in [? Stagenstrasse ?] even,

300

00:16:07,900 --> 00:16:10,530 what's her name, not Susan, the other lady

301

00:16:10,530 --> 00:16:16,660 that was a pediatrician, that is friends with Susan--

302

00:16:16,660 --> 00:16:18,990 Ilsa Nussbaum.

303

00:16:18,990 --> 00:16:21,030 They came from [PLACE NAME],, too.

304

00:16:21,030 --> 00:16:23,980 She came to visit us.

305

00:16:23,980 --> 00:16:31,140 And we stayed there till I almost

306

00:16:31,140 --> 00:16:33,060 left for the United States.

307

00:16:33,060 --> 00:16:34,800 We were fed there.

308

00:16:34,800 --> 00:16:37,120 The government supported us.

309

310

00:16:41,610 --> 00:16:45,240 and it was called an old age home, translated.

311

00:16:45,240 --> 00:16:48,020 I grew up with people 80 years old.

312

00:16:48,020 --> 00:16:51,780 I was the youngest there, the only one.

313

00:16:51,780 --> 00:16:54,330 I learned to play craps from them,

314

00:16:54,330 --> 00:16:58,220 and learned of mood swings and what makes people tick.

315

00:16:58,220 --> 00:17:00,610 And I learned a lot.

316

00:17:00,610 --> 00:17:03,330 I went into school.

317

00:17:03,330 --> 00:17:06,990 I was going to ask, when did you start school?

318

00:17:06,990 --> 00:17:10,510 When did you first start schooling?

319

00:17:10,510 --> 00:17:13,540 Approximately the age 8 and a half years

320

00:17:13,540 --> 00:17:18,040 when I learned to write my name and all that.

321

00:17:18,040 --> 00:17:23,790 And I did not have anything to put my books,

322

00:17:23,790 --> 00:17:27,089 nor did I have a pencil.

323

00:17:27,089 --> 00:17:35,740 So it was given to me, it was a pocket book really,

324

00:17:35,740 --> 00:17:39,070 and not suited to the school but that's all I had.

325

00:17:39,070 --> 00:17:41,910 Then somebody was nice enough to give me

326

00:17:41,910 --> 00:17:44,050 a pencil because we had no money,

327

00:17:44,050 --> 00:17:48,300 and so we couldn't go to the store and do anything.

328

00:17:48,300 --> 00:17:54,180 And we were living there in one room, my parents and me. 329

00:17:54,180 --> 00:17:58,770 And the exterminator had to come frequently, because there

330

00:17:58,770 --> 00:18:02,220 was bedbugs in there.

331

00:18:02,220 --> 00:18:04,470 And they took care of us.

332

00:18:04,470 --> 00:18:07,440 But I went to school.

333

00:18:07,440 --> 00:18:11,870 The adjustment was not that easy,

334

00:18:11,870 --> 00:18:15,140 but reluctantly I made it.

335

00:18:15,140 --> 00:18:18,510 At home I was happy even without these things

336

00:18:18,510 --> 00:18:23,360 because I felt always cared for and loved.

337

00:18:23,360 --> 00:18:28,110 But after several years in school,

338

00:18:28,110 --> 00:18:31,950 my parents were wise enough to realize

339

00:18:31,950 --> 00:18:36,220 that it was possible to send me to a private school.

340

00:18:36,220 --> 00:18:40,970 The schools were pretty much

destroyed during the war.

341

00:18:40,970 --> 00:18:45,250 A private school with less children in the class.

342

00:18:45,250 --> 00:18:47,670 And so I could get a better education

343

00:18:47,670 --> 00:18:50,090 and I was always older than the others.

344

00:18:50,090 --> 00:18:53,560 They started school at the age of six.

345

00:18:53,560 --> 00:18:57,300

346

00:18:57,300 --> 00:19:02,130 I was able to go with a little money we had saved to send me

347

00:19:02,130 --> 00:19:09,360 to a private school, which one they had to pay for of course.

348

00:19:09,360 --> 00:19:11,580 And I was very happy there.

349

00:19:11,580 --> 00:19:13,830 I did really well.

350

00:19:13,830 --> 00:19:17,490 Was it nearby?

351

00:19:17,490 --> 00:19:22,810 No, I had to take what's called a straßenbahn.

352

00:19:22,810 --> 00:19:28,440 It's not a subway, but it's above ground, streetcar.

353 00:19:28,440 --> 00:19:31,440 I had to change in the middle of the town.

354

00:19:31,440 --> 00:19:35,805 It took me about a half an hour to get there.

355

00:19:35,805 --> 00:19:37,950 This is still in Frankfurt?

356

00:19:37,950 --> 00:19:42,180 In Frankfurt, it was a private all girls school.

357

00:19:42,180 --> 00:19:44,590 And I made good progress.

358

00:19:44,590 --> 00:19:45,640 I was happy.

359

00:19:45,640 --> 00:19:47,690 I was a good student.

360

00:19:47,690 --> 00:19:55,560 I jumped twice over classes because I was always the oldest

361

00:19:55,560 --> 00:19:58,180 due to circumstances.

362

00:19:58,180 --> 00:20:03,830 And I did graduate number one in my class.

363

00:20:03,830 --> 00:20:06,720 Were the other students
Jewish students?

364

00:20:06,720 --> 00:20:07,760 No.

365

00:20:07,760 --> 00:20:12,510

I was the only

Jewish person there.

366

00:20:12,510 --> 00:20:14,850

No Jewish students.

367

00:20:14,850 --> 00:20:18,970

First of all, the Jewish people were all killed supposedly,

368

00:20:18,970 --> 00:20:22,350

according to my mom.

369

 $00:20:22,350 \longrightarrow 00:20:24,810$

I mean you must

know that better.

370

00:20:24,810 --> 00:20:27,360

I am probably the--

371

00:20:27,360 --> 00:20:32,940

or one of the youngest survivors

from the concentration camp.

372

 $00:20:32,940 \longrightarrow 00:20:36,570$

And supposedly one

of five families

373

00:20:36,570 --> 00:20:40,380

where mother and

children that came out

374

 $00:20:40,380 \longrightarrow 00:20:45,740$

of a concentration camp

without losing any one

of the close family members.

376 00:20:49,185 --> 00:20:53,400 And the people there help me in the beginning

377 00:20:53,400 --> 00:20:56,820 with homework and all that.

378 00:20:56,820 --> 00:21:01,230 My parents were-- my father's condition got worse,

379 00:21:01,230 --> 00:21:06,870 of course, that he had to go be in a wheelchair.

380 00:21:06,870 --> 00:21:12,390 But the surroundings I grew up in are not the norm.

381 00:21:12,390 --> 00:21:17,940 But remarkably at that time and even today

382 00:21:17,940 --> 00:21:23,760 I do not feel deprived because I was loved and cared for

383 00:21:23,760 --> 00:21:26,610 and had experiences, and all that

384 00:21:26,610 --> 00:21:29,820 adds up to making me as the person

385 00:21:29,820 --> 00:21:35,550 I am today, which is the great understanding of people.

386 00:21:35,550 --> 00:21:38,780 You name it, hardships or everything. 387 00:21:38,780 --> 00:21:42,210 I was very, very poor, and I was well-to-do,

388 00:21:42,210 --> 00:21:46,170 so I can identify with both.

389 00:21:46,170 --> 00:21:49,200 And the most important thing in life

390 00:21:49,200 --> 00:21:57,000 is what people do to each other, that they don't care enough.

391 00:21:57,000 --> 00:22:00,240 My values at different than the norm as

392 00:22:00,240 --> 00:22:03,600 shaped by all my experiences, and of course I

393 00:22:03,600 --> 00:22:07,380 have a special soft spot for the elderly.

394 00:22:07,380 --> 00:22:12,120 I feel that the younger people get all the attention needed

395 00:22:12,120 --> 00:22:15,180 and the elderly, they have done their job,

396 00:22:15,180 --> 00:22:19,410 and often are left alone, lonesome,

397 00:22:19,410 --> 00:22:25,710 and deserve more attention than they are given. 398 00:22:25,710 --> 00:22:29,520 And I've stood today, even a few days ago,

399 00:22:29,520 --> 00:22:34,890 stand up when I see something is not right

400 00:22:34,890 --> 00:22:40,200 and could be a change to make an older person happy.

401 00:22:40,200 --> 00:22:44,430 So as I said, I don't need anyone to feel sorry for me

402 00:22:44,430 --> 00:22:48,780 and I have not spoken up for all these years.

403 00:22:48,780 --> 00:22:53,230 Even my close friends didn't know about my past.

404 00:22:53,230 --> 00:22:56,330 But what may be my husband's parents

405 00:22:56,330 --> 00:22:58,950 would say that I was in the concentration camp.

406 00:22:58,950 --> 00:23:03,090 I would never even mention that because I did not

407 00:23:03,090 --> 00:23:05,780 have the need that anyone feels sorry for me

408 00:23:05,780 --> 00:23:08,310 or refers to me as

a concentration camp

409 00:23:08,310 --> 00:23:09,820 survivor or anything.

410 00:23:09,820 --> 00:23:13,110 I just want to be treated like any one else.

411 00:23:13,110 --> 00:23:18,915 No special attention required.

412 00:23:18,915 --> 00:23:22,620 Can we get back to your story about going to school

413 00:23:22,620 --> 00:23:27,090 with non-Jewish children back in Frankfurt?

414 00:23:27,090 --> 00:23:30,810 Did any of them ever ask you about your background?

415 00:23:30,810 --> 00:23:32,650 Did you become friends with them?

416 00:23:32,650 --> 00:23:34,770

417 00:23:34,770 --> 00:23:39,150 Yes, except one incident once happened

418 00:23:39,150 --> 00:23:44,790 in the private school of girls, they told a girlfriend of mine

419 00:23:44,790 --> 00:23:49,410 about that dirty, dirty Jew and she told it back to me.

420 00:23:49,410 --> 00:23:50,370 I told my mom.

421 00:23:50,370 --> 00:23:54,700 She went to school and my mom was really upset.

422 00:23:54,700 --> 00:23:58,210 And it was found out that the parents of that girl

423 00:23:58,210 --> 00:24:00,410 were in the Nazi party.

424 00:24:00,410 --> 00:24:03,460 And the girl was much too young to form an opinion,

425 00:24:03,460 --> 00:24:09,120 but heard this from her family at home,

426 00:24:09,120 --> 00:24:15,690 and they took a disciplinary action.

427 00:24:15,690 --> 00:24:20,452 Did you experience any other antisemitic incidents?

428 00:24:20,452 --> 00:24:24,930 No, only when I would travel in the streetcar,

429 00:24:24,930 --> 00:24:28,860 and of course people didn't know who I was, and would

430 00:24:28,860 --> 00:24:31,020 now and then make comments.

431 00:24:31,020 --> 00:24:34,230 And when I was finished, this school,

432

00:24:34,230 --> 00:24:39,780 I wanted to become a nurse, and there was the hospital

433

00:24:39,780 --> 00:24:43,785 that was a gift from--

434

00:24:43,785 --> 00:24:46,300

435

 $00:24:46,300 \longrightarrow 00:24:51,790$ it started before the war on Jewish people.

436

00:24:51,790 --> 00:24:58,080 And I wanted to be admitted to the Nursing class there.

437

00:24:58,080 --> 00:24:59,780

So I went there.

438

 $00:24:59,780 \longrightarrow 00:25:01,220$ I was accepted.

439

00:25:01,220 --> 00:25:03,980

In them days, a long time ago, you

440

00:25:03,980 --> 00:25:07,190 had to fill out your religion.

441

00:25:07,190 --> 00:25:10,670 I don't think that's

the case here today.

442

00:25:10,670 --> 00:25:12,980

Now, what year are we talking about?

443

00:25:12,980 --> 00:25:20,150 We are talking about the mid-1950's.

444

00:25:20,150 --> 00:25:24,540 I went there with my mom, filled out the paper, what

445

00:25:24,540 --> 00:25:28,040 was required, but it said also religion.

446

00:25:28,040 --> 00:25:31,810 And of course they wouldn't let me fill out papers

447

00:25:31,810 --> 00:25:32,870 if the place was full.

448

00:25:32,870 --> 00:25:35,960 As soon as we got home, there was a phone call.

449

00:25:35,960 --> 00:25:38,090 And we didn't have a phone of our own.

450

00:25:38,090 --> 00:25:42,840 We used the phone number of a neighbor

451

00:25:42,840 --> 00:25:45,330 because we couldn't afford the telephone.

452

00:25:45,330 --> 00:25:49,310 And was a phone call saying they could not accept me

453

00:25:49,310 --> 00:25:52,780 because the class was filled.

454

00:25:52,780 --> 00:25:54,600

It was not full.

455 00:25:54,600 --> 00:25:58,790 We could put one and one together.

456 00:25:58,790 --> 00:26:00,590 Because of my religion.

457 00:26:00,590 --> 00:26:05,000 So when I was still in my mid-teens,

458 00:26:05,000 --> 00:26:11,300 my mom did have the foresight, it would be a good idea

459 00:26:11,300 --> 00:26:17,990 to apply to go to the United States, which I--

460 00:26:17,990 --> 00:26:21,540 although I'm independent, can go during the day wherever,

461 00:26:21,540 --> 00:26:28,580 but I do need a home when at night with my family.

462 00:26:28,580 --> 00:26:31,820 So I really didn't [? pull ?] much,

463 00:26:31,820 --> 00:26:35,600 but she said, well, you can just put the application in.

464 00:26:35,600 --> 00:26:38,120 That does not mean that you have to go.

465 00:26:38,120 --> 00:26:40,920 So I did what she told me. 466 00:26:40,920 --> 00:26:43,220 And it took several--

467 00:26:43,220 --> 00:26:46,790 talking now about that legal and illegal immigration,

468 00:26:46,790 --> 00:26:48,810 took several years.

469 00:26:48,810 --> 00:26:53,080 And when I was finished school, I realized that there was--

470 00:26:53,080 --> 00:26:56,810 and applying and being denied there for a job,

471 00:26:56,810 --> 00:27:01,290 and what I heard, laughing when people didn't know who I was--

472 00:27:01,290 --> 00:27:06,760 there was still a good amount of antisemitism there.

473 00:27:06,760 --> 00:27:09,920 And the future, not too many Jewish people there,

474 00:27:09,920 --> 00:27:14,430 and the future is really not--

475 00:27:14,430 --> 00:27:18,830 And my parents were open to me marrying

476 00:27:18,830 --> 00:27:22,400 somebody that is not Jewish.

477 00:27:22,400 --> 00:27:28,460 As long as they-- even so my dad would keep the holidays

478

00:27:28,460 --> 00:27:33,380 and on Yom Kippur wouldn't eat, no matter what his health was.

479 00:27:33,380 --> 00:27:37,220 He would-- till the day he died, he wouldn't do that.

480 00:27:37,220 --> 00:27:39,920 And also in the concentration camp, he

481 00:27:39,920 --> 00:27:42,470 or afterwards, he would rather go hungry than eat

482 00:27:42,470 --> 00:27:44,610 something you shouldn't eat.

483 00:27:44,610 --> 00:27:49,350 But he wanted me to have somebody.

484 00:27:49,350 --> 00:27:51,230 He didn't say Jewish or not Jewish,

485 00:27:51,230 --> 00:27:55,570 somebody that treats me good, that was the main thing.

486 00:27:55,570 --> 00:27:58,840 He could be poor, but somebody that's good to me.

487 00:27:58,840 --> 00:28:03,500 So I figured there is no future for me there,

488 00:28:03,500 --> 00:28:07,100 and I figured I will take a chance.

489

00:28:07,100 --> 00:28:14,540 I had an aunt and uncle, my dad's sister, and her husband,

490

00:28:14,540 --> 00:28:17,000 and other relatives.

491

00:28:17,000 --> 00:28:20,540 They were in California, but my dad's sister

492

00:28:20,540 --> 00:28:24,855 and her husband, who lost a child in a car accident,

493

00:28:24,855 --> 00:28:26,850 were in New York.

494

00:28:26,850 --> 00:28:29,910 And I think if I go there and my dad said,

495

00:28:29,910 --> 00:28:33,420 if things don't work out, I can always come back.

496

506

00:29:00,140 --> 00:29:06,290 [INAUDIBLE] to find investors to--

507

00:29:06,290 --> 00:29:08,450 there was a big write-up in the Harford--

508

00:29:08,450 --> 00:29:11,730 in the local paper about it.

509

00:29:11,730 --> 00:29:17,450 And I saw it on the news and all that, it's now in Philadelphia.

510

00:29:17,450 --> 00:29:21,740 It was a luxury ship, it was only a few years old.

511

Lightweight, we

went into a storm.

I was quite sick.

And I said, no more [INAUDIBLE].

And I came here the 4th of July.

What did the United States

mean to you as a 19-year-old?

As a 19-year-old, freedom like

I have never experienced before,

523

and achieving my dream and

being able to do what one wants

00:30:10,540 --> 00:30:14,200 to do as long as you don't hurt somebody else,

525 00:30:14,200 --> 00:30:20,830 and having a life like you couldn't have in Germany.

526 00:30:20,830 --> 00:30:26,100 people being much, much different,

527 00:30:26,100 --> 00:30:28,580 not resenting people from other cultures,

528 00:30:28,580 --> 00:30:33,340 since this was a melting pot of many, the United States,

529 00:30:33,340 --> 00:30:36,100 which Germany isn't.

530 00:30:36,100 --> 00:30:38,800 Even some years ago visiting, anybody

531 00:30:38,800 --> 00:30:41,290 that's different from them they kind of--

532 00:30:41,290 --> 00:30:43,870

533 00:30:43,870 --> 00:30:48,490 I don't think that's a way to celebrate, to live,

534 00:30:48,490 --> 00:30:49,750 only their way.

535 00:30:49,750 --> 00:30:55,870 And yeah, I felt total freedom doing what whatever

536

00:30:55,870 --> 00:30:58,765

I can achieve without--

537

00:30:58,765 --> 00:31:01,420

Did you know any English?

538

00:31:01,420 --> 00:31:03,730

Yes, I took English in school.

539

I was good at it.

In writing and speaking,

may maybe better than today

541

because we spoke only German

with my husband's parents.

00:31:44,380 --> 00:31:51,970 And he picked me up, with my aunt and uncle, when I arrived.

00:31:54,790 --> 00:31:59,290 and another boyfriend, also in the military, Jewish man,

587 00:33:50,060 --> 00:33:55,840 I worked at Associated Metals and Minerals, 75 West Street

588 00:33:55,840 --> 00:33:57,340 down near Wall Street.

589 00:33:57,340 --> 00:34:05,340 I took the IRT and the subway every day to make it to work.

590 00:34:05,340 --> 00:34:13,415 And they wanted to keep me there after I got married.

591 00:34:13,415 --> 00:34:15,624 So when did you get married?

592 00:34:15,624 --> 00:34:19,989 I got married after I was two years in the country.

593 00:34:19,989 --> 00:34:22,239 I could have gotten married before, 594 00:34:22,239 --> 00:34:24,760 but it wasn't what I wanted.

595 00:34:24,760 --> 00:34:28,770 And I was still very young and there was no need for it.

602 00:34:53,025 --> 00:34:54,944 How did you meet your husband?

603 00:34:54,944 --> 00:34:58,410 He did not know that before.

604 00:34:58,410 --> 00:35:09,690 And I had my mother, my dad in '57.

605 00:35:09,690 --> 00:35:16,380 September the 13th of '57 my dad died 606

00:35:16,380 --> 00:35:18,405 How did you meet your husband?

607

00:35:18,405 --> 00:35:19,695

On a blind date.

608

When my dad died, a mutual relative of my aunt and uncle,

637 00:37:22,640 --> 00:37:26,970 I was just a little thing then when

638 00:37:26,970 --> 00:37:30,235 he came over to this country at the age of five.

716 00:41:44,410 --> 00:41:47,635 I do not like to talk about these things.

717 00:41:47,635 --> 00:41:51,230 You said your father didn't want to talk about, let's say,

718 00:41:51,230 --> 00:41:52,215 the Kristallnacht.

719 00:41:52,215 --> 00:41:54,620 And as a result, I didn't do that to my son

720 00:41:54,620 --> 00:42:00,010 either, because I figured a life presents enough hardship,

721 00:42:00,010 --> 00:42:04,510 and you want a happy, happy life.

722

00:42:04,510 --> 00:42:09,200 You have to know the bad in order to appreciate the good.

723

00:42:09,200 --> 00:42:10,480 I understand that.

724

00:42:10,480 --> 00:42:17,320 But to overdo it with miseries--

725

00:42:19,880 --> 00:42:22,240 I did the same thing my dad did to me.

773 00:44:53,922 --> 00:45:01,360 The property was in the Russian-occupied zone.

774 00:45:01,360 --> 00:45:09,110 But what I forgot to mention is that, when I finally--

776 00:45:12,930 --> 00:45:16,840 and the only child, and all that, got the property back.

779 00:45:20,780 --> 00:45:26,060 They still owe me money, for now I would say 65, 70 years.

782 00:45:33,230 --> 00:45:38,800 into three, four apartments, and the town collects the money.

784 00:45:41,300 --> 00:45:44,450 after reunification, they had to give me my property

785 00:45:44,450 --> 00:45:45,530 back in my name.

786 00:45:45,530 --> 00:45:48,980 It could not be changed after my parents passed,

787 00:45:48,980 --> 00:45:51,410 but it was Russian zone.

788 00:45:51,410 --> 00:45:58,860 But after that, with the help from attorney, I was able to.

789 00:45:58,860 --> 00:46:01,730 But there is no law saying, for all the years

790 00:46:01,730 --> 00:46:03,740 they collected the rent, that they

791 00:46:03,740 --> 00:46:06,420 have to pay that back to me.

792 00:46:06,420 --> 00:46:10,470 And since my husband could speak German, but more dialect

793

00:46:10,470 --> 00:46:14,420 and not in writing, and it was up to me, and the family,

794

00:46:14,420 --> 00:46:18,410 and be here to take care of my husband's parents

795

00:46:18,410 --> 00:46:24,080 who could not drive a car, were dependent

796

00:46:24,080 --> 00:46:26,480 on us taking care of them--

797 00:46:26,480 --> 00:46:31,100

798 00:46:31,100 --> 00:46:34,820 since there was no law and no need to fight anymore--

799

00:46:34,820 --> 00:46:38,300 even so, I consider myself a little fighter--

800

00:46:38,300 --> 00:46:42,260 but I did not want to carry on, because it would be pretty

801

00:46:42,260 --> 00:46:46,010 useless wasting more time, harping on these things that I

802

00:46:46,010 --> 00:46:46,980 cannot change.

815 00:47:23,790 --> 00:47:34,960 It's not enough, and it is deserving money, 816 00:47:34,960 --> 00:47:37,460 and what can I say.

817 00:47:37,460 --> 00:47:40,760

818 00:47:40,760 --> 00:47:46,100 it's not a substitute for if that wouldn't have been.

819 00:47:46,100 --> 00:47:49,520 I would have had the other way around.

820 00:47:49,520 --> 00:47:51,740 Do you think you would be a different person

821 00:47:51,740 --> 00:47:55,310 today if you hadn't gone through,

822 00:47:55,310 --> 00:47:57,005 in your childhood, what you did?

823 00:47:57,005 --> 00:48:02,150 Absolutely, yes, because I know I'm very different than most

824 00:48:02,150 --> 00:48:03,690 people because of it.

825 00:48:03,690 --> 00:48:06,980 Because we are formed, not only by our genes,

826 00:48:06,980 --> 00:48:14,420 but a lot of our life experiences

827 00:48:14,420 --> 00:48:17,100 that make us who we are today.

850

00:49:43,530 --> 00:49:45,590 than just a normal person.

851 00:49:45,590 --> 00:49:49,250 What I am I don't want any [INAUDIBLE] nothing

852 00:49:49,250 --> 00:49:55,920 I also am very caring and compassionate,

853 00:49:55,920 --> 00:50:00,020 but I'm also strong enough to know

854 00:50:00,020 --> 00:50:11,555 that self-pity has no value.

855 00:50:11,555 --> 00:50:16,220 Are there any sounds or sights or smells

856 00:50:16,220 --> 00:50:20,852 that just trigger memories of your childhood?

857 00:50:20,852 --> 00:50:21,935 Well, whenever they come--

858 00:50:21,935 --> 00:50:25,220

859 00:50:25,220 --> 00:50:27,410 my mind is usually either that I do

860 00:50:27,410 --> 00:50:31,460 something, all these thoughts I keep my mind occupied.

861 00:50:31,460 --> 00:50:34,340 But when it comes to the suffering

862 00:50:34,340 --> 00:50:38,930 that mainly my dad and my husband experienced,

863

866

869

882 00:51:44,500 --> 00:51:45,980 There are three levels--

883 00:51:45,980 --> 00:51:46,640 at the time.

884 00:51:46,640 --> 00:51:48,890 I don't know what it is today.

885 00:51:48,890 --> 00:51:56,450 If you want to just be a regular worker, a school system to go, 886 00:51:56,450 --> 00:51:58,940 which is elementary school all the way through.

887

00:51:58,940 --> 00:52:01,400 Then a middle school if you want to be a secretary,

888

00:52:01,400 --> 00:52:06,950 and I attended where you can go to the university.

889

00:52:06,950 --> 00:52:11,250 And I was able to do that, and I did have the grades to do that.

00:52:13,890 --> 00:52:17,645 Have you ever worked in the United States?

892

not have taken as long as I live as the years ahead.

00:52:43,010 --> 00:52:49,350 A Jewish man by the name of Monroe [? Himmelstein--?]

900

00:52:49,350 --> 00:52:50,480 he came from a farm.

901

00:52:50,480 --> 00:52:54,590 His father died unexpectedly early, too.

902

00:52:54,590 --> 00:52:56,840 He became a top-notch surgeon.

903

00:52:56,840 --> 00:53:07,460 He operated on my husband for peritonitis.

904

00:53:07,460 --> 00:53:10,440 My husband almost died from it.

905

00:53:10,440 --> 00:53:14,870 And he operated, and we talked frequently together,

906

00:53:14,870 --> 00:53:18,470 and my husband was three weeks in the hospital.

907

00:53:18,470 --> 00:53:23,600 And during that time, my mother-in-law

908

00:53:23,600 --> 00:53:27,530 was with Alzheimer's in a convalescent home,

918 00:54:00,650 --> 00:54:05,550 you know, I would like your wife to work for me in my office.

919 00:54:05,550 --> 00:54:09,510 And I told him at the time that I was in that trained, 920 00:54:09,510 --> 00:54:13,320 and he said he knew

that I could do the job.

921 00:54:13,320 --> 00:54:16,110 And my husband turned him down and said,

922

00:54:16,110 --> 00:54:18,480 I need her more than you do.

923

00:54:18,480 --> 00:54:21,840 My husband came home from peritonitis, and three weeks,

924

00:54:21,840 --> 00:54:26,430 and no food, no IV, and having a couple of feet of intestine

925

00:54:26,430 --> 00:54:30,650 lost, with an open belly that needed attention

926

00:54:30,650 --> 00:54:32,670 by a nurse every day.

927

00:54:32,670 --> 00:54:35,180 And they wanted to send free of charge, of course,

928

00:54:35,180 --> 00:54:38,520 from the insurance company, the hospital

929

00:54:38,520 --> 00:54:42,070 that the nurse comes here daily till that is healed.

930

00:54:42,070 --> 00:54:44,940 When Doctor Himmelstein came and heard it he said,

00:54:44,940 --> 00:54:47,610 there's no nurse coming.

932

00:54:47,610 --> 00:54:50,560 Sharon can do that on her own.

933

00:54:50,560 --> 00:54:53,820 It was rather scary to expect me to take

934

00:54:53,820 --> 00:54:59,490 care of this open wound, cutting through the belly button

935

00:54:59,490 --> 00:55:03,110 to let the pus come out and cleaned out daily.

936

00:55:03,110 --> 00:55:05,400 So, I did it.

937

00:55:05,400 --> 00:55:07,610 It was scary, but I did it.

938

00:55:07,610 --> 00:55:10,280 And it healed up nicely.

950

00:55:56,700 --> 00:56:00,005 because my priority was my devotion,

951

00:56:00,005 --> 00:56:04,260 total devotion to my family before I [INAUDIBLE]..

952

00:56:04,260 --> 00:56:09,990 And so only after everybody unfortunately was gone

953

00:56:09,990 --> 00:56:12,600 did I spend time--

954

00:56:12,600 --> 00:56:16,095 What year did your husband pass away?

955

00:56:16,095 --> 00:56:18,840 My husband passed away nine and a half years ago

956

00:56:18,840 --> 00:56:25,260 after being diagnosed with Lou Gehrig's disease, unexpectedly.

957

00:56:25,260 --> 00:56:29,080 His lab work was perfect, and all of a sudden,

958

00:56:29,080 --> 00:56:31,578 he got that disease.

959

00:56:31,578 --> 00:56:33,120 I knew there was something like that.

960

00:56:33,120 --> 00:56:37,890 I did not know how it was called, and how it was.

961

00:56:37,890 --> 00:56:40,050 And [INAUDIBLE] here are the papers

962

00:56:40,050 --> 00:56:42,280 after all the information.

963

00:56:42,280 --> 00:56:47,150 I offered to still go to Israel and see if they could help us,

964

00:56:47,150 --> 00:56:48,570 but he said he wouldn't.

965

00:56:48,570 --> 00:56:51,820 And of course, they couldn't take care of that. 966

00:56:51,820 --> 00:56:58,300 This is something where there is no cure for at this point.

967 00:56:58,300 --> 00:57:02,730 And even after I contacted so many people

968 00:57:02,730 --> 00:57:06,150 and was told not enough people--

969 00:57:06,150 --> 00:57:08,510 too many, but not enough have it,

970 00:57:08,510 --> 00:57:12,870 so enough now the [INAUDIBLE] backwards and ordered.

971 00:57:12,870 --> 00:57:16,980 Not enough money is put into the research.

972 00:57:16,980 --> 00:57:18,480 Why that happens?

973 00:57:18,480 --> 00:57:21,840 Supposedly most people that were in Vietnam

974 00:57:21,840 --> 00:57:25,080 exposed to Agent Orange, which he was not.

975 00:57:25,080 --> 00:57:28,590 Why he got suddenly and in hindsight

976 00:57:28,590 --> 00:57:31,680 after we got married, shortly after,

00:57:31,680 --> 00:57:37,025 there were signs which were never recognized and excused

978 00:57:37,025 --> 00:57:40,710 with this and that.

979 00:57:40,710 --> 00:57:44,280 And even if he has gone a few years before,

980 00:57:44,280 --> 00:57:48,150 the signs are not recognized.

981 00:57:48,150 --> 00:57:53,130 I talked to other people that had that in the family,

982 00:57:53,130 --> 00:57:56,250 and we all had the same experience.

983 00:57:56,250 --> 00:57:58,950 At [? Baxter ?] that stuff if it does not

984 00:57:58,950 --> 00:58:00,780 have first hand experience.

985 00:58:00,780 --> 00:58:02,290 It cannot be diagnosed.

986 00:58:02,290 --> 00:58:05,170 There's no tests or anything.

987 00:58:05,170 --> 00:58:07,660 Only people that have been unfortunately been

988 00:58:07,660 --> 00:58:12,420 through it once can say, hey, this 989

00:58:12,420 --> 00:58:17,380 might be the culprit of it.

990

00:58:17,380 --> 00:58:19,830 It is still a ways to go.

991

00:58:19,830 --> 00:58:23,600 It is a very miserable disease where your mind stays,

992

00:58:23,600 --> 00:58:26,790 and your body shrinks away.

993

00:58:26,790 --> 00:58:30,930 And we have to accept it, and I cannot.

994

00:58:30,930 --> 00:58:36,510 Whether it is my dad or my husband, the suffering--

995

00:58:36,510 --> 00:58:39,420 that is the worst about losing somebody,

996

00:58:39,420 --> 00:58:42,630 is the suffering these people go through.

997

00:58:42,630 --> 00:58:45,910 That is immensely scary.

998

00:58:45,910 --> 00:58:48,090 And when these thoughts come, I have

999

00:58:48,090 --> 00:58:50,550 to keep doing something else.

1000

00:58:50,550 --> 00:58:54,210 I still have a chair that we bought where my husband had

1001 00:58:54,210 --> 00:58:56,290 to sleep on in my living room.

1002 00:58:56,290 --> 00:59:00,330 It's like, no, I cannot sit on this chair.

1003 00:59:00,330 --> 00:59:03,260 Even so it's the most comfortable because it brings--

1004 00:59:03,260 --> 00:59:07,320

1005 00:59:07,320 --> 00:59:12,860 like a movie, the memories come back, what happened there.

1006 00:59:12,860 --> 00:59:17,700 Or, say, with my dad, any of this if something mentions,

1007 00:59:17,700 --> 00:59:19,470 I don't want to be reminded.

1008 00:59:19,470 --> 00:59:23,690 It's part of me, and I try to keep right away

1009 00:59:23,690 --> 00:59:28,920 occupy myself and get different thoughts if these things cross

1010 00:59:28,920 --> 00:59:31,800 my mind, which they certainly do.

1011 00:59:31,800 --> 00:59:36,810 So I try to stay away from it and don't

00:59:36,810 --> 00:59:38,900 want to talk to people.

1013

00:59:38,900 --> 00:59:46,830 Don't try to have my friends, because they make me sad.

1014

00:59:46,830 --> 00:59:49,560 Even here, people from the concentration camp,

1015

00:59:49,560 --> 00:59:51,960 they say a sad [INAUDIBLE],, and I

1016

00:59:51,960 --> 00:59:56,410 don't want to be part of this.

1017

00:59:56,410 --> 01:00:02,310 It's part of me, and I have to make the best of it

1018

01:00:02,310 --> 01:00:04,260 because it's past.

1019

01:00:04,260 --> 01:00:07,530 And I did my duty to the best of my ability,

1020

01:00:07,530 --> 01:00:09,750 and that's all I can do.

1021

01:00:09,750 --> 01:00:13,080 And to make things worse by dwelling on it

1022

01:00:13,080 --> 01:00:16,245 doesn't serve any purpose.

1023

01:00:17,760 --> 01:00:22,405 would like to add that you haven't mentioned?

1025

1026

01:00:24,170 --> 01:00:29,230 it is understood properly, for all people after that,

1027

1029

01:00:33,700 --> 01:00:35,410 Heaven did not open.

1030

01:00:35,410 --> 01:00:38,410 Life was very, very difficult.

1031

01:00:38,410 --> 01:00:40,630 Being three years in the concentration camp

1032

01:00:40,630 --> 01:00:41,660 is one thing.

1033

01:00:41,660 --> 01:00:44,580 Afterward, growing up an old people's home,

1034

01:00:44,580 --> 01:00:51,650 and I am again now living in a very nice, even luxurious

1035

01:00:51,650 --> 01:00:56,860 retirement home, but

with old people again.

1036 01:00:56,860 --> 01:00:58,780 This is my second chance.

1037 01:00:58,780 --> 01:01:03,910 Yes, I am more understanding toward these people, but for me

1038 01:01:03,910 --> 01:01:11,110 to have to go through that again is, at times, a bitter pill

1039 01:01:11,110 --> 01:01:12,355 to swallow.

1040 01:01:12,355 --> 01:01:16,725 But it is something, having lost all my family.

1041 01:01:16,725 --> 01:01:19,750 Did you lose any other extended family

1042 01:01:19,750 --> 01:01:23,470 that you know of besides your immediate?

1043 01:01:23,470 --> 01:01:25,540 Well, my cousins, they are all gone.

1044 01:01:25,540 --> 01:01:27,970 Most of my aunts, and uncles, and cousins--

1045 01:01:27,970 --> 01:01:30,070 they perished in the concentration camp.

1046 01:01:30,070 --> 01:01:35,170 And the others, due to my parents' age and circumstances, 1047 01:01:35,170 --> 01:01:39,340 they were all about 15, 16 years older than I am.

1048 01:01:39,340 --> 01:01:43,630 And I am 78 now, and they have all passed.

1049 01:01:43,630 --> 01:01:48,260 I have nobody any more except this son and the two

1050 01:01:48,260 --> 01:01:48,920 grandchildren.

1051 01:01:48,920 --> 01:01:54,400 And my son turned religious.

1052 01:01:54,400 --> 01:01:57,130 He is an educated religious man.

1053 01:01:57,130 --> 01:02:02,360 But he was left without any conscience or heart,

1054 01:02:02,360 --> 01:02:04,090 shall I say?

1055 01:02:04,090 --> 01:02:09,980 And the grandchildren, except my grandson,

1056 01:02:09,980 --> 01:02:12,050 they're not much different.

1057 01:02:12,050 --> 01:02:17,070 They're good people, but they have different values.

1058 01:02:17,070 --> 01:02:22,570 And I hear from my granddaughter rarely,

1059 01:02:22,570 --> 01:02:25,120 not even for the holidays.

1060 01:02:25,120 --> 01:02:28,700 And my son, now and then.

1061 01:02:28,700 --> 01:02:32,020

1062 01:02:32,020 --> 01:02:34,200 And that is something.

1063 01:02:34,200 --> 01:02:35,980 When I was in New York, I would write

1064 01:02:35,980 --> 01:02:39,730 to my parents twice a week, letters.

1065 01:02:39,730 --> 01:02:43,350 It's a different generation, maybe.

1066 01:02:43,350 --> 01:02:45,520 I hear complaints from others, too.

1067 01:02:45,520 --> 01:02:48,580 Maybe I'm a little less fortunate in that respect.

1068 01:02:48,580 --> 01:02:53,140 I tried my best, and that is all I can do.

1069 01:02:53,140 --> 01:02:57,130 And to do justice to my dear husband,

01:02:57,130 --> 01:03:03,150 I would like to say he was suffering in the [INAUDIBLE]

1071 01:03:03,150 --> 01:03:07,750 a home and hospital, on the hospital wing for over a half

1072 01:03:07,750 --> 01:03:11,440 a year, dying from Lou Gehrig's.

1073 01:03:11,440 --> 01:03:16,270 My son never once came to visit him, never once,

1074 01:03:16,270 --> 01:03:19,840 and not a phone call either.

1075 01:03:19,840 --> 01:03:25,150 And it's a hard pill to swallow, but I do not

1076 01:03:25,150 --> 01:03:27,550 talk about these things.

1077 01:03:27,550 --> 01:03:31,420 Only one or two of my close friends

1078 01:03:31,420 --> 01:03:36,645 know about it, because it is what it is.

1079 01:03:36,645 --> 01:03:40,510 Do you think the world has learned anything

1080 01:03:40,510 --> 01:03:41,500 from the Holocaust?

1081 01:03:41,500 --> 01:03:45,250 1082

01:03:45,250 --> 01:03:46,983 People seem to forget too fast.

1083

01:03:46,983 --> 01:03:48,400

I really don't

think so, otherwise

1084

01:03:48,400 --> 01:03:52,990 things that are going on today would not be happening.

1085

01:03:52,990 --> 01:03:56,590

And I don't think

it is relevant.

1086

01:03:56,590 --> 01:03:59,450

If you can't change

it, it's very sad.

1087

01:03:59,450 --> 01:04:07,450

Netanyahu is coming here now, visiting with our president.

1088

And I hope things--

1099 01:04:53,810 --> 01:05:01,300 But I'm also very much in favor of Israel

1100 01:05:01,300 --> 01:05:06,190 being treated the way we deserve to be treated.

1101 01:05:06,190 --> 01:05:11,320 And it is, after all, our strongest ally in the region

1102 01:05:11,320 --> 01:05:19,060 and hasn't gotten the attention that I think we deserve.

1103 01:05:19,060 --> 01:05:24,220 And the Jewish people still seem to think

01:05:24,220 --> 01:05:29,560 President Obama is doing the right thing by voting for him.
